

I am pleased to present the Operational Services Division's Supplier Diversity Office (SDO) Comprehensive Annual Report for Fiscal Year 2019 (FY2019), which also includes narrative descriptions of supplier diversity programs and/or results from 11 Commonwealth of Massachusetts quasi-public organizations.

Consistent with the directives in Executive Order 565, the SDO provides certification, programs, training services, and access to business opportunities for Minority (MBE); Women (WBE); Veteran (VBE); Service-Disabled Veteran (SDVOBE); Disability (DOBE); and Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual, and Transgender (LGBTBE) owned businesses, as well as small businesses (SBPP) headquartered in Massachusetts. The accompanying report includes information about the Commonwealth's diverse and small business programs, including the Certification, Supplier Diversity (SDP), Small Business Purchasing (SBPP), and Affirmative Marketing programs. Below are some highlights from the report:

- The Commonwealth spent more than \$2.07 billion with diverse and small businesses (a 1.44% increase over FY2018), which includes discretionary spending of \$1.48 billion (a 1.5% increase over FY2018) and non-discretionary spending of \$596 million (a 1.27% increase over FY2018).
- For FY2019, the MBE and WBE benchmarks were increased by one percentage point, to 8% and 14%, respectively.
- The spending for MBE, WBE, and SBPP exceeded benchmarks by approximately 7%, 33%, and 37%, respectively.
- Work continued to improve spending against the veteran-owned business benchmark, continuing the upward trend in veteran spending and achieving 28% of the goal, which was up from 22% in FY2018.
- DOBE and LGBTBE were added to the Supplier Diversity Program, as part of a long-term plan to build utilization leading to the establishment of future DOBE and LGBTBE benchmarks.
- Total discretionary supplier diversity spending increased in all categories except MBE, which experienced a 4.5% decrease as a result of shifts in Commonwealth construction spending and the gradual completion of projects involving Portuguese Business Enterprises (PBEs).
- The number of certified businesses was maintained or increased in all categories but SDVOBE, bringing the total number of diverse firms available to do business with the Commonwealth and its prime contractors to 3,544 (a 7% increase over FY2018). The SDOVBE category experienced a 3% reduction due to the migration to a new online processing system for third-party certifications.
- The SDO signed a Memorandum of Understanding with the City of Boston (the City), thereby giving the City access to more than 3,000 SDO-certified MBE, WBE, and VBE and reducing business costs in accessing supplier diversity programs for both organizations.

The Commonwealth, through the SDO, was recognized with the inaugural, national Supplier Diversity Partnership Award by Disability: IN for our work to expand opportunities for individuals with disabilities in state procurement.

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Introduction

This report provides an overview of the activities and accomplishments of the Operational Services Division's (OSD) Supplier Diversity Office (SDO) and presents comprehensive information on diverse and small business spending across the wide range of the Commonwealth departments and quasi-public organizations and their programs.

Executive Summary

- The Commonwealth spent more than \$2.07 billion in FY2019 with diverse and small businesses (a 1.44% increase when compared to FY2018).
 - o Total discretionary spending equaled \$1.48 billion in FY2019, a 1.5% increase as compared to FY2018.
 - Non-discretionary spending totaled \$596 million in FY2019, a 1.27% increase over the prior fiscal year.
- For FY2019, the MBE and WBE benchmarks were increased by one percentage point, to 8% and 14%, respectively.
- The spending benchmarks for MBE, WBE, and SBPP, including the increased benchmarks for MBE and WBE, were surpassed by approximately 7%, 33%, and 37%, respectively.
- Work continues to improve spending against the veteran-owned business benchmark, continuing the upward trend in veteran spending and achieving 28% of the goal, which is up from 22% in FY2018.
- DOBE and LGBTBE were included in the Supplier Diversity Program, resulting in the first LGBTBE contractor spending report, and laying the foundation for the establishment of future DOBE and LGBTBE benchmarks.
- Total discretionary supplier diversity spending increased in all categories except MBE, which was due to an absolute reduction in the Division of Capital Asset Management and Maintenance (DCAMM) and Massachusetts Department of Transportation (MassDOT) construction spending by 24% and 8%, respectively. In addition, virtually all construction projects initiated prior to April 12, 2016, involving Portuguese Businesses Enterprises (PBE), have been completed. After that date, spending with PBEs no longer contributed to MBE spending.
- The number of certified businesses was maintained or increased in all categories but SDVOBE, bringing the
 total number of diverse firms available to do business with the Commonwealth and its prime contractors to
 3,544 (a 7% increase over FY2018). The SDOVBE category experienced a 3% reduction due to the expiration
 of four SDVOBE firms' certifications at the end of the fiscal year as the SDO was working to complete its new
 online processing system for third-party certifications.
- The Commonwealth, through SDO, signed a Memorandum of Understanding with the City of Boston, creating greater efficiency for the certified vendor community in being recognized by both entities for MBE, WBE, and VBE certified businesses.
- The SDO implemented a new Vendor Report Management system to improve SDP reporting accuracy for statewide contractors. It also expanded the FY2018 Spending Compliance Verification pilot, which verified spending with 16 certified SDP partners reported by 15 statewide contractors, by working with 96 certified companies to verify reports from 99 contractors. As a result of this expansion, 91% of the responses, representing 97% of the expenditures reported, were found to be accurate or understated by the contractors.
- The SDO improved its program services to buyers by issuing periodic SDP/SBPP agency performance reports and increasing the visibility of diverse and small contractors in OSD's Statewide Contract Index.

SDO Overview

The Commonwealth of Massachusetts spends approximately \$4.7 billion each year on goods, services, and construction. The role of the OSD's SDO is to certify and support a wide range of diverse and small businesses in competing for contracts being bid across the Commonwealth. The state's diversity programs include firms certified as Minority (MBE); Women (WBE); Veteran (VBE); Portuguese (PBE); Service-Disabled Veteran (SDVOBE); Disability (DOBE); and Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual, and Transgender (LGBTBE) Owned Business Enterprises.¹

OSD's SDO works to build a more inclusive supplier base for the Commonwealth through the following programs:

- State Certification Program
- Supplier Diversity Program (SDP)
- Small Business Purchasing Program (SBPP)
- Commonwealth and Municipal Construction Affirmative Marketing Programs (MCAMP)

Below are the SDO's accomplishments for FY2019.

State Certification Program

One of the SDO's primary services at the state level is to certify diverse and small businesses for participation in Massachusetts statewide and departmental procurements for goods and services, as well as departmental and municipal non-federally funded construction procurements². Each week, new businesses are certified, some businesses are decertified, and some businesses withdraw their applications. Therefore, the exact number of certified businesses fluctuates.

In FY2019, the SDO maintained or increased the number of certified businesses in all but one of the categories of certified and recognized businesses, bringing the total number of diverse firms available to do business with the Commonwealth and its prime contractors to 3,544 (a 7% increase over FY2018). The only exception was the SDVOBE category, in which the number of certified firms decreased by four.

