

Welcome to DCR's Robinson State Park

Well known for its fresh water swimming, Robinson boasts over 800 acres of parkland. In addition to swimming, the park is primarily used for hiking, walking, and mountain biking.

Robinson is part of the Massachusetts state park system and is managed by the Massachusetts Department of Conservation and Recreation (DCR), an agency of the Executive Office of Energy and Environmental Affairs.

DCR oversees 450,000 acres of parks, forests, beaches, bike trails, watersheds, and dams. Its mission is to protect, promote, and enhance the state's natural, cultural, and recreational resources. - Observe all posted rules and regulations.
- Respect private property.
- Off-Road Vehicle (ORV) use prohibited.
- Be alert for other trail users: Hikers: Allow bicyclists and equestrians to pass.

Bicyclists: Control your bike–do not skid Avoid startling horses and hikers–

announce your presence. Equestrians: Control your horse.
