
Disclaimer:

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



Conciliations Resolved v. Referred to Conference





Fluctuations in the conference and hearing queues may vary by region and depend on the number of cases being referred from conciliation, conference order appeals, judicial schedules, and continuance requests. There have been 5,829 continuances as of May 31, 2024. 7,912 continuance requests were received in FY23. These are a rolling total, not a cumulative total.





Currently, the average waiting period for a conference is 12 to 14 weeks.

May 2024 Estimated






Review Board Inventory

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















886 cases were filed in May.




Office of Investigations



7,724 compliance checks, 302 field investigations were conducted, 438 more employees are newly covered by WC insurance and 1,797 compliance letters were sent in May. FY 2023, yielded 64,506 compliance checks with 4,356 employees covered by WC insurance.



Office of Investigations



Last month 145 Stop Work Orders (SWO) were issued and 6 were in default. 1,294 SWOs have been issued year-to-date with total fine collections to date of \$1,066,622. FY 2023 yielded a total of 1,375 SWOs issued, with a total fine collection of \$936,757.





Workers' Compensation Trust Fund (WCTF) Uninsured Claims




As of May 31st, 100 uninsured injuries have been reported to the WCTF. Please note, claims may be determined to be insured or uninsured after filing. The WCTF received 95 newly reported claims in FY23.










Represents payments on all open claims to include those made in prior years.

Every effort is made to recover money owed by the uninsured employer pursuant c. 152 §65 (8).




FY 2024 as of 5/31/2024






Second Injury Fund Budget & Payments

COLA Reimbursement






Assessment Collections
