	Disposable nitrile gloves worn when cleaning turnout gear, hose, and equipment at the station.	1910.138(a)

<b>Focus Area 3: Ladder belts</b>  <i>(Fire Personnel)</i>	Ladder belt used in tower platform, and when working at stationary position on elevated ladder.	1910.67 (c)(2)(v)
	Training documentation for ladder belts used on elevated ladder/tower truck.	1910.30(a)
	Training documentation for persons who operate a ladder/tower truck.	1910.67(c)(2)(ii)
<b>Focus Area 4: Struck-by Vehicles</b>  <i>(Fire/EMS Personnel)</i>	Roadway incidents set up to prevent struck-by motorist vehicle.	OSHA General Duty, MUTCD 6I.01.07
	High-visibility clothing worn by Fire/EMS personnel working in roadway. (Exception: fire attack personnel or proximity to fire.)	1910.132(a)
	Training documentation for Traffic Incident Management for all Fire/EMS personnel who may work at a road incident.	OSHA General Duty, MUTCD 6I.01.07

<b>Focus 5: Tools, Equipment and Station</b>	Tools maintained in good working condition. (i.e. Chainsaws, cut-off saws, hydraulic tools, hose, nozzles).	1910.156(d)

	Electrical wiring in Station used as designed.	1910.303-305

	Opening at fire pole covered to prevent migration of diesel exhaust into living areas.	1910.1000

<b>Focus 6: Bloodborne Pathogens</b>  (Fire/EMS Personnel)	Station floors kept clean, orderly to prevent slip/trip injury.	1910.22(a)
	Written Exposure Control Plan for Fire and EMS.	1910.1030 (c)(1)
	Documentation of annual training.	1910.1030 (g)(2)
	Records of Hepatitis-B vaccine or declination.	1910.1030 (f)(2)
	Medical follow-up after an exposure incident.	1910.1030 (f)(3)
	Disinfection of equipment after blood exposure.	1910.1030 (d)(2)(xiv)
	PPE for potential blood exposure.	1910.1030 (d)(3)
<b>Focus 7: Ladders</b>  (Fire Personnel)	EMS uses safer needle devices.	1910.1030 (d)(2)(i)
	Sharps disposal containers used.	1910.1030 (d)(2)(viii)
<b>Focus 7: Ladders</b>  (Fire Personnel)	Ladders are inspected and broken equipment not used.	1910.23 (b)(9)
	Employees trained in ladder use. Training repeated if lack of skill demonstrated.	1910.30(b)(2)
<b>Focus 8: Heat Stress / Rehab</b> (Fire Personnel)	Rehab procedures to prevent heat stress in firefighters at fire scene.	OSHA General Duty Clause
