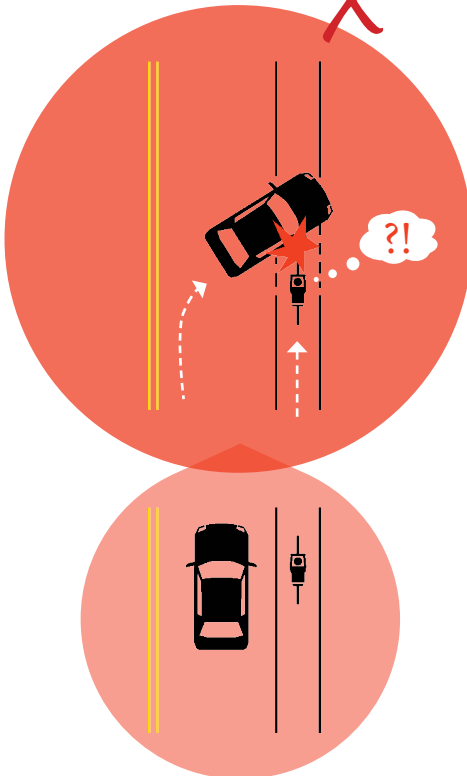
Avoid the Right Hook!

When you're driving, there's so much to pay attention to and watch out for, especially when making a turn. Always double check before you turn, because you never know when you might be crossing the path of someone biking.

A **Right Hook** is when a car turns right, crossing the path of someone biking, scooting, or continuing straight.

Before you turn, make sure to **signal, slow down or stop**, and **look over your shoulder and in your mirrors** for people on bikes or scooters. Anyone going straight has the right of way, which means you must *yield* and *wait* for them to pass.

WRONG X



Bikers and other micromobility users going straight have the right of way.

If you want to turn, you must signal, slow down or stop, and check by looking in your mirrors and behind you. Proceed slowly only when you know it's clear.

Sometimes people on bikes and scooters can be blocked from your view, so always expect the unexpected and be ready to hit the brakes.

To make sure nobody gets hurt, always check twice before turning.
