I am pleased to present the Supplier Diversity Office's (SDO) Comprehensive Annual Report for Fiscal Year 2022 (FY2022), which also includes narrative descriptions of supplier diversity programs and/or results from 14 Commonwealth of Massachusetts quasi-public/non-executive organizations.

The SDO became a separate state agency under the Executive Office for Administration and Finance in 2021, a change which elevated the SDO to an oversight agency and codified SDO programs and certification categories. This change and the issuance of Executive Order 599 on June 24, 2022 strengthened the SDO's ability to carry out its important mission of promoting diversity in state contracting and increased opportunities for underrepresented businesses.

Consistent with the directives in MGL c. 7, §§ 61 and Executive Order 599, the SDO provides certification, programs, training services, and access to business opportunities and resources for Minority (MBE); Women (WBE); Veteran (VBE); Service-Disabled Veteran (SDVOBE); Disability (DOBE); and Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual, and Transgender (LGBTBE) owned businesses, as well as small Massachusetts businesses. The accompanying report includes information about the Commonwealth's diverse and small business programs, including the Certification, Supplier Diversity (SDP), Small Business Purchasing (SBPP), Affirmative Marketing, and Individuals with Disabilities programs.

I am pleased to provide the following highlights from the attached SDO FY2022 Annual Report:

- **Growth in total diverse spending.** The Commonwealth spent approximately \$3.26 billion with diverse and small businesses (a 15% increase over FY2021), which includes discretionary (or program) spending of approximately \$2.12 billion (a 13.5% increase over FY2021) and nondiscretionary (or non-program) spending of approximately \$1.15 billion (a 16.8% increase over FY2021).
- **Growth in spending by category.** In FY2022, discretionary spending grew in the MBE, WBE, SBPP, DOBE and LGBTBE categories by 26.4%, 11.6%, 13.5%, 24% and 76.6% respectively compared to the prior year. Spending with veteran-owned businesses declined by approximately 40% in large part due to changes in spending on two large Commonwealth construction projects.
- **Benchmark performance.** Program participants exceeded spending benchmarks for MBE, WBE, and SBPP by 13.5%, 41.2%, and 34.6%, respectively. The Commonwealth continued its efforts to meet its ambitious veteran-owned business benchmark. Although three Executive Branch secretariats and one constitutional office exceeded their veteran goals, additional vendor capacity is needed to meet the benchmark and make veteran spending stable year over year.

- Spending by race/ethnicity. We are pleased to report that, in FY2022, MBE spending by executive departments and other agencies participating in the Supplier Diversity Program grew by \$74.8 million, or 14.8%. Within the MBE category, we saw growth in most race and ethnicity categories, especially with Black, Hispanic/Latino, Asian American (Subcontinent), and Native American businesses. Spending with these business groups increased by 25%, 38.8%, 64.4%, and 95% respectively when compared to FY2021. For example, spending with Black businesses grew by nearly \$23 million, and spending with Hispanic/Latino businesses increased by more than \$16 million.
- Number of business relationships. The number of diverse and small companies with which the
 Commonwealth conducted business directly and number of diverse businesses doing business with
 Commonwealth contractors continued to grow. The SDO recorded an increase of 4% in the number
 of diverse and small companies doing business with the state directly and a 1% increase in the number
 of diverse businesses listed as supplier diversity partners by Commonwealth contractors.
- Number of certified and recognized businesses. The number of businesses certified and recognized by the SDO increased in all categories with the exception of Portuguese Business Enterprises. The SDO added 436 new diverse businesses to its directory (an 11% increase over FY2021), including 177 new MBEs, 93 new WBEs, 31 new disability-owned businesses, 62 new veteran-owned and service-disabled veteran-owned businesses, and 165 new LGBT-owned businesses.
- **New training program.** In FY2022, the SDO launched a robust training program addressing the needs of diverse and small bidders, prime contractors, executive agencies, and other public purchasers. In the four months since its establishment, the program developed two brand-new webinars and held 19 training sessions attended by more than 300 vendors and buyers. The SDO also increased its precertification webinar program and trained 1,572 representatives of diverse businesses interested in certification, a 22% increase compared to FY2021.
- Increased compliance efforts. In FY2022, the SDO developed and staffed a compliance program to ensure the integrity of the diverse and small business programs and to monitor certification, contractor, and agency compliance. The new unit's expanded Spending Compliance Verification program engaged 190 diverse businesses to verify 269 spending reports submitted by prime contractors. The program verified \$197 million in reported spending, a 62% increase compared to FY2021.
- Policy implementation. In FY2022, the SDO assisted executive agencies in the implementation of a broad range of supplier diversity policy reforms announced in June 2021. These reforms included a dramatic expansion of the Small Business Purchasing Program, an increase of the minimum percentage of bid evaluation points assigned to SDP Plans, a new requirement to ensure small and diverse business participation in requests for quotes (RFQs) on existing contracts, and many other measures. To ensure effective implementation, the SDO held training and listening sessions, assisted individual agencies, and developed and issued guidance and standard contract language in partnership with the Massachusetts Operational Services Division (OSD).
- "SDO Means Business" campaign. The SDO implemented a focused, intentional approach to promote
 opportunities for diverse and small businesses by creating our "SDO Means Business" campaign. The
 program looked to connect diverse and small businesses to business opportunities, helpful training
 resources, as well as financial and technical tools and institutions that could make a positive impact.
- **SDO Advertising Campaign.** The SDO engaged a certified diverse marketing and communications firm to create and implement a public awareness campaign aimed at promoting SDO services to businesses interested in certification and Commonwealth bidding opportunities.
- **Expanded outreach.** Complementing its marketing efforts, the SDO attended 43 public in-person and virtual events. Many of the events featured an SDO representative speaking about its programs and