¹ The SDO's State Certification Unit reviews applications for certification as MBE, WBE, VBE, PBE, and combinations thereof, as well as Minority (M/NPO), Women (W/NPO), and Minority Women Nonprofit Organizations (M/W/NPO). The SDO also accepts certifications issued by recognized third-party certifying organizations for MBE, WBE, VBE, SDVOBE, DOBE, and LGBTBE business enterprises.

² OSD's SDO supplier diversity certification is distinct from DCAMM certification for prime, small prime, and file sub-bidders. The latter is focused on construction-related criteria, such as years in business, completed projects, project value, and project evaluation.

State Certification

The SDO's State Certification Unit accepts applications, conducts investigations and site visits, and issues SDO certifications for MBE, WBE, VBE, PBE, and combinations thereof, as well as Minority (M/NPO), Women (W/NPO), and Minority Women Nonprofit Organizations (M/W/NPO). At the end of FY2019, there was a total of 3,141 SDO-certified businesses (2,984 for-profit and 157 nonprofit firms), some of which were certified as both minority- and women-owned/controlled (M/WBE and M/W/NPO).

Third-Party Certification Recognition

In addition to offering its own certification services, the SDO recognizes and accepts certifications issued by third-party partner organizations, such as VetBiz/U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs, Disability:IN, and the National LGBT Chamber of Commerce (NGLCC). In FY2019, OSD's SDO continued to transform and upgrade its recognition program for third-party certified businesses.

Online certification recognition. The SDO made a significant investment in enhancing its capacity to
recognize third-party certified businesses. Over a six-month period, the SDO worked to analyze and
redesign existing processes, eliminate paper forms, and improve the user experience. As a result of the

upgrade, at least four "application for verification/recognition" forms for different certification types were eliminated, and the old process of having third-party certified businesses apply for recognition by email was retired.

The tradeoff associated with the upgrade was a reduction in the number of third-party certified VBE and SDVOBE firms due to the expiration of vendor certifications that occurred at the end of the fiscal year while the SDO was upgrading its online system. In the case of third-party VBE certifications, the reduction was offset by increases in the number of VBE certifications issued by the SDO.

These upgrades, implemented at the end of FY2019, are expected to result in increased third-party certifications as they make it easier for third-party certified firms to apply directly to the SDO for certification recognition. The process expedites the SDO's processing of individual applications for certification recognition and enables the SDO to automatically recognize batches of certifications issued by certifying partners.

Automatic opt-in policy with the National LGBT Chamber of Commerce (NGLCC). In FY2019, OSD's SDO and the NGLCC implemented a significant policy change that made it easier for LGBTBEs to participate in the SDO's programs. Rather than requiring individual companies to opt-in for inclusion in the SDO programs, the inclusion now is automatic, and an opt-out option has been added for companies that choose not to participate. The change required upgrades to the IT infrastructure for both the SDO and the NGLCC. A communications campaign explaining the change was created and distributed to NGLCC-certified LGBTBEs. As a result of this campaign, the number of certified New England and New York LGBTBEs recognized by the OSD's SDO more than doubled in FY2019.

Ongoing Certification Program Activities

In FY2019, the State Certification Unit processed new applications, conducted triennial renewals, and administrative reviews of existing applications.

New applications. The OSD's SDO reviewed a total of 268 (13% fewer than in the prior fiscal year) new
applications for state MBE, WBE, and VBE certifications, including nonprofit applications. The number
of applications processed depends on market conditions, application volume, and the SDO's processing
capacity. In FY2019, the SDO's processing capacity was reduced due to the retirement of its only full-

time certification investigator. The SDO has since onboarded a new certification investigator to fill this vacancy and to restore its certification processing capacity. In addition, the SDO filled a new position of Intake Specialist whose role is to communicate with applicants and ensure completeness of all applications assigned for investigation thus making the certification process more efficient.

- Certification renewals & Administrative reviews. OSD's SDO maintained the accuracy of existing certifications by conducting 135 certification renewals and 55 administrative reviews.⁷ The significant reduction in the number of renewals was due to the transition from a two-year renewal cycle to a three-year renewal cycle implemented in FY2016.
- Denials and appeals. Applicants who receive letters of denial or decertification may appeal those
 decisions to an independent SDO Appeal Board for state applications. There were no tentative initial
 denials of applications for state certification in FY2019 and therefore there were no appeals.

Overview of Diverse and Small Business Spending

In FY2019, the Commonwealth spent more than \$2.08 billion with diverse and small businesses (a 1.7% increase when compared to FY2018), which occurred in two areas:

- Discretionary spending, which represented 71% of diverse and small business spending, and
- Non-discretionary spending, which accounted for 29% of diverse and small business expenditures.

Discretionary Spending with Diverse and Small Businesses

The SDO's programs focus on discretionary spending for goods, services, construction, and design, which result from competitively procured contracts. The SDO's programs use policy, benchmark-setting, coordination, training, and recognition of excellence to ensure the participation of diverse and small businesses in these areas of procurement. In FY2019, organizations participating in the Supplier Diversity, Small Business Purchasing, and Affirmative Marketing programs, as well as municipalities participating in the Municipal Construction Affirmative Marketing Program (MCAMP), increased diversity spending by 1.5% to \$1.48 billion.

⁸ Consistent with previous SDO annual reports, this analysis includes combined achievements of all supplier diversity programs that exist in participating organizations and use SDO-certified businesses. While the SDP and SBPP address goods and services, MGL c. 7C, § 6 charges DCAMM and the SDO with establishing MBE and WBE participation goals for capital facility projects under DCAMM's control and state-assisted municipal building projects. This report includes spending data for DCAMM's construction projects available at the time of the report's publication. Final information on DCAMM's Affirmative Marketing Program efforts will be published as a separate report issued by DCAMM's Office of Access and Opportunity. Commonwealth departments, including MassDOT, manage their own Affirmative Marketing Programs addressing construction, relying on the SDO's certification services and setting their own supplier diversity goals or using those established by the SDO and DCAMM.

In FY2019, spending benchmarks were met or surpassed, except in the Veteran (VBE/SDVOBE) business category. The MBE and WBE benchmarks, which were increased to 8% and 14%, respectively, were exceeded by 6.89% and 32.65% respectively.


Although the Commonwealth's discretionary spending was virtually level with the previous year (increasing by \$32 million or 0.69%), expenditures shifted between categories. Total direct (discretionary and non-discretionary) construction expenditures decreased by approximately \$78 million, or 24%, for DCAMM due to the delay in the passage of the 2018 Capital Bond Bill, and \$95 million, or 8%, for MassDOT. These reductions in spending also influenced the Commonwealth's indirect spending for the following reasons:

- Because construction projects often involve significant diverse subcontractor engagement, the above reductions in direct spending also affected indirect expenditures.
- Further, the participation of specific trades changes over the course of a construction project affecting
 the timing of payments to participating companies. As a result, MassDOT reported a reduction in
 payments to MBE and WBE subcontractors, which did not affect reaching overall supplier diversity goals
 set based on project total.
- Finally, nearly all construction projects initiated prior to April 12, 2016, involving PBEs have been completed. After that date, spending with PBEs no longer contributed to MBE spending. The Commonwealth continues to use PBEs, because expenditures with those enterprises continue to qualify for the federal Disadvantaged Business Enterprise (DBE) program utilizing federal funds. The following chart shows the gradual reduction in the contribution of PBE spending to the Commonwealth's MBE statistics. The PBE contribution to the Commonwealth's MBE total decreased from nearly \$76 million in FY2017 to \$5.8 million in FY2019. Although non-PBE MBE spending increased from \$344 million to more than \$400 million over the same period, the reduction in PBE spending still had a significant impact on the Commonwealth MBE total.

