P & M Liquors, LLC dba State Road Liquor & Food Market (the "Licensee") holds an all alcohol license issued pursuant to Massachusetts General Laws chapter 138, §15. The Alcoholic Beverages Control Commission (the "Commission") held a hearing on Tuesday, September 20, 2011, regarding an alleged violation of M.G.L. c. 138, §34. Prior to the commencement of the hearing, the licensee stipulated to the violation alleged in Investigator Michael Teehan's report.

**FACTS**


1. On, July 6, 2011 at approximately 7:10 p.m., Commission Investigator Capurso and Teehan investigated the business operation of P & M Liquors, LLC dba State Road Liquor & Food Market.
2. The investigators entered the premises and observed a youthful looking patron in possession of an eighteen (18) pack of Bud Light.
3. The investigators asked the patron for his identification and recorded that he was seventeen (17) years old.
4. The patron stated that he was not asked for identification to purchase the alcoholic beverages.

**CONCLUSION**


Based on the evidence, the Commission finds the licensee violated Massachusetts General Laws c. 138, §34. The Commission **suspends the license for six (6) days of which six (6) days will be held in abeyance for a period of two (2) years provided no further violations of Chapter 138 or Commission Regulations occur**
