## **Electrify Your Fleet and Maximize Your Savings**

MOR-EV has rebates for your organization to electrify your fleet.

For pick-ups and class 2b vehicles (8,501 - 10,000 lbs), your business could qualify for rebates. Apply within 90 days of purchase for this rebate. Light duty rebates are also available through participating dealerships at point-of-sale.

For medium- and heavy - duty vehicles, you may qualify for rebates. To qualify, apply for a voucher prior to purchasing your fleet, and redeem within 12 months of purchase.

Fleets (public only) For public entities seeking to acquire electric vehicles for their fleets (provided by MassDEP/MassEVIP).

### **Funding to Install EV Charging Stations**

MassDEP has several categories of incentives available for installing electric vehicle charging infrastructure.
