



The Rural and Small Town Development Fund provides funding for projects in towns with populations of less than 7,000 or with a population density of less than 500 persons per square mile (measured by the 2020 US Census). These grants may be used for a variety of activities that support economic development, job creation, housing and climate resilience initiatives, and planning and zoning projects in small towns or rural areas of the state.