- the Commonwealth's business opportunities. The SDO also rebranded its monthly newsletter, *Pathways and Connections*, to include news and upcoming events from the SDO and its partners.
- Building state-of-the art IT infrastructure. As a new state agency, the SDO undertook to improve existing and develop new IT resources to connect small and diverse companies with business opportunities. These efforts included procuring and configuring the first of its kind Supplier Diversity Hub (the Hub), which brings together diverse businesses, prime bidders, contractors, and buyers to form partnerships, promote procurements, and report spending. The SDO also facilitated an upgrade to the COMMBUYS eProcurement system to make small and diverse businesses stand out to buyers at the time of placing an order or requesting a quote. Finally, the SDO upgraded its Certrak certification system to make it easier to find diverse businesses and process and renew certifications.

We look forward to continuing to promote diversity, equity, and inclusion in state procurement and contracting by certifying diverse and small Massachusetts businesses and connecting them with business opportunities and the resources they need to succeed.

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Introduction

This report and the executive summary of SDO accomplishments provided in the attached transmittal letter provide an overview of the FY2022 activities and accomplishments of the Supplier Diversity Office (SDO) and presents comprehensive information on diverse and small business spending across the wide range of Commonwealth departments and quasi-public organizations and their programs.

SDO Overview

The Commonwealth of Massachusetts spends nearly \$6.5 billion each year on goods, services, and construction. The role of the SDO is to certify, provide resources for, and support a wide range of diverse and small businesses in competing for contracts being bid across the Commonwealth. The state's diversity programs include firms certified as Minority¹ (MBE); Women (WBE); Veteran (VBE); Service-Disabled Veteran (SDVOBE); Disability (DOBE); and Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual, and Transgender (LGBTBE) Owned Business Enterprises.² The SDO works to build a more inclusive supplier base for the Commonwealth through the following programs:

- State Certification Program
- Supplier Diversity Program (SDP)
- Small Business Purchasing Program (SBPP)
- Commonwealth and Municipal Construction Affirmative Marketing Programs (MCAMP)
- Individuals with Disabilities in State Procurement and Contracting Program

¹ The term Minority Business Enterprise or MBE is defined in statute as a business that is owned by a racially or ethnically diverse individual. While the terms Minority and MBE are meant to define an ethnically or racially diverse individual or business respectively, they are not meant to denote a smaller or lesser status of the individuals or businesses included in this definition.

² The SDO's State Certification Unit reviews applications for certification as MBE, WBE, Portuguese-Owned Business Enterprises (PBE), and combinations thereof, as well as Minority (M/NPO), Women (W/NPO), and Veteran (V/NPO) Nonprofit Organizations. The SDO also accepts certifications issued by recognized third-party certifying organizations for MBE, WBE, VBE, SDVOBE, DOBE, and LGBTBE business enterprises. While the SDO does certify PBEs, there are limited opportunities for PBEs to participate in the state's diversity programs as described in 425 CMR 2.02.

Since being elevated to an oversight executive agency in 2021, the SDO has taken on a new role and structure, including the authority to oversee the state's diversity programs and assist diverse and small businesses in the public procurement process as well as in growing their businesses. In FY2022, the SDO has made it possible to go from "intention to impact" with the following hirings, initiatives, and technological advancements:

New Hires and Capabilities

FY2022 saw the SDO expand its staff and offerings to our vendor partners. In this year, we added a Compliance unit (with a Director of Compliance), a Marketing and Communications unit (with a Director of Marketing and Communications), a dedicated Training and Policy Coordinator, and a Construction and Persons with Disabilities Program Coordinator. These positions are essential for the SDO to fulfill its mission of bringing fairness to the state bidding process.

Executive Order 599


In FY2022, Massachusetts leadership issued Executive Order 599, which repealed and consolidated Executive Orders 523 (regarding the SBPP) and 565 (regarding the SDP). This Executive Order:

- Formally moved administration and oversight of the state's supplier diversity program, small business purchasing program, and related initiatives to the SDO;
- Created the 15-person SDO Diverse and Small Business Advisory Board, which will guide and advise the SDO in fulfilling its mission to promote equity and fairness in state contracting;
- Formalized the appointment of Secretariat and Agency Supplier Diversity Officers;
- Directed the SDO to expand outreach to other public entities in all areas of public procurement, contracting, and other public sector commerce, including providing access to resources to help eliminate barriers such as access to capital, training and technical assistance programs; and
- Formalized the creation of the SDO's compliance unit to ensure the integrity of SDO programs.

