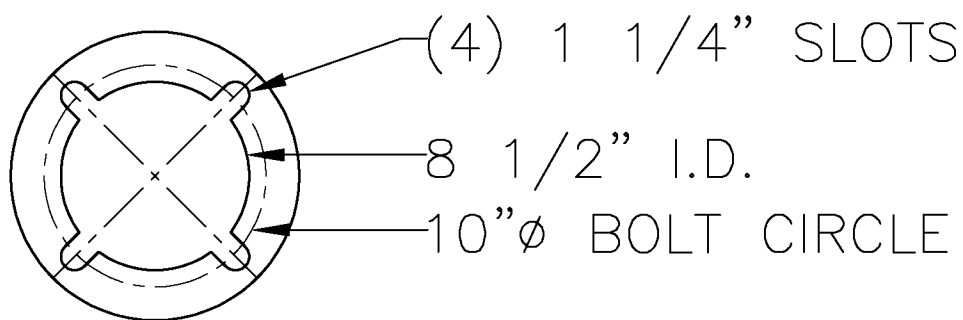
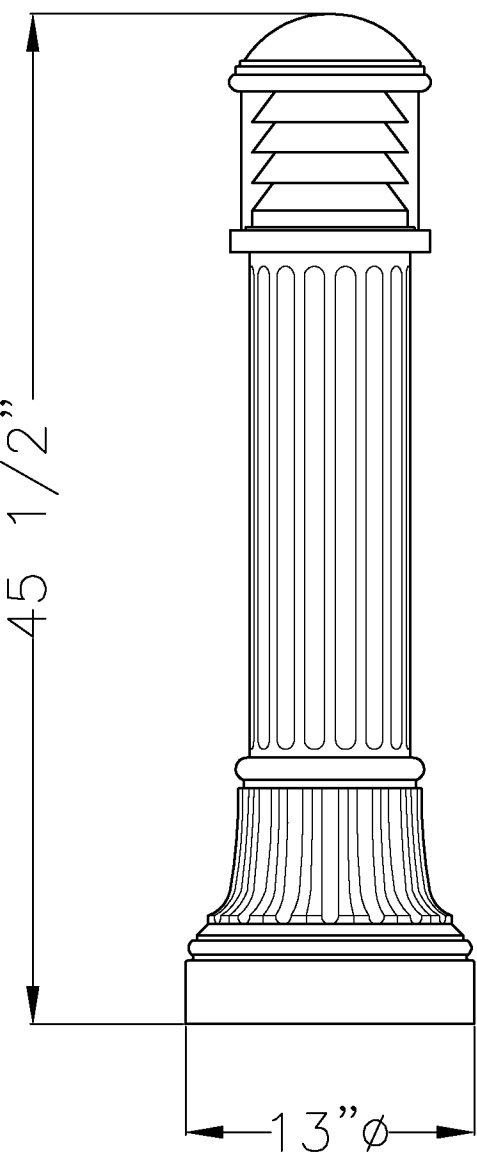

The funds that the City of Salem has received will be used to install lighted bollards (see attached specifications) at a busy downtown crosswalk.
