### WHAT IS NPDES?

- National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System
- NPDES Permitting Program established by Section 402 of the federal Clean Water Act
- All point sources discharging pollutants into waters of the U.S. need NPDES permit from EPA or an authorized state, territory, or tribe



#### NPDES IN MASSACHUSETTS & NEW HAMPSHIRE

- MA and NH are 2 of 4 states NOT authorized to administer the NPDES program - EPA is permitting authority
- Permits co-issued by EPA and MassDEP
- MassDEP's Surface Water Discharge Regulations: 314 CMR 3.00
- MassDEP certifies under Section 401 of the CWA that permits comply with the MA Surface Water Quality Standards: 314 CMR 4.00
- Compliance/enforcement joint responsibility of both agencies
- MA is pursuing NPDES authorization (delegation)



NPDES PERMIT TYPES

> INDIVIDUAL AND GENERAL

#### INDIVIDUAL vs. GENERAL

#### INDIVIDUAL PERMITS:

- Tailor requirements specific to the facilities
- Public notice and appeal processes
- In effect for five years
- Administratively continued if not reissued before expiration and reapplication received on time



### INDIVIDUAL vs. GENERAL

#### GENERAL PERMITS:

- Procedures similar to individual permits
- The GP itself is in effect for five years authorizations are administratively continued until new permit is issued
- Owners/operators apply for coverage under a GP by filing a Notice of Intent
- Coverage can be obtained relatively quickly

## **GENERAL PERMITS**

A permitting authority may issue a general permit if there are multiple sources in a geographic area that:

- $\bullet\,$  Involve the same or substantially similar types of operations;
- Discharge the same types of wastes;
- Require the same effluent limitations or operating conditions;
- Require the same or similar treatment technologies or monitoring requirements; and
- In the opinion of the Director, are more appropriately controlled under a general permit than under individual permits.