SDO Advertising Campaign

To raise awareness of the SDO and the various programs we offer for diverse and small businesses, the department started a statewide advertising campaign. The SDO worked with Archipelago Strategies Group (ASG), which is certified as an MBE, WBE and LGBTBE. Together, we created a campaign covering local signage, a far-reaching media buy, a 30-second radio ad, and a digital campaign.

To highlight the SDO's services during this campaign, ASG created a media buy schedule that included a mix of platforms to create brand recognition and to connect the community with necessary services. The mix of outlets allowed for the campaign to be seen and heard in eight different languages (Amharic, Haitian Creole, Khmer, Portuguese, Simplified Chinese, Spanish, Vietnamese, and English). In total, the media buy created a campaign with an estimated 5.8 million impressions.

The digital component used Google ads and drove people to an SDO landing page to collect email addresses to be used in an email strategy also run by ASG. The digital campaign created nearly 90,000 impressions during its eight-week run.

The campaign results were encouraging, as visits to the SDO website went up 26% from the previous months. Furthermore, the digital campaign produced a click-through rate five times the industry average.

"SDO Means Business"

To ensure the SDO fulfills its mission to bring equality and equity to the Commonwealth's bidding process, the SDO works with a mindset of "intent to impact," providing resources and tools to eliminate barriers and uplift

diverse and small businesses. To this end, the SDO's website has a <u>specific page</u> dedicated to tools and resources for diverse and small businesses, such as:

In the first few months of this campaign, the SDO successfully assisted in increasing the representation of SDO-certified diverse and/or small businesses on OSD's statewide contract number PRF76 for Management Consultants, Program Coordinators and Planners Services.

The Supplier Diversity Hub

The future of fairness and equity in state contracting will also become simpler due to new technology being rolled out by the SDO. The SDO's Supplier Diversity Hub ("The Hub") was procured, developed, tested and launched in 2022, and offers matchmaking of diverse and small businesses to prime contractors, agencies, cities and towns, and technical and financial assistance providers. The Hub also enables state department and contractors to track their own compliance with state-set benchmarks.

We expect The Hub to be widely used by everyone involved in the state bidding process, as it can do everything from finding relevant vendors in a geographic area to keeping track of diverse spending to ensuring your certification is up-to-date. We anticipate more tools and functions to be added to The Hub in the near future.

State Certification Program

One of the SDO's primary services is to certify diverse and small businesses for participation in Massachusetts statewide and departmental procurements for goods and services, as well as departmental and municipal non-federally funded construction procurements³. Each week, new businesses are certified, some businesses are decertified, and some businesses withdraw their applications. Therefore, the exact number of certified businesses fluctuates.

In FY2022, the total number of certified diverse firms available to do business with the Commonwealth and its prime contractors increased to 4,520 (an 11% increase over FY2021). These numbers are represented in the Diverse Businesses in the SDO directory table below.

State Certification

The SDO's State Certification Unit accepts applications, conducts investigations and site visits, and issues SDO certifications for MBE, WBE, VBE, PBE, and combinations thereof, as well as Minority (M/NPO), Women (W/NPO), and Veteran Nonprofit Organizations (V/NPO)⁵. At the end of FY2022, there was a total of 3,549 SDO-certified businesses (3,397 for-profit and 152 non-profit firms), some of which were certified as both minority-and women-owned/controlled (M/WBE and M/W/NPO). The total number of businesses that were certified by the SDO's state certification program increased by 2.7% compared to those in FY2021.

³ The SDO's supplier diversity certification is distinct from DCAMM certification for prime, small prime, and filed sub-bidders. The latter is focused on construction-related criteria, such as years in business, completed projects, project value, and project evaluation. The SDO's diverse and small business certification is also distinct from the federal Disadvantaged Business Enterprise (DBE) certification conducted by the Massachusetts Department of Transportation (MassDOT) for participation in the federal Unified Certification Program (UCP), which was established for all recipients and individuals seeking to do business with transportation agencies as DBEs.

⁴ This line accounts for vendors that fall into more than one certification category and is not a sum of the lines above it.

⁵ The SDO issues Minority, Women and Veteran Nonprofit Organization (M/NPO, W/NPO and V/NPO) certifications to tax-exempt non-profit organizations that meet the following requirements: (1) at least 51% of the organization's Board of Directors and Voting Membership must be women, members of a minority group and/or veterans; (2) the same Board of Directors and Voting Membership must control the NPO's daily and long-term operations; (3) the organization must be regularly and actively engaged in business activity; and (4) the organization cannot be dependent upon or influenced by another non-eligible person or organization.

In FY2022, the number of certified for-profit MBEs increased in most ethnicity categories, except for the Native American category, which decreased by 6%, Cape Verdean, which decreased by 3%, and the Portuguese category, which decreased by 31%.⁷ The number of PBEs decreased as a result of a change in SDO's regulations which allowed Brazilian-owned businesses to become certified as MBEs.

