DECISION

Rowley Liquors, Inc. ("the licensee") holds an all alcohol license issued pursuant to Massachusetts General Laws chapter 138, §15. The Alcoholic Beverages Control Commission ("the Commission") held a hearing on July 27, 2010 regarding an alleged violation of Massachusetts General Laws c. 138, §34. Prior to the commencement of the hearing, the licensee stipulated to the violation alleged in Investigator Paul Capurso's Compliance Check Field Report.

The following documents are in evidence:

1. Licensee's Stipulation of Facts; and
2. Compliance Check Field Report of Investigator Paul Capurso.

There is one (1) tape of this hearing.

Facts

1. On May 19, 2010 at approximately 6:25 p.m., Commission Investigators conducted a Minimum Age Purchase Law Compliance Check at the licensed premises of Rowley Liquors, Inc.
2. An underage operative, working with the investigators, purchased a 40 oz. bottle of bud for \$3.20. The underage operative was not asked for identification.

Conclusion

Based on the evidence, the Commission finds the licensee violated Massachusetts General Laws c. 138, §34. The Commission **suspends the license for three (3) days, which will be held in abeyance for a period of two (2) years provided no further violations of Chapter 138, or Commission Regulations occur.**