Among the 1,155¹⁰ diverse and small companies that did business directly with the Commonwealth, each business fell into one or more of the following groups: 175 MBEs and 359 WBEs (52 M/WBE businesses), 34 veteran businesses, 13 disability businesses, 1 LGBTBE, and 779 COMMBUYS-verified small businesses. Direct expenditures include \$453,143 in spending with three PBEs on projects initiated prior to April 12, 2016. Among the 1,133 SDP partner companies (indirect spending), each business fell into one or more of the following groups: 392 MBEs and 812 WBEs (121 M/WBE businesses), and 53 veteran businesses, 26 disability businesses, and 8 LGBTBEs. The SBPP does not include an indirect spending component. Indirect expenditures include approximately \$5.4 million in spending with 8 PBEs on projects initiated prior to April 12, 2016.

Non-Discretionary Spending with Diverse and Small Businesses

The Commonwealth makes pension and insurance-related expenditures, awards, grants and subsidies, manages entitlement programs, and maintains loans and special payments, which are considered non-discretionary spending. While the Commonwealth's supplier diversity programs do not apply to these non-discretionary areas of spending, diverse and small businesses are part of that marketplace.

In FY2019, combined non-discretionary direct expenditures totaled approximately \$596 million, representing a 1.3% increase when compared to the prior fiscal year. While most of this spending is the Commonwealth's direct expenditures, indirect spending in this category is reported by the Department of Correction (DOC) and the Group Insurance Commission (GIC), which voluntarily include supplier diversity provisions in non-discretionary contracts.

Total Spending with Diverse and Small Businesses

Total discretionary and non-discretionary spending with diverse and small businesses in FY2019 increased in all business categories and exceeded \$2.07 billion. This represented a 1.44% increase compared to FY2018.

Supplier Diversity Program (SDP)

The SDP is enabled through <u>Executive Order 565</u> to promote equity of opportunity in state government. The SDP applies to all executive department procurements for goods and services exceeding \$150,000. The program institutes policies to encourage participating organizations and their contractors to use SDO-certified MBEs, WBEs, and VBEs, DOBEs, DOBEs, and LGBTBEs in their contracts for goods and services.

The SDP covers the following business categories, some of which have annual benchmark goals that are set by OSD's SDO and expressed as percentages of each participating organization's discretionary budget. The benchmarks for MBE and WBE increased by a percentage point for FY2019 to 8% and 14%, respectively. The benchmark for Veteran businesses remained at 3%.

Seventy-three organizations participate in the SDP, falling into three groups:

- Executive branch departments in all secretariats;
- Non-executive departments and constitutional offices (Office of the Governor, the Massachusetts Gaming Commission, the Commission Against Discrimination, and the Disabled Persons Protection Commission); and
- Quasi-public entities (the Massachusetts Convention Center Authority and the Massachusetts Housing Finance Agency).

Only executive departments are required to participate in the SDO's procurement programs, which include the SDP and the SBPP. Non-executive departments and quasi-public organizations participate in the SDP only and do so voluntarily. For quasi-public organizations, the degree of adherence to the SDO's program rules and participation in this report varies:

- Two quasi-public organizations fully participate in the SDP with goal setting, tracking, and reporting consistent with procedures used by executive branch departments:
 - Massachusetts Convention Center Authority (MCCA)
 - Massachusetts Housing Finance Agency (MassHousing)
- Nine additional quasi-public organizations submit narrative program reports for inclusion in the report:
 - Massachusetts Development Finance Agency (MassDevelopment)
 - Massachusetts Gaming Commission
 - Massachusetts Growth Capital Corporation
 - Massachusetts Port Authority (Massport)
 - Massachusetts State College Building Authority
 - Massachusetts Water Resources Authority

 - Massachusetts School Building Authority (MSBA)
- Four additional organizations participate in supplier diversity meetings coordinated jointly by the SDO and the Governor's Office of Access and Opportunity:

 - Massachusetts Bay Transportation Authority (MBTA)
 - o Massachusetts Designer Selection Board
 - Massachusetts Life Sciences Center (MLSC)

Participating organizations may use two types of spending to achieve program spending goals:

- Direct spending with MBE, WBE, VBE, SDVOBE, DOBE, and LGBTBE prime contractors; and
- Indirect spending resulting from business partnerships between the organizations' contractors and MBE, WBE, VBE, SDVOBE, DOBE, or LGBTBE vendors used in the contractors' operations. This includes subcontracting, as well as other types of business-to-business relationships.¹³

OSD's SDO obtains information about direct spending with certified contractors from the Commonwealth Information Warehouse (CIW), a repository of the Commonwealth's financial transactions. Indirect spending is reported to agencies by their contractors and then compiled and submitted to the SDO. Quasi-public organizations monitor supplier diversity spending internally and submit their direct and indirect expenditure information to SDO for analysis and publication.

¹³ While contractors may use DOBE and LGBTBE vendors to meet their contractual SDP commitments, organizations participating in the SDP do not yet have spending goals for these certification categories.

Minority-Owned Business Enterprise (MBE) Spending

The 8% benchmark for MBE spending was exceeded by 6.89%, which meant program participants spent 8.55% of their discretionary budgets with MBEs.

When compared to the previous fiscal year, MBE spending by program participants in FY2019 decreased by approximately \$19.1 million or 4.5% (3.8% for Executive Departments) due to reduced construction and design spending at DCAMM and MassDOT; the gradual completion of construction projects initiated by DCAMM and MassDOT prior to April 12, 2016, involving PBEs; and annual changes in the utilization of trades at MassDOT.

Spending with PBEs on projects commenced after April 12, 2016, is excluded from MBE spending. As a result, while the Commonwealth continued to utilize PBEs in construction and while spending with PBEs continued to contribute to federal DBE program goals, PBE spending from more recent projects was not included in this report. The amount of MBE spending resulting from such projects has decreased annually from approximately \$75.6 million in FY2017 to \$30 million in FY2018 to \$5.8 million in FY2019. Additionally, MassDOT's supplier diversity goals are project based and allow for fluctuations in the year-to-year utilization of diverse contractors as long as the prime contractor meets the overall supplier diversity goals for the project.