Third-Party Certification Recognition

In addition to offering its own certification services, the SDO recognizes and accepts certifications issued by third-party partner organizations, namely MBE and WBE certifications issued by the City of Boston, MBE certifications issued by the Greater New England Supplier Development Council (GNEMSDC), WBE certifications issued by the Center for Women and Enterprise (New England WBENC), VBE and SDVOBE certifications issued by VetBiz/U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs, SDVOBE and DOBE certifications issued by Disability:IN, and LGBTBE certifications issued by the National LGBT Chamber of Commerce (NGLCC).

Ongoing Certification Program Activities

In FY2022, the SDO's State Certification Unit processed new applications and conducted triennial renewals and administrative reviews of existing applications.

- **New applications.** The SDO reviewed a total of 428 new applications for state MBE, WBE, and VBE certifications (5% more than in the prior fiscal year), including non-profit applications.
- Certification renewals & administrative reviews. The SDO maintained the accuracy of existing certifications by conducting 339 certification renewals and 50 administrative reviews.⁹

⁸ Certification Renewals were lower in FY2022 as a result of: (1) the number of businesses to be renewed each year varies since implementing a 3-year certification term; and (2) the SDO decertified certain businesses that went out of business during the pandemic and were not responsive to SDO's multiple attempts to renew their certification.

⁹ Administrative reviews are performed when a certified company changes its business structure, name, scope of products/services offered, or if other material changes take place.

Overview of Diverse and Small Business Spending

In FY2022, the Commonwealth spent more than \$3.3 billion with diverse and small businesses (a 15% increase when compared to FY2021), which occurred in two areas:

- Discretionary (program) spending, which represented 65% of diverse and small business spending
- Non-discretionary (non-program) spending, which accounted for 35% of diverse and small business expenditures.

The following sections measure program success against benchmarks established for each program administered by the Supplier Diversity Office. Consistent with previous SDO reports, this analysis includes combined achievements of all supplier diversity programs that exist in participating organizations through the lens of SDP and SBPP benchmarks organized by business category – MBE, WBE, Veterans, and SBPP.¹⁰

Discretionary Spending with Diverse and Small Businesses

The SDO's programs focus on discretionary spending for goods, services, construction, and design, which result from competitively procured contracts. ¹¹ The SDO's programs use policy, benchmark-setting, coordination, training, compliance, and recognition of excellence to ensure the participation of diverse and small businesses in these areas of procurement.

In FY2022, organizations participating in the Supplier Diversity, Small Business Purchasing, and Affirmative Marketing programs, as well as municipalities participating in the Municipal Construction Affirmative Marketing Program (MCAMP), increased diversity spending by approximately 13.5% to more than \$2.1 billion.

¹⁰ For example, under DCAMM's Affirmative Marketing Program (AMP) established under MGL c. 7C, § 6 for construction and design projects, MBE and WBE business participation goals are established consistent with DCAMM's current Disparity Study. ¹¹ Consistent with previous SDO annual reports, this analysis includes combined achievements of all supplier diversity programs that exist in participating organizations and use SDO-certified businesses. While the SDP and SBPP address goods and services, MGL c. 7C, § 6 and MGL c. 7, § 61 charge DCAMM and the SDO with establishing MBE and WBE participation goals for capital facility projects under DCAMM's control and state-assisted municipal building projects under SDO's oversight. This report includes spending data for DCAMM's construction projects available at the time of the report's publication. Final information on DCAMM's Affirmative Marketing Program efforts is published as a separate report issued by DCAMM's Office of Access and Opportunity. Commonwealth departments, including MassDOT, manage their own supplier diversity or affirmative marketing programs addressing construction, relying on the SDO's certification services and setting their own supplier diversity goals or using those established by the SDO and DCAMM.

Discretionary spending grew in nearly all business categories in FY2022 over FY2021. Spending with veteran businesses (VBE/SDVOBE) continued to fluctuate as it depended on a relatively small number of contractor relationships.¹³

Number of Diverse and Small Businesses Receiving Direct and Indirect Discretionary Payments

The SDO continues to track the number of diverse and small businesses with which the Commonwealth conducted business directly as well as the number of diverse businesses which Commonwealth contractors reported as their Supplier Diversity Program (SDP) Partners, which resulted in indirect spending.¹⁴ In FY2022, the Commonwealth increased the number of diverse and small companies it did business with by 55, or 4%, compared to the prior year. The number of Commonwealth contractors' diverse partners increased by seven companies, or 1%, compared to FY2021.

Non-Discretionary Spending with Diverse and Small Businesses

The Commonwealth makes pension and insurance-related expenditures, awards grants and subsidies, manages entitlement programs, and maintains loans and special payments, which are considered non-discretionary spending. While the Commonwealth's supplier diversity programs do not apply to these non-discretionary areas of spending, diverse and small businesses are part of that marketplace, and so the SDO also tracks this spending.

