DECISION

ENTERPRISE LIQUOR STORE, INC. DBA WOODY'S LIQUORS
266 BROADWAY
REVERE, MA 02151
HEARING HELD: 2/14/2012

Enterprise Liquor Store, Inc. dba Woody's Liquors (the "Licensee") holds an all-alcoholic beverages license issued pursuant to M.G.L. c. 138, §15. The Alcoholic Beverages Control Commission (the "Commission") held a hearing on Tuesday, February 14, 2012, regarding an alleged violation of M.G.L. c. 138, §34. Prior to the commencement of the hearing, the licensee stipulated to the violation alleged in Investigator Paul Capurso's Compliance Check Field Report.

FACTS


1. On Wednesday, August 24, 2011, at approximately 7:29 p.m., Commission Investigators Guarino and Capurso conducted an investigation of the licensed premises of Enterprise Liquor Store, Inc. dba Woody's Liquors.
2. An underage operative, working with the Investigators, purchased alcoholic beverages, an eighteen (18) pack of Coors Light beer, for twenty (\$20) dollars with a five (\$5.00) dollar tip. The underage operative was not asked for identification.

CONCLUSION


Based on the evidence, the Commission finds the licensee violated Massachusetts General Laws c. 138, §34. The Commission suspends the license for three (3) days of which three (3) days will be held in abeyance for a period of two (2) years provided no further violations of Chapter 138 or Commission Regulations occur.