¹⁴ Effective April 12, 2016, pursuant to an order issued by the Superior Court of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts, all firms previously certified as Minority Business Enterprises (MBE), based on the owner being of Portuguese origin, no longer shall be considered MBEs, but shall be considered Portuguese Business Enterprises (PBEs). PBEs shall be eligible for participation in programs funded by state transportation bond statutes that include such persons as eligible participants. Accounting for the multi-year nature of construction projects and consistent with the DCAMM reporting methodology, the SDO's FY2017 annual report included more than \$21 million in direct and nearly \$54.6 million (\$46.3 million at MassDOT and \$8.3 million at DCAMM) in indirect PBE spending associated with projects awarded prior to April 12, 2016. The FY2018 report included \$5.3 million in direct spending and approximately \$24.7 million (\$21.2 million at MassDOT, \$1.1 million at DCR, and \$2.4 million at DCAMM) in indirect spending associated with such projects. When compared to the previous fiscal year, the Commonwealth's spending with WBEs decreased by approximately \$6.6 million or 0.75% (0.90% for Executive Departments) due to two factors. Both DCAMM and MassDOT recorded lower direct construction and design spending, which resulted in lower indirect WBE spending. In FY2019, DCAMM experienced a 43% reduction in indirect WBE construction and design spending

and MassDOT recorded a 38% WBE indirect spending reduction in the same category. Additionally, MassDOT's supplier diversity goals are project based and allow for fluctuations in the year-to-year utilization of diverse contractors as long as the prime contractor meets the overall supplier diversity goals for the project.

Combined Veteran-Owned Business Spending

In FY2019, the Commonwealth continued to demonstrate dramatic growth in Veteran (combined VBE and SDVOBE spending) spending. While the ambitious 3% Veteran spending benchmark has not been attained, spending in this category increased by approximately \$8.5 million, or 26.89%, compared to the previous fiscal year and reached nearly \$40 million.

Disability and LGBTBE Spending

DOBE and LGBTBE are the newest categories to be included in the SDP. Since the program expansion in FY2016, the SDO established successful partnerships with Disability:IN and the National LGBT Chamber of Commerce, as well as with their local affiliates, the Disability:IN Massachusetts and the Massachusetts LGBT Chamber of Commerce. FY2019 was the first fiscal year that DOBE and LGBTBE were included in departmental and contractor supplier diversity plans, resulting in the first reports of SDP partnerships between contractors and LGBTBE. There were no reports of partnerships with DOBE. These efforts resulted in the Commonwealth nearly doubling its Disability business spending and increasing LGBTBE spending by 13.57% in FY2019.

Small Business Purchasing Program (SBPP)

The Small Business Purchasing Program (SBPP)¹⁵ was established in 2010 through <u>Executive Order 523</u> to direct state spending for non-construction goods and services to participating Massachusetts small businesses. This program applies to executive department procurements with total values equal to or less than \$150,000.

Small Business Registration

In FY2019, COMMBUYS continued to provide automated registration of small businesses. At the end of FY2019, there were 1,322 small businesses verified in COMMBUYS, which represents a decrease of 36% as compared to FY2018.

The decrease in SBPP registrations was due to the activation of the SBPP interface with the Massachusetts Department of Revenue (DOR) in early December 2018. The interface connected COMMBUYS to DOR's new database and changed the SBPP application process for interested firms from self-identification to automated validation. The change resulted in a significant number of self-reported small businesses to fail the automatic

¹⁵ To qualify for the SBPP, a firm must: (1) have its principal place of business in Massachusetts; (2) have been in business for at least one year; (3) currently employ a combined total of 50 or fewer full-time employee (FTE) equivalents in all locations; and (4) have gross revenues as reported on the appropriate Massachusetts Department of Revenue state tax forms of \$15 million or less, based on a three-year average.

validation. All firms whose automatic validation failed were invited to re-apply for SBPP status, which would be manually validated by the SDO.

In addition, in May 2019, OSD's SDO commenced a comprehensive review and improvement of the SBPP using the Agile SCRUM methodology. The SBPP Improvement SCRUM Team includes representatives from the following OSD units: SDO; Sourcing; Legal; Technology Enablement; Marketing, Communications, and Events; as well as the A&F Information Technology unit. The goal of the team was to "develop and implement a comprehensive revision of the Small Business Purchasing Program, including infrastructure, messaging, policy, guidance, and activities, to enhance the program's value to the business community and improve usability for purchasers." The team's first three sprints took place in FY2019, and work on this goal continues in FY2020.

Small Business Purchasing Program (SBPP) Spending

Only the Commonwealth executive and non-executive departments participate in the SBPP, which has a 3.3% benchmark for discretionary spending. Total SBPP spending in FY2019 exceeded the benchmark by 37.39%, with program participants spending approximately 4.5% of their discretionary budgets with COMMBUYS-verified small businesses.



Combined SDP and SBPP Results

Separate benchmarks set for various business groups are an effective tool for motivating participating organizations and tracking their supplier diversity efforts. However, many of the businesses served by the SDO's programs fall into more than one business category and contribute to spending totals for each of those business categories. For example, a department's purchase from an M/WBE contributes to reaching the department's MBE as well as their WBE spending goals. As a result, the overall impact of the SDP and SBPP may not be calculated by simply adding up spending in each business category.

The following chart highlights such business category overlaps in both direct and indirect spending. Continuing with the example above, spending with M/WBEs is shown in red and is shown as contributing to MBE as well as WBE spending bars. The two rightmost bars of the chart, marked "Total Program," include red M/WBE components, as well. It is clear by the size of the red components that the M/WBE contribution was counted once. In general, total program spending in this report is calculated by counting spending with each contractor and SDP partner once. As a result, total spending always will be less than the sum of spending in each business category. The same rule applies to the total number of contractors and SDP partners compared to the sum of vendors in each business category.

The table below highlights the overlaps among the diverse types of businesses served by the SDP and SBPP. Each column represents a program business category (MBE, WBE, etc.). The Program Total spending column on the far right represents the sum of expenditures with businesses that fall into each eligible owner group (e.g. Minority Men, Minority Women, etc.) with no double-counting. Accounting for these overlaps, the expenditures for all owner groups combined, are approximately 8% less than the sum of expenditures for each business category.

Municipal Construction Affirmative Marketing Programs (MCAMP)

Massachusetts municipalities incorporate MBE and WBE goals into the design and construction phases of all state-funded municipal construction contracts that exceed \$100,000. The SDO, in consultation with DCAMM, is charged with establishing MBE and WBE participation goals for state-funded municipal construction contracts. The mission of the MCAMP (formerly known as the Construction Reform Program) is to educate, monitor, and

assist municipalities in the attainment and enforcement of MBE/WBE participation goals for the design and construction phases of municipal projects.

MCAMP uses combined MBE/WBE goals to provide designers and contractors with flexibility in utilizing MBE and/or WBE contractors. The goal percentages are set jointly by the SDO and DCAMM and these goals also apply to DCAMM's Affirmative Marketing Program.¹⁷

Massachusetts School Building Authority (MSBA) Spending

The Massachusetts School Building Authority (MSBA) funds nearly 100% of the projects that fall under the MCAMP. As a result, the SDO tracks their projects exclusively. The SDO serves as a resource on policy and process related to the implementation of MCAMP by municipalities. However, individual municipal recipients of MBSA funds are the final decision makers regarding project MBE/WBE utilization goals for school construction projects.