In FY2022, combined non-discretionary direct expenditures totaled more than \$1.1 billion, representing a 16.8% increase when compared to the prior fiscal year. While most of this spending is the Commonwealth's direct

expenditures, indirect spending in this category was also reported by the Group Insurance Commission (GIC), the Division of Capital Asset Management and Maintenance (DCAMM), and the Department of Correction (DOC), which voluntarily includes supplier diversity provisions in non-discretionary contracts.

The SDO does not set policies for or direct non-discretionary spending, but it continues to promote such opportunities to our diverse and small businesses and track such spending and, whenever possible, to advocate for vendors doing business in this category to become certified and establish supplier diversity partnerships. While the MBE spending in this category increased significantly, spending in all other categories declined compared to FY2021, which may be related to post-COVID changes in Commonwealth spending.

Total Spending with Diverse and Small Businesses

Total discretionary and non-discretionary spending with diverse and small businesses in FY2022 increased in all business categories with the exception of veteran business spending. Overall, spending across all supplier diversity categories grew by more than \$400 million, or 14.64%, compared to FY2021.

Supplier Diversity Program (SDP)

The SDP is established through MGL c. 7, § 58 and § 61 and Executive Order 599 to promote equity of opportunity in the state procurement and contracting process. The SDP applies to all executive department procurements for goods and services with annual values exceeding \$250,000. The program institutes policies to encourage participating organizations and their contractors to use SDO-certified MBEs, WBEs, VBEs, SDVOBEs, DOBEs, and LGBTBEs in their contracts for goods and services. In consultation with the Governor's Office for Access and Opportunity, the SDO sets annual benchmark goals for specific certification categories. These goals are expressed as a percentage of each participating organization's discretionary budget. In FY2022, the SDP spending benchmarks were set as follows:

Currently, 73 organizations participate in the SDP, falling into one of three groups:

- Executive branch departments in all secretariats
- Non-executive departments and constitutional offices (such as the Office of the Governor, the Massachusetts Gaming Commission, the Massachusetts Commission Against Discrimination, and the Disabled Persons Protection Commission)
- Quasi-public entities (such as the Massachusetts Convention Center Authority and the Massachusetts Housing Finance Agency)

Only executive departments are required to participate in the SDO's procurement programs, which include the SDP and the SBPP. Through SDO's continued collaboration and outreach, an additional 17 non-executive departments, constitutional offices or quasi-public organizations participate in the SDP only and do so voluntarily. For quasi-public organizations, the degree of adherence to the SDO's program rules and participation in this report varies:

- Six non-executive, constitutional or quasi-public organizations fully participate in the SDP with goal-setting, tracking, and reporting consistent with procedures used by executive branch departments:
 - Office of the Governor
 - Massachusetts Commission Against Discrimination
 - Disabled Persons Protection Commission
 - Massachusetts Convention Center Authority (MCCA)
 - Massachusetts Gaming Commission (MGC)
 - MassHousing
- An additional 11 quasi-public organizations submit narrative program reports for inclusion in the report:
 - Cannabis Control Commission
 - Commonwealth Corporation
 - Massachusetts Growth Capital Corporation (MGCC)
 - Massachusetts Water Resources Authority (MWRA)
 - Massachusetts School Building Authority (MSBA)
 - Massachusetts State College Building Authority (MSCBA)

- MassDevelopment
- Massport
- Office of the Inspector General
- UMass Building Authority (UMBA)
- University of Massachusetts (UMass)

Participating organizations may use two types of spending to achieve program spending goals:

- Direct spending with MBE, WBE, VBE, SDVOBE, DOBE, and LGBTBE prime contractors
- Indirect spending resulting from business partnerships between the organizations' contractors and MBE, WBE, VBE, SDVOBE, DOBE, or LGBTBE vendors used in the contractors' operations. This includes subcontracting, as well as other types of business-to-business relationships.¹⁷

Indirect spending can be further subdivided into the following types: 18

- **Subcontracting**, defined as a partnership in which the SDP partner is involved in the provision of products and/or services to the Commonwealth. Such relationships typically, but not always, involve a formal written agreement between the SDP partner and the prime contractor.
- Ancillary Products and Services, defined as a business relationship in which the SDP partner provides the prime contractor products or services that are not directly related to the prime contractor's contract with the Commonwealth (such as maintenance or office supply services). In most cases, this type of partnership is related to the prime contractor's general business operations and may or may not involve a formal written agreement with the SDP partner. It is also recognized that, in some cases, products and/or services provided by the SDP partner may contribute to both subcontracting (when used by the Commonwealth) and ancillary (when used by other customers) spending.

The SDO obtains information about direct spending with certified contractors from the Commonwealth Information Warehouse (CIW), a repository of the Commonwealth's financial transactions. Indirect spending is reported to agencies by their contractors and then compiled and submitted to the SDO.¹⁹ Quasi-public organizations monitor supplier diversity spending internally and submit their direct and indirect expenditure information to the SDO for analysis and publication.

Minority-Owned Business Enterprise (MBE) Spending

The 8% benchmark for MBE spending was exceeded by 13.50% in FY2022, which means that program participants spent approximately 9.1% of their discretionary budgets with minority-owned businesses.

