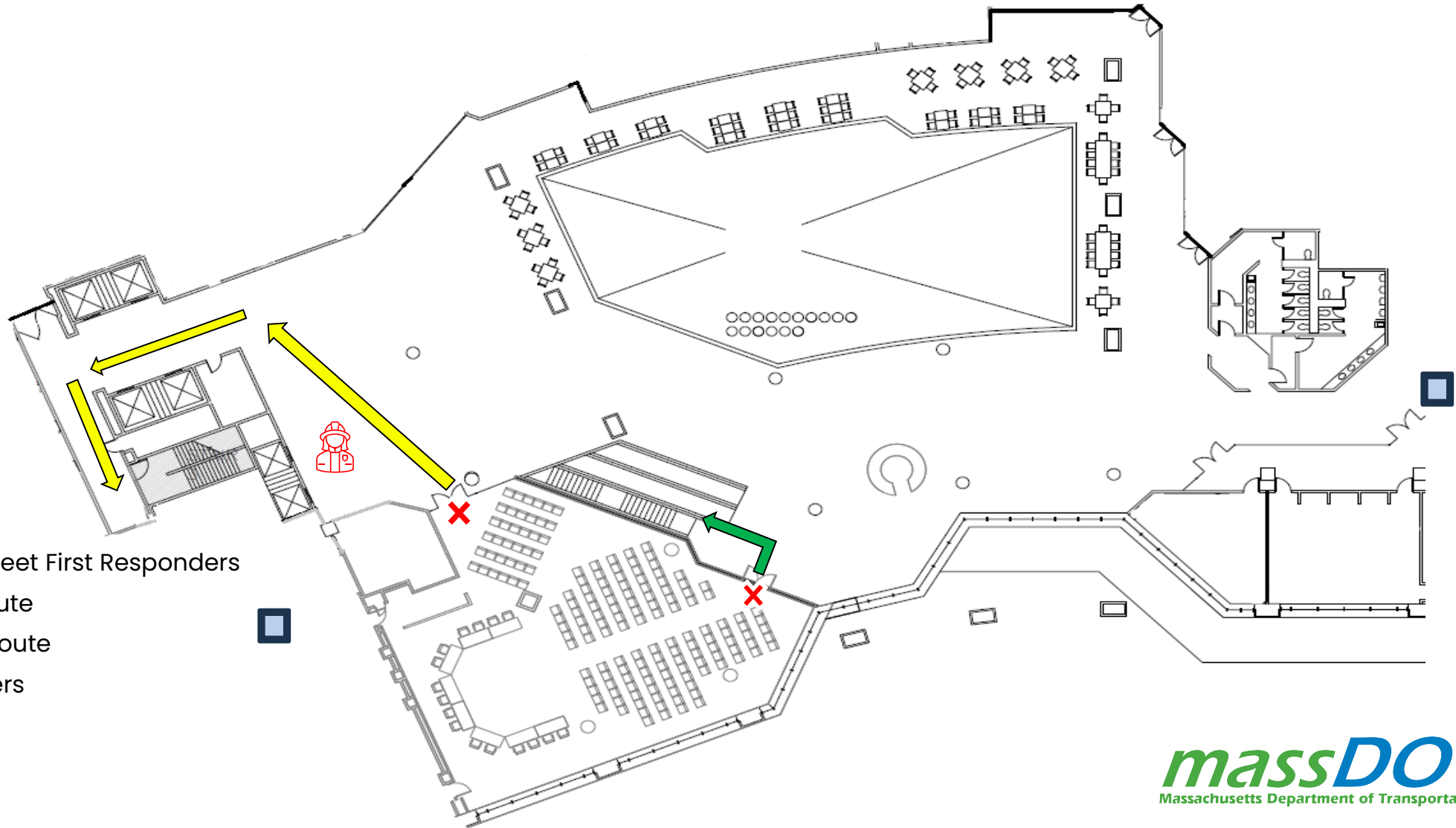

Heat Related Death Statistics

In 2023, the United States saw a record number of heat-related deaths, with more than 2,300 deaths attributable to excessive heat, according to the Journal of the American Medical Association.

This represents a significant increase of 117% since 1999, when there were 1,063 heat related deaths.

According to the Massachusetts Department of Health, in 2023, there were 2 heat-related deaths in the Commonwealth.



Practice Heat Safety Wherever You Are

Job Sites

Stay hydrated and take breaks in the shade as often as possible.

Indoors

Check up on the elderly, sick and those without AC.

Vehicles

Never leave kids or pets unattended- LOOK before you LOCK.

Limit strenuous outdoor activities, find shade, and stay hydrated.