The chart below compares FY2018 and FY2019 MBE/WBE spending on MSBA projects based on notices to proceed issued each year. The total combined MBE/WBE spending in FY2019 equaled \$45,124,634, which represents an increase of \$15,339,152 million when compared to the prior fiscal year.¹⁸

The combined MBE/WBE participation level in FY2019 was 7.55%, which fell short of the 10.4% participation goal. The decrease stems from municipal decisions related to MBE/WBE goals set for several projects commenced in FY2019.

Program Outreach, Collaboration and Innovation Results

In FY2019, the SDO continued to use its holistic, three-prong approach to developing the supplier diversity marketplace through program recruitment, engagement/retention, and increased spending. This section provides highlights of the SDO's work over the fiscal year in those areas:

Program Recruitment

- Full, mutual recognition of MBE, WBE, and VBE certifications issued by the City of Boston. On February 6, 2019, OSD's SDO executed a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) with the City of Boston (the City), which stated that the SDO and the City will recognize each other's certifications without additional investigation. The new policy gave the City access to more than 3,000 SDO-certified MBE, WBE, and VBE for its programs and makes it easier for businesses to access both organizations' supplier diversity programs. While the prior policy of allowing firms to use the same application materials for both organizations saved interested firms a significant amount of time, the change made attaining state and city supplier diversity certification even more efficient.
- Training workshops, webinars and webcasts. In FY2019, the SDO, in partnership with the OSD Training unit, offered 16 pre-certification workshops throughout the Commonwealth (two more than offered during FY2018). On average, each workshop drew approximately 52 attendees for a total of 832 individuals (an increase of 134 attendees or 19% when compared to FY2018). Pre-certification workshops are designed for Massachusetts-based firms interested in becoming certified. Led by a team of SDO staff and an OSD trainer, they introduce the SDO certification, discuss certification criteria, processes, and forms, and explain the marketing benefits of certification. Attendance at the precertification workshop is a requirement for all in-state businesses that wish to become certified.
 - In addition to these workshops and to improve compliance by contractors with their SDP commitments, the SDO and the OSD Training unit developed a webinar for Statewide Contractors that specifically addresses meeting their SDP commitments. Five sessions were provided to the Statewide Contractor community, which were attended by 62 contractors. In addition, the OSD offered 22 SDP overview webinars for prime contractors and certified businesses, which were attended by 78 firms in FY2019.
- Education, networking, and "SDO in the Community" days. In FY2019, the SDO staff participated in
 more than 45 events geared toward diverse and small businesses. The events ranged from roundtables
 and workshops to conferences, and the SDO presented and/or hosted information tables at many of

these events. In addition, the SDO continued to host its "SDO in the Community" days in Gateway Cities. These events, coordinated and marketed in partnership with local chambers of commerce and/or economic development offices, allowed diverse and small vendors to sign up for a 30-minute meeting to address specific issues and ask questions about diverse and small business certification and procurement programs. In FY2019, the SDO organized and held nine such days, in Lowell, Fitchburg, Fall River, Shirley, Taunton, Chelsea, Holyoke, Westfield, and Salem, meeting with more than 60 diverse and small businesses.

- Continued use of the Certification Self-Assessment Tool. Over the course of the fiscal year, the SDO's interactive Certification Self-Assessment Tool was accessed 2,553 times (a 3% increase from FY2018). During FY2019, 380 companies (a 10% increase from FY2018) completed the assessment and received tailored guidance on accessing applicable SDO programs. The SDO followed up with each of these companies with additional certification program information.
- Outreach and marketing activities. In FY2019, the SDO continued to work with the OSD Marketing,
 Communications, and Events (MCE) unit to promote the work of the SDO through OSD's communication
 channels. The collaboration resulted in five feature stories discussing the SDP and the SBPP in OSD's
 newsletter, Buy the Way. Supplier diversity topics also entered prominently in the OSD's social media
 strategy with the SDO programs regularly featured in OSD Tweets and postings on LinkedIn and
 Instagram.
 - In FY2019, the MCAMP worked closely with DCAMM's Office of Access & Opportunity concerning recruitment of new SDO and DCAMM certified companies and increased participation on DCAMM projects by diverse firms. The MCAMP also assisted quasi-public and private organizations in their outreach to MBE, WBE, and VBE businesses in the field of construction with the goal of identifying and contracting potential minority-, woman-, and veteran-owned subcontractors for large construction projects. In FY2019, the program continued working with municipalities on MSBA public sector projects; and with Massachusetts Gaming Commission licensees, Encore Boston Harbor, MGM Springfield, and Plainridge Park casinos. In addition, the program has assisted Millennium Partners, the developers of the \$1 billion Boston Winthrop Square high-rise, to establish and meet their MBE/WBE diversity goals.
- Schools of Construction. MCAMP's most innovative endeavor has been its partnership with two of the
 nation's largest construction companies' Mentor-Protégé programs: the Gilbane M/WBE Contractor
 Training Program and the Suffolk Trades Partnership Series. Over the last eight years, more than 230
 SDO-certified companies have graduated from these programs and have been awarded more than \$40
 million in contracts.

Program Engagement and Retention

- Online certification system enhancements. In FY2019, OSD's SDO continued to invest in improving its
 IT infrastructure to improve the customer experience, streamline processes, and increase efficiency.
 The SDO team utilized Agile SCRUM methodology to complete three major enhancements for its Certrak
 Certification System, including:
 - Enabling online application for recognition by firms certified by the SDO's certifying partners. Previously, interested firms were required to complete a paper application form and submit it by email with scanned supporting materials. The new process eliminates the need for an application form, ensures the completeness of the application at the time of submission, expedites processing times, and improves document retention.
 - Replacing the mail-in certification renewal process with an efficient online process. Prior to this change, the SDO mailed out more than 1,000 letters each year inviting firms to renew their certifications and then processed paper applications for renewals. The streamlined renewal

process eliminates paper forms and postage costs and saves time for the renewing firms. Meanwhile, time savings realized by the SDO are invested in assisting firms with their first online renewals, in training certified firms in the use of other features of the online certification portal, and in ensuring accurate email addresses for upcoming renewals.

- Sending out targeted custom emails with announcements of bidding opportunities and networking events. Previously, creating targeted lists of certified vendors, developing announcement emails and distributing them required at least two hours of work by several SDO team members per email. The new process allows one team member to generate a custom distribution list and the email message in minutes. Time savings realized from this enhancement also are invested in providing customer service and training as certified firms learn to use the new online certification portal.
- Expanding Opportunities for Individuals with Disabilities in State Procurement and Contracting. Pursuant to Section 4 of Chapter 219 of the Acts of 2016, An Act Relative to Job Creation and Workforce Development, and Section 88 of Chapter 154 of the Acts of 2018, the SDO partnered with the Massachusetts Office on Disability in the implementation of the following goals "to provide opportunities for individuals with disabilities in all areas of state procurement and contracting":
 - o Ensure that all Commonwealth contracts include anti-discrimination terms;
 - Expand the inclusion of DOBEs in state contracting;
 - Develop a central repository of resources for individuals with disabilities;
 - Conduct a due diligence review of current and best practices; and
 - Establish a pilot program for three contracts to include employment percentage goals for contractors to recruit, retain, and promote individuals with disabilities.

