Last evening, DCR held a third Community Planning Workshop aimed at actively engaging the public in planning for the future of the Dillaway-Thomas House and the surrounding Roxbury Heritage State Park (RHSP.) At this workshop, the attendees reviewed, and provided feedback on, the preferred alternative design for the exhibits, house, and park. The discussion was lively and informative.

The deadline for public comments on the preferred alternative design presented last evening is Thursday, June 5.

After the input is reviewed, the final design will begin. It is anticipated that the project will go out to bid and construction will start in August, and that the project will be substantially complete, and a ribbon-cutting held, in December 2014. Prior to going out to bid, DCR will be holding a public meeting to share the final design and to provide an overall project update.

We hope you will join us and share this information with others who might have an interest in this project.