Combined Veteran-Owned Business Spending

The Commonwealth continues to pursue the challenging goal of spending 3% of its discretionary budget with veteran-owned (combined VBE and SDVOBE) businesses. While significant progress has been made toward this goal since it was established in FY2015, and three secretariats and one non-executive department exceeded this goal in FY2022, the Commonwealth has not yet attained this benchmark.

In FY2022, the Commonwealth's overall spending with veteran-owned businesses decreased by \$25.6 million, or 40%, compared to the prior year. The change is due to the relatively small number of veteran-owned companies currently doing business with the Commonwealth. As a consequence, changes in spending with individual businesses (e.g. project commencements and completions and non-recurring purchases) have a significant impact on overall spending.

Specifically, in FY2021, DCAMM spent \$26.7 million on a construction project performed by Commodore Builders Corporation. In FY2022, spending on this project decreased to \$15 million. Similarly, State Police completed a \$1.4 million project with APC Development Group, Inc. and, consequently, spent less than \$40,000 with the contractor in FY2022. These changes in individual vendor expenditures account for more than 50% of the reduction in veteran spending.

To address this issue and continue our efforts to meet the veteran spending benchmark, the SDO has

implemented outreach and training measures focused on increasing the number of certified and recognized veteran businesses as well as the number of veteran businesses doing business with the Commonwealth, including outreach to national and regional veteran organizations.

Disability and LGBTBE Spending

DOBE and LGBTBE are the newest categories to be included in the SDP, and the SDO continued to focus on developing contractor capacity in those two categories. Similar to spending with veteran-owned businesses, significant changes in expenditures shown in both categories are due to the relatively small number of contractors currently engaged.

In FY2022, spending in the disability-owned business category increased by approximately \$3 million, or 24.06%, compared to FY2021 while spending with LGBT businesses increased by \$4.2 million, or 76.62%.

The Small Business Purchasing Program (SBPP)²⁰ was established in 2010 through Executive Order 523 and reaffirmed in 2021 and 2022 through MGL c. 7, §§ 58 and 61 and Executive Order 599 to direct state spending for non-construction goods and services to participating Massachusetts small businesses. This program applies to executive department procurements with annual values equal to or less than \$250,000.²¹

Small Business Registration

In FY2022, COMMBUYS continued to provide automated registration of small businesses. Similar to the state certification program, some businesses joined the program, while the SBPP participation of others expired. Overall, the program experienced a 13.66% increase in the number of verified businesses compared to FY2021.

Small Business Purchasing Program (SBPP) Spending

Only the Commonwealth executive and non-executive departments participate in the SBPP, which has a 3.3% benchmark for discretionary spending. Total SBPP spending in FY2022 exceeded the benchmark by more than 34.6%, with program participants spending approximately 4.4% of their discretionary budgets with COMMBUYS-verified small businesses.

MBE Spending by Race and Ethnicity

In the process of certifying MBEs, the SDO collects information on the race and ethnicity of the owner(s) in order to establish the business's eligibility for certification. Similarly, data on race and ethnicity of boards and voting bodies of M/NPOs are collected. Race and ethnicity information is considered confidential and is not published. In the same vein, the Commonwealth's supplier diversity policies treat all MBEs and M/NPOs as one group and do not provide individual business owner race and ethnicity information for procurement decision-making.

While this information on individual businesses is not available to buyers, the SDO is providing the following aggregated information on the Commonwealth's direct and indirect spending by race and ethnicity. This is the third year that the SDO is reporting this information in our annual report.

Client health and social services (also known as Purchase of Service, or POS) provided by M/NPOs accounted for 39% of the Commonwealth's direct MBE spending in FY2022, which is a reduction from FY2021 when this represented 42% of the Commonwealth's MBE spending. These expenditures are shown in the table as spending with multiple races and ethnicities because M/NPO certification is based on the races and ethnicities of multiple individuals comprising the non-profit organization's board and/or voting body.²² The vast majority of these expenditures are direct payments by Commonwealth departments to certified minority-led non-profit organizations for providing health and human services to individuals across the state.

In FY2022, expenditures with companies with African-American/Black owners accounted for 19.51% of the total MBE spending, which represented 32.5% of the MBE spending with for-profit organizations. The amount spent with African-American/Black businesses increased by 25% compared to FY2021. Businesses owned by Asian American (Subcontinent) individuals accounted for 16.8% of the Commonwealth total MBE spending (approximately 28% of the MBE spending with for-profits), and the amount spent in FY2022 increased by 68% compared to the prior year.

Asian American (Pacific)-owned businesses earned 12.3% of the total MBE spending (20.5% of the MBE spending with for-profits), and spending with these businesses decreased by 19% in comparison with FY2021. Companies with Hispanic/Latino ownership represented approximately 10% of the Commonwealth's total MBE spending (16.62% of MBE for-profit spending), and the total amount of spending with these businesses grew by 38.76%. Cape Verdean and Native American businesses accounted for 1.21% and 0.33% of the Commonwealth minority spending respectively (2.02% and 0.56% of the Commonwealth's MBE spending with for-profit businesses). Spending with Cape Verdean businesses decreased by 21% while spending with Native American-owned businesses nearly doubled compared to FY2021.