Most notably, OSD's SDO worked with the OSD Strategic Sourcing Services unit and procurement personnel from two executive departments to implement the Persons with Disabilities Pilot Program (the Pilot) on two statewide and two departmental contracts. The goal of the Pilot is to "promote the recruitment, hiring, promotion, and retention of individuals with disabilities and assist state contractors in evaluating and measuring levels of success." Specifically, the Pilot was incorporated into the following contracts:

- The Statewide Contract for Office Supplies, Recycled Paper and Envelopes (OFF47) issued by the OSD issued in April 2019.
- The Statewide Contract for Janitorial Services, Environmentally Preferable (FAC81), issued by the OSD in February 2014 (Pilot provisions were incorporated through contract renewal in February 2019).
- The *Food and Dietary Services Contract* issued by the DDS in April 2019.
- The Integrated Janitorial Services for the Massachusetts Information Technology Center in Chelsea, MA, issued by the DCAMM in July 2016 (Pilot provisions were incorporated through contract renewal in June 2019).

Details on these efforts may be found in the report titled <u>Fiscal Year 2019 Report to the Legislature on the Expansion of Opportunities for Individuals with Disabilities in State Procurement and Contracting</u>, which is published on the SDO website.

Program Spending

• Inclusion of DOBE and LGBTBE vendors into SDP Plans. On July 26, 2018, OSD issued the policy memorandum Expanding Supplier Diversity Plans to Include Disability-Owned Business Enterprises (DOBE) and Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual, and Transgender-Owned Business Enterprises (LGBTBE). The memorandum codified the inclusion of DOBE and LGBTBE companies as eligible partners into contractor and departmental SDP Plans as provided for in <u>Executive Order 565</u>. This change was designed to increase the number of DOBEs and LGBTBEs available to work with the Commonwealth and its

contractors by creating an economic incentive for new businesses to seek certification and for existing DOBE and LGBTBE-certified businesses to engage more actively with the Commonwealth.

- Increased spending benchmarks. On July 31, 2018, the SDO issued the policy memorandum *Fiscal Year 2019 Updates to the Benchmarks for the Supplier Diversity Program (SDP) and the Small Business Purchasing Program (SBPP)*. The document increased the MBE spending benchmark from 7% to 8% (a 14.3% increase), and the WBE spending benchmark from 13% to 14% (a 7.7% increase). The announcement was followed by 3, one-hour webinars discussing the content of the memorandum, lessons learned from prior fiscal years, suggested departmental best practices, and resources and assistance available from the SDO. This Annual Report is based on these increased benchmark levels. The most recent increase (prior to the FY2019 increase) took place in FY2016, when benchmarks were raised for MBEs from 6% to 7% and WBEs from 12% to 13%.
- Vendor Report Management System implementation. In FY2019, the SDO, in partnership with OSD's
 Strategic Sourcing Services and Technology Enablement units, implemented a new Vendor Report
 Management (VRM) system that improves SDP reporting and compliance by ensuring that all SDP
 partners appearing in statewide contractor reports are currently certified or recognized by the SDO.
- SDP Spending Compliance Verification. Following the SDP spending compliance pilot in FY2018, the SDO expanded the effort and conducted a full SDP Spending Compliance Verification program, which included outreach to verify 150 sets of spending reports (i.e. all reports submitted by a Statewide Contractor listing a specific SDO-certified vendor) received by the OSD's Strategic Sourcing Services unit in FY2019. The effort involved verifying reports submitted by 120 Statewide Contractors, who named 123 SDO-certified businesses with total expenditures of approximately \$19.8 million.

The goal of the effort was to assess the accuracy of SDP reports submitted by Statewide Contractors by requesting SDO-certified vendors to confirm that they received the payments as stated on the spending reports. Out of the 150 sets of reports selected for verification, 109 reports were verified successfully, representing 79% of the total number of reports and 91% of the total expenditures reported. Based on the responses received, the SDO found the following:

- Accurate and understated reports: 108 sets of reports (91% of the responses, representing 97% of the expenditures reported) were confirmed to be accurate²⁰ or higher than reported. Of that number, 13 sets (11% of the responses, representing 23% of the expenditures reported) were understated, and the Statewide Contractor, in fact, spent more than reported.
- Overstated reports: Eleven sets of reports (9% of the responses and 3% of the expenditures reported) were found to be overstated by the Statewide Contractors. In each of those cases, the SDO notified the OSD Sourcing unit and requested that the contractor amend the SDP reports submitted to OSD or otherwise resolve the reporting issue. Data used for this Annual Report spending section was updated to reflect accurate spending amounts for the contractors in question.

In addition, in FY2019, the SDO led a cross-unit "SDO Spending Compliance" team focused on ensuring program awareness and expanding the selection of SDP partners for Statewide Contractors under the OSD's Wildly Important Goal performance management methodology. The team:

- Researched more than 260 potential certification candidates;
- o Conducted outreach and certification guidance to 105 confirmed certification candidates;
- Developed a new webinar for Statewide and Departmental Contractors;
- Delivered five webinar sessions for current Statewide Contractors.

The team's work resulted in new SDO certifications being issued for vendors doing business with Statewide and Departmental Contractors and in clarifying SDP questions for more than 60 Statewide Contractors.

- Departmental SDP/SBPP Performance Updates. In FY2019, the SDO began distributing periodic SDP/SBPP Progress Updates to secretariats and departments. These customized reports are distributed by email to each department. The reports provide information on the department's year-to-date spending, compares it to prior fiscal year spending, and tracks progress toward the benchmark. Reports sent to secretariats also include information on the performance of all departments within the secretariat. A total of 407 individuals across the Commonwealth received these reports, including Agency Heads, Chief Fiscal Officers, Chief Procurement Officers, and other personnel involved in procurement, purchasing, or placing orders. In addition to these updates, the SDO regularly presented program updates at the Chief Procurement Officer Summits presented by the OSD Sourcing unit.
- Updated Statewide Contract Index. The SDO collaborated with OSD's Sourcing; Technology Enablement; and Marketing, Communications, and Events units in updating the <u>Statewide Contract Index</u> (the Index) available on the COMMBUYS homepage as well as on the OSD website. The Index is a searchable resource allowing buyers to identify contracts and vendors that meet their needs. The updated Index now includes information on which of the current statewide contractors are diverse and/or small Massachusetts businesses. The goal of this change was to make it easier for departments to identify diverse and small statewide contractors at the time of purchase to meet departmental SDP and SBPP benchmarks.
- Collaboration with Quasi-Public Organizations. In FY2019, the SDO continued working with the
 Governor's Office of Access, Opportunity, and Community Affairs to conduct outreach to independent
 agencies and quasi-public organizations to participate in this Annual Report. As a result, the SDO
 included 11 such organizations into this report (see the "Narrative Reports by Quasi-Public
 Organizations" chapter).

