Community Shared Solar

As part of its <u>U.S. Department of Energy SunShot Initiative Rooftop Solar Challenge</u> grant work, DOER hired The Cadmus Group to develop community shared solar guidance for Massachusetts communities (including residents, businesses, and municipal governments).

A **Community Shared Solar (CSS) project** is a solar photovoltaic (PV) system that provides benefits – such as electricity, net metering credits, and return on investment – to multiple participants. A CSS project is hosted by an entity with a suitable roof or parcel of land and is supported by multiple participants, who invest in the project or purchase the electricity or net metering credits generated. CSS offers an alternative for those who cannot install solar on their own property.

Community Shared Solar: Review and Recommendations for Massachusetts Models, March 2013. In this report, Cadmus identifies and assesses the opportunities and barriers of implementing CSS in Massachusetts. The report includes a review of existing CSS models being used across the country.