Indirect Spending by Type (Subcontracting and Ancillary Products and Services)

The SDO's programs recognize two types of indirect spending: Subcontracting, and Ancillary Products and Services. This report is the second to provide information on indirect spending by type of business relationship. While the SDO reviews the business relationship information reported by contractors, it is the Commonwealth contractor's responsibility to accurately classify the nature of the business relationship with their supplier diversity partners.

In FY2022, approximately 61% of all indirect spending fell into the subcontracting category, most of which occurred in construction. The remaining 39% represented supplier diversity spending on ancillary products and services. Indirect spending increased in all categories with the exception of veteran spending, which was addressed in the Supplier Diversity Program section of this report.

Municipal Construction Affirmative Marketing Programs (MCAMP)

The Municipal Construction Affirmative Marketing Program (MCAMP) was established for the purpose of ensuring the fair participation of minority-owned and women-owned businesses on state-assisted building projects. The SDO, in consultation with DCAMM, is charged with establishing MBE and WBE participation goals for state-funded municipal construction contracts.

The mission of the MCAMP (formerly known as the Construction Reform Program) is to educate, monitor, and assist municipalities in the attainment and enforcement of MBE/WBE participation goals for the design and construction phases of municipal projects.

Prior to FY2021, MCAMP combined the MBE and WBE goals to provide designers and contractors with flexibility in utilizing SDO-certified MBE and/or WBE contractors on state-assisted vertical construction projects. The combined MBE and WBE goal percentage was 17.9% for design and 10.4% for Construction.²⁴

Effective July 1, 2020, based on the results of the DCAMM disparity study, in addition to annual AMP program goals, project-specific MBE and WBE goals were set for individual state vertical construction projects conducted by DCAMM. This ensures more realistic MBE and WBE goals for individual projects based on construction trades and geographic availability.

In its construction project goal setting, MCAMP continued to utilize the annual MBE and WBE goals consistent with the DCAMM disparity study. The following annual goals were used in FY2022:²⁵

- Design MBE 6.6% and WBE 15%
- Construction MBE 4.2% and WBE 8.8%

Massachusetts School Building Authority (MSBA) Spending

The Massachusetts School Building Authority (MSBA) funds nearly 100% of the projects that fall under MCAMP. As a result, the SDO tracks their projects exclusively and serves as a resource for promoting these projects and on policy and process related to the implementation of MCAMP by municipalities. However, individual municipal recipients of MSBA funds make the final decisions regarding project MBE/WBE utilization goals for school construction projects.

The chart below compares FY2021 and FY2022 MBE and WBE spending on MSBA projects based on notices to proceed issued each year. The total combined MBE/WBE spending in FY2022 exceeded \$125 million, which represents an increase of nearly \$47 million, or 60%, when compared to the prior fiscal year.

The MBE construction participation level in FY2022 was 11.64%, which exceeded the 4.2% goal by 7.44%. The WBE construction participation level was 8.33%, which fell just below the 8.8% goal by 0.17%.

Individuals with Disabilities in State Procurement and Contracting Program

Pursuant to <u>Section 4 of Chapter 219 of the Acts of 2016</u> and <u>Section 88 of Chapter 154 of the Acts of 2018</u>, the SDO, in collaboration with the <u>Massachusetts Office on Disability</u> (MOD), established the SDO Individuals with Disabilities Program with the following goals, which are updated every two years. This report provides an update on the following goals established for FY2022/2023:

Goal #1: Expand inclusion of Disability-Owned Business Enterprises (DOBE) and Service-Disabled Veteran-Owned Business Enterprises (SDVOBE). In FY2022, the SDO continued the following initiatives in pursuit of this goal:

- The SDO continues its partnership with Disability:IN, Work Without Limits, the Employment Advocacy Committee, and the VeteransBusiness Outreach Center (VBOC) to promote SDO programs to disabilityowned businesses.
- In FY2022, the total number of certified disability-owned businesses recognized by the SDO grew from 230 to 308, a 34% increase.

Goal #2: Transform and expand the SDO Individuals with Disabilities Pilot Program into an Ongoing Program.

The SDO maintained the Pilot Program with two statewide contracts and one departmental contract. A total of 38 contractors, ranging from large national and international companies to small local businesses, participated in the Pilot Program in FY2022. Out of those, 17 contractors reported maintaining a voluntary and confidential self-identification process for individuals with disabilities.

Disability employment statistics were available from 14 contractors employing a combined 52,000 individuals. These contractors employed 1,345 individuals with disabilities, seven of whom were directly involved in providing services to the Commonwealth of Massachusetts. Contractors reported making 21 employment offers to individuals with disabilities over the reporting period. Disability employment percentages varied by contract and averaged 2.5% across those contractors that reported their disability employment levels.