Narrative Reports by Quasi-Public Organizations

In FY2019, OSD's SDO, in collaboration with the Governor's Office of Access, Opportunity and Community Affairs, continued to coordinate supplier diversity activities among more than two dozen quasi-public organizations across the state. In addition to meetings, resources, and best practices, participants in this effort

were offered an opportunity to report their supplier diversity program results through this Annual Report. This chapter contains information from 11 quasi-public organizations that submitted such narrative reports, including two organizations also participating in the quantitative sections of this report (the Massachusetts Convention Center Authority and MassHousing).

Massachusetts Convention Center Authority (MCCA)

The MCCA adopted the Administration's methodology and procedures for measuring diverse business spending, beginning with its FY2017 reporting. While it has not tracked additional categories for diverse business types in the past, the MCCA now is asking vendors to report their certification status among a broader set of business categories (e.g., veteran-owned, LGBT-owned). In FY2018, the MCCA was proud to receive a Supplier Diversity Award for its efforts in promoting economic opportunity for small and diverse businesses in the Commonwealth in the prior fiscal year. Through its centralized Purchasing and Procurement team, the MCCA is looking to continually build upon this achievement to increase opportunities for diverse suppliers. During FY2019, the MCCA experienced a significant reduction in its MBE spending, which resulted from a large capital project with an MBE-certified general contractor coming to end in the summer of 2018. After accounting for this change, however, the MCCA experienced a year-over-year increase in its total MBE spending and used 46 MBE vendors, which represents an 84% increase in the number of MBE vendors. Additionally, the MCCA was able to increase its WBE expenditures by 54%, from \$1.9 million in FY2018 to \$2.9 million in FY 2019.

The MCCA advertises major procurements on its website and through local and regional news outlets. Typically, firms responding to such procurements are required to identify how and in what amount they are including diverse businesses within their proposals. Please visit the MCCA Business Opportunities page for information on current and upcoming Requests for Proposals, Requests for Qualifications, and Invitations for Bids.

Massachusetts Development Finance Agency (MassDevelopment)

Massachusetts Development Finance Agency's (MassDevelopment) Board of Directors (the Board) voted at its June 8, 2017, Board of Directors Meeting to adopt a Diverse Business Participation Program (the Program) for MassDevelopment's direct contracting. This Program encourages parties seeking contracts with MassDevelopment to use good faith efforts to include MBEs, WBEs, VBEs, and SDVOBEs. MassDevelopment refers to these four categories as Diverse Business Enterprises (DBEs).²¹

MassDevelopment's Program encourages DBE participation and measures such participation for yearly reports to the Board. MassDevelopment staff encourages DBE participation by providing all Requests for Proposal, Requests for Qualifications, and Invitations of Bids to the SDO, the Greater New England Minority Supplier Development Council, and the Center for Women & Enterprise for dissemination.

In FY2018, MassDevelopment worked to roll out the Program and track its "baseline" for future years and annual reporting to the Board. The baseline year annual report was a major undertaking and resulted through collaboration between the finance, legal/procurement and information technology divisions. In FY2018, 11% of MassDevelopment's total direct contracting was procured through a DBE vendor. While this was its baseline year, MassDevelopment acknowledged in its Board report that atypical capital improvement projects on its real estate assets accounted for a majority of the DBE spending in FY2018.

MassDevelopment used the same methodology as that used in FY2018 to determine its FY2019 reporting. MassDevelopment's total consolidated dollar spending on all vendors for FY2019 (the denominator of the percentage calculation) was \$15,402,035.²² MassDevelopment then identified (through cross-checking with the SDO database and through subsequent coding), all vendors eligible for inclusion in the Program. The total SDO certified, DBE vendor spending (the numerator) was determined to be \$944,145. Accordingly, 6.1% of MassDevelopment's total direct contracting was procured through a DBE vendor in FY2019. In addition,

MassDevelopment had a small percentage of non-certified DBE spending and those vendors are in the process of seeking or updating their SDO certifications.

Massachusetts Gaming Commission (MGC)

The Massachusetts Gaming Commission (MGC) has elected to follow 801 CMR 21.00, which governs the acquisition of all commodities and services by the Commonwealth executive agencies, including following OSD's guidelines regarding diversity spending. MGC posts bid opportunities on COMMBUYS and on MGC's website, in addition to engaging a company to enlarge the pool of diverse vendors to many of our Requests for Responses (RFRs).

In addition to the MGC's direct purchasing, it monitors the casino licensees in meeting their own supplier/vendor diversity goals and compliance with required diversity plans found on the MGC's Diversity Webpage. Both Plainridge Park Casino and MGM Springfield were fully operational during FY2019, and Encore Boston Harbor was in its final year of construction. MGC hosted monthly Access and Opportunity committee meetings and engaged a full-time project oversight manager to monitor construction diversity efforts. MGC also published the *Best Practices for Diversity in the Construction Industry* report highlighting practices used by the casinos, their contractors, and the MGC to exceed construction diversity goals. Oversight during operations involved quarterly diversity reporting, compliance audits and reviews, as well as working with community organizations to assist the casinos in sourcing diverse vendors. Each casino's progress reaching goals may be reviewed in the MGC's annual report on the MGC Reports and Publications Webpage.

Massachusetts Growth Capital Corporation (MGCC)

Massachusetts Growth Capital Corporation (MGCC) works to provide economic opportunities to MBEs, WBEs, and VBEs through financial services and technical assistance. In November 2015, MGCC launched the Diversity Goal Support Program to support private and public contracts. The goal of the program is to enable MBEs, WBEs, and VBEs to better compete for public contracts in Massachusetts. The program gives these firms the opportunity to access credit to meet up-front expenses in the awarding of a contract, helping to bridge the gap between the start of a project and when the business starts receiving payment from the client. In addition, MGCC will provide working capital loans and will work with customers to overcome obstacles in accessing capital.

MGCC communicates with statewide partners, including the Business Equity Initiative, the Center for Women & Enterprise, the Greater New England Minority Supplier Development Council, and the Massachusetts Minority Contractors Association, and the SDO to expand its reach to small and diverse suppliers. Program information, as well as further inclusive opportunities and initiatives supported by MGCC, may be found on MGCC's website.

Massachusetts Housing Finance Agency (MassHousing)

The Massachusetts Housing Finance Agency (MassHousing) continued its decades-long efforts to provide economic opportunities to Diverse Business Owners, not limited to Minority Businesses (MBEs) and Women Businesses (WBEs).

In FY2019, MassHousing spent nearly 7% of its operating budget with Diverse Business Owners. MassHousing also actively worked to engage VBEs at all levels of contracting and procurement.

MassHousing's developer borrowers must make good-faith efforts to hire MBE and WBE Business Owners along with a reflective workforce. The Agency negotiates and manages Equal Opportunity Construction Contracts with general contractors to establish MBE/WBE contracting opportunities, and partners with property management companies to ensure MBE/WBE vendor utilization goals are being met and that Fair Housing Marketing Plans are implemented.

