4. Discussion of Subcommittee feedback on RJ systems and state office models

- i. Can we recognize that judicial and legislative RJ initiatives are going on and make sure that the state RJ office can be designed to support both branches as well as executive branch? We would look to the Senator and the Rep to ultimately have this approved. Within EOPSS and then within the court system to develop capability and a coordinated effort.
 - i. Susan Municipalities and local authorities, legislative, and judicial.
 - ii. Dennis We could also look into Federal funding groups of people move regionally. People move off their interest and we can use that regional aspect to make Restorative Justice meaningful in those communities.

- ii. Susan that is another phase of the process where we will put together a framework.
- iii. Judge Agnes where in the structure of government should this reside? Should it be left as the last piece of the work? If we look at the state budget, there are agencies that are independent of the group but receive funding?
