Thomas D. Bushee & Patricia A. Bushee dba The Royalston General Store (the "Licensee") holds an all-alcoholic beverages license issued pursuant to M.G.L. c. 138, §15. The Alcoholic Beverages Control Commission (the "Commission") held a hearing on Tuesday, March 13, 2012. regarding an alleged violation of M.G.L. c. 138, §34. Prior to the commencement of the hearing, the licensee stipulated to the violation alleged in Investigator Brad Doyle's Compliance Check Field Report.

- 2. An underage operative working with investigators purchased an alcoholic beverage, a sixteen ounce (16 oz.) can of Bud Light beer, for one dollar and fifty cents (\$1.50). The underage operative was not asked for identification.