In FY2019, of \$296 million in construction contracts awarded at MassHousing-financed developments, \$62 million (or approximately 21%) went to MBEs and \$23 million (or almost 8%) to WBEs. Of \$230.3 million spent on goods and services at MassHousing-financed rental housing, \$37.7 million (or approximately 16%) went to MBEs and \$27.2 million (or almost 12%) went to WBEs.

MassHousing's two annual trade fairs allow Diverse Business Owners (MBEs/WBEs/VBEs, and more) to showcase their goods and services to management companies, developers, general contractors, state procurement officers, housing-related businesses, and MassHousing staff. During FY2019 more than 80 Diverse Business Owners participated in these networking events. The Agency also offers Small Business Capacity Building Workshops to enhance the operational capabilities of MBEs/WBEs/VBEs. In FY2019, a match-making event connected a diverse pool of vendors with management and construction company representatives. As a result, those vendors obtained approximately \$370,000 in direct contracts.

MassHousing actively participates in trade fairs, conferences and workshops sponsored by public and non-profit organizations. Through <u>an interactive website</u>, the Agency provides outreach, technical assistance, information and semi-annual Business Opportunity Reports, which list potential work opportunities at housing developments throughout the Commonwealth. Massachusetts Port Authority (Massport)

Massachusetts Port Authority (Massport) is an independent public authority and is self-supporting. A recent report estimates that Massport contributes approximately \$22 billion a year in total economic impact. Massport is governed by a seven-member board appointed by the Governor. Six board members serve staggered seven-year terms, and one ex officio member is the Commonwealth's Secretary of Transportation.

During FY2019, Massport determined an overall diverse supplier goal of 2.54% for the purchase of goods and non-professional services, and achieved 4.3% diverse supplier participation, exceeding the goal by 1.76%. Massport's <u>Bids & Opportunities</u> webpage lists information on upcoming Request for Proposals and Bid Opportunities.

Massachusetts School Building Authority (MSBA)

The Massachusetts School Building Authority (MSBA) is a quasi-independent state authority that provides partial reimbursement grant funding for school construction projects that are participating in the MSBA's grant program. The MSBA is committed to developing and strengthening Minority- and Woman-Owned Business Enterprises (M/WBEs) and expanding equal opportunity in the primary and secondary industries affected by MSBA procurements for goods and services. The MSBA works in partnership with OSD's SDO to notify certified M/WBEs of upcoming MSBA procurements. Also, the MSBA strongly considers a respondent's intent to further the development of M/WBEs or the existence of a relationship which furthers these goals when evaluating responses to procurements. The MSBA publishes RFRs for open procurements on the MSBA's website and on COMMBUYS, where the MSBA welcomes M/WBEs to submit responses to these procurements.

Districts in the MSBA's grant program are independently responsible for following all state laws and state agency requirements that are outside of the MSBA's jurisdiction, including the participation goals for M/WBEs on MSBA-funded school construction projects. Indeed, the MSBA encourages districts to employ M/WBEs on school construction projects through language incorporated in the MSBA template contracts and procurement documents which details the requirements for M/WBEs on school construction projects pursuant to MGL c. 7C, § 6. Also, the MSBA requires Owner's Project Managers (OPMs) to monitor goals for hiring M/WBEs in the design and construction phases of a project in the OPM Monthly Reports that are submitted to the MSBA. The MSBA looks forward to continuing to partner with the SDO to enhance the MSBA's initiatives for promoting the hiring of M/WBEs on MSBA procurements and MSBA-funded school construction projects.

Massachusetts State College Building Authority (MSCBA)

The Massachusetts State College Building Authority (MSCBA) is responsible for financing, designing, constructing, and overseeing the management of residence halls and student activity facilities for the nine state universities and 15 community colleges. The MSCBA is committed to strengthening a diverse workforce within the Commonwealth. In addition to adopting the Commonwealth's diversity goals for hiring design and construction firms, the MSCBA continues to reach out to the subcontractor community by engaging MBEs, WBEs, and VBEs in a web-based, trade contractor prequalification process where they are awarded additional

credit toward prequalification. Notification of current opportunities are posted in the Central Register and at MSCBA Solicitations. The MSCBA encourages its contractors, project managers, and other business associates to actively recruit women and minorities for their workforce participation. Monthly review of the workforce data on all projects results in an open dialog, creates demand, and results in real job opportunities. Massachusetts Water Resources Authority (MWRA)

The Massachusetts Water Resources Authority's MBE/WBE/DBE Program ensures the equitable participation of Minority/Women/Disadvantaged Business Enterprises in the award of all contracts including contracts for construction, goods/non-professional services and professional services.

A quarterly report is generated on spending for MBE/WBE/DBEs, which includes construction, goods/non-professional services, and professional services contracts. These expenditures are presented to the MWRA's Board of Directors in the quarterly Orange Notebook Report on Key Indicators of MWRA Performance. The table below shows the MWRA's FY2019 Report.

University of Massachusetts (UMass) Organizations

During FY2019, UMass continued to expand its Supplier Diversity Program through its active participation in industry networking events and its status as a member of the Steering Committee for the State, as well as the Quasi-Public Agencies Supplier Diversity Committee. UMass also joined the Boston Chamber of Commerce Pacesetters Initiative, which prioritizes the creation of opportunities for local, ethnic minority-owned companies.

Goods and Services: UMass Systems Office

The UMass Procurement team has implemented automated online bidding to help vendors more easily identify opportunities and respond to invitations to bid. The team also is working to standardize bid documents to streamline the process for submission of bids. The Request for Proposals documents may be accessed at the UMass Procurement Portal.

Construction: University of Massachusetts Building Authority (UMBA)

The University of Massachusetts Building Authority (UMBA) is a distinct, public organization with a mission to build and renovate facilities on behalf of the University of Massachusetts. UMBA has a robust Minority and Women-Owned Business Enterprise (M/WBE) and workforce participation compliance program guided by a policy under which 17.9% of design contracts and 10.4% of construction contracts are awarded to M/WBE firms. UMBA also pursues representative participation of M/WBE firms for professional services, project managers, suppliers, and commissioning contracts.

UMBA works closely with architectural firms, general contractors, construction managers, and subcontractors to achieve, and in many cases, exceed the compliance goals related to MBE/WBE. In an effort to promote best practices and to expand the impact of its compliance efforts, UMBA has established regional Design & Construction Compliance Initiatives. These working groups meet regularly with construction managers, building trades, and community groups to assist contractors and subcontractors with the hiring of MBE/WBE firms. In these efforts, UMBA continues to work in collaboration with state and municipal agencies, as well as private development firms, to promote the opportunities available for M/WBE firms to contract on capital projects.

Quantitatively, approximately 15% of UMBA's annual capital spending is paid out to M/WBE firms. In FY2018 and FY2019 this equated to \$43.1 million and \$26.4 million, respectively.
