

Buzzed Driving is Drunk Driving

13,524 people were killed in a drunk driving crash on our nation's roads in 2022

In Massachusetts in 2022 there were 144 fatalities that involved alcohol

Even a small amount of alcohol – one drink – can affect driving ability

2,337 people were killed in crashes where a driver had a blood alcohol content of 01 to 07. The drivers who had used alcohol make up 17% of the fatalities.

Am I OK to Drive?

If you have to do something to make yourself okay to drive, you're not okay to drive

Be Responsible – Have a Plan:

- Before drinking, choose a designated driver, or schedule a ride share/ride hailing or taxi service
- If you are hosting a party where there's alcohol, offer non-alcoholic drink options and make sure all guests leave with a sober driver

Always wear your seat belt — it's the best defense against drunk drivers

If you see an erratic driver on the road, safely pull over and call law enforcement
