MassHealth School-Based Medicaid Provider Bulletin 25 August 2013

Background This bulletin is to notify you of the new Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA) regulations about parental consent. These regulations took effect on March 18, 2013. The IDEA requires local education authorities (LEAs) to ensure that parents are fully informed of their rights and provide consent before the LEA submits a claim to an insurer or public benefit agency. What the New The Department of Elementary and Secondary Education (DESE) is the Regulations Mean state agency responsible for overseeing the IDEA in Massachusetts. DESE has provided additional information about these new regulations and the new required parental consent form in Administrative Advisory SPED 2013-1 Parental Consent to Access MassHealth (Medicaid) which can be found at http://www.doe.mass.edu/sped/advisories/13_1.html . It's important that all LEAs ensure that parents understand that providing their consent to allow a school to submit claims to MassHealth does not alter or reduce the benefits that children are entitled to receive from MassHealth. DESE has informed us that the IDEA requires LEAs to obtain such parental consent before submitting claims to MassHealth; including children in the Medicaid eligibility statistics; or calculating the annual cost report. 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What the New Regulations Mean (cont.)	DESE has advised us that once a consent form compliant with the new regulation is obtained, LEAs are not required to obtain consent again in order to submit a claim to MassHealth, even if there is a change in the type or amount of services to be provided to the student or a change in the cost of the services to be charged to MassHealth.