In their annual updates, all responding businesses restated their commitment to the Pilot Program, and many added that the COVID pandemic affected their ability to recruit and retain workforce, including individuals with disabilities. The SDO will work more closely with pilot program participants to increase the recruitment, employment, retention, and promotion of individuals with disabilities on statewide and departmental contracts.

Goal #3: Further develop the program webpage with resources and tools for employers and individuals with disabilities seeking employment. Following the establishment of the SDO as a standalone Commonwealth agency, the agency migrated, reorganized, and revised all program webpages and information. The new webpage, Learn about SDO's Individuals with Disabilities Program includes program background information, tools, and resources for employees, and Commonwealth resources and tools for job seekers with disabilities.

Enhanced program staffing. In FY2022, the SDO established and filled a new position whose responsibilities include the management of the Individuals with Disabilities Program. The newly-established position of the Construction and Persons with Disabilities Program Coordinator covers such aspects of the program as program goal setting, education, partnerships, data collection, and assistance to Pilot participants.

With the hiring of the Construction and Persons with Disabilities Program Coordinator, the SDO has expanded its efforts to support persons with disabilities in the workforce. The SDO will continue to work closely with the MOD and MRC to coordinate presentations for Prime Contractors on hiring, retaining, and promoting persons with disabilities.

The SDO also looks forward to continuing its work with its other program partners, including the Employment Advocacy Committee²⁷, Work Without Limits, Disabilty:IN, the Veterans Business Outreach Center (VBOC), and other interested parties in promoting inclusion and opportunities for individuals with disabilities. As always, the main goal of the SDO is to help create a workforce and contractor pool that reflect the diversity of the citizens of the Commonwealth.

Program Outreach, Engagement, and Innovation

In FY2022, the SDO continued its work to recruit new businesses for state certification, to engage and connect these companies with business opportunities, and to provide training and coordination to assist them in securing new business. This vision of creating a steady stream of small and diverse businesses from certification to business relationships is implemented by multiple SDO teams. This section will provide an overview of these efforts in three areas: program outreach, collaboration, and innovation.

Program Outreach

Technical Assistance Sessions and Public Events. In FY2022, the SDO Engagement Team conducted more than 160 one-on-one technical assistance sessions. In partnership with DCAMM and Commodore Walsh, the SDO co-sponsored three Massachusetts Construction Opportunities Events. In addition, the Engagement Team and other SDO staff attended and/or presented at more than 40 events geared toward assisting small and diverse businesses, agencies, and other interested parties. Those events included appearing on a series of panels at Commonwealth Corporation's ReConvene: Increasing the Marketability of Small, Diverse Businesses; speaking at the Governor's Latino Advisory Commission and Black Advisory Commission meetings; and presenting at the Association of Latino Professionals in Finance and Accounting Small Business Pre-Certification and License webinar.

- Pathways and Connections. The SDO re-branded and re-launched its monthly newsletter, *Pathways* and *Connections*, sharing news and upcoming events from the SDO and its partners with more than 4,000 vendors, advocates, and buyers.
- SDO Ad Campaign. As mentioned in the "SDO Restructuring and Accomplishments" section earlier in this report, the SDO started an advertising campaign to raise awareness of the SDO and the various programs we offer for diverse and small businesses. The department started a statewide advertising campaign by working with Archipelago Strategies Group (ASG), which is certified as an MBE, WBE and LGBTBE. Together, we created a campaign covering local signage, a far-reaching media buy, a 30-second radio ad, and a digital campaign. The campaign was seen and heard in eight different languages, including Amharic, Haitian Creole, Khmer, Portuguese, Simplified Chinese, Spanish, Vietnamese, and English. In total, the media buy created a campaign with an estimated 5.8 million impressions.

Engagement

Strategic Partnerships and Collaboration. In FY2022, in addition to continuing our outreach to small
and diverse businesses across the Commonwealth, the SDO established new strategic partnerships and
strengthened existing ones, enabling the SDO to better meet needs and collaborate with our community
partners and stakeholders. These partnerships helped the SDO to remove procurement barriers and
connect community organizations and their members to business opportunities and resources.

These strategic partners include but are not limited to: the Black Economic Council of Massachusetts (BECMA), Amplify Latinx, the Governor's Black and Latino Advisory Commissions, the City of Boston, the Greater New England Minority Supplier Development Council (GNEMSDC), Minority Business Development Agency (MBDA), the Center for Women and Enterprise (CWE, New England WBENC), the

National LGBT Chamber of Commerce (NGLCC), the Massachusetts LGBT Chamber of Commerce, Disability:IN, Work Without Limits, the Persons with Disabilities Employment Advocacy Group, and all of the SDO's Certification and Community Organizational Partnerships.

Examples of FY2022 collaborative projects created through the above partnerships include:

- Black Economic Council of Massachusetts (BECMA). In FY2022, the SDO continued to foster and grow its existing strategic partnership with BECMA as SDO's Director of Diverse and Small Business Engagement is a founding member of BECMA's Vendor Advisory Council. The SDO attended monthly meetings with BECMA and procurement officials from Brookline, Sommerville, Newton, and Malden to discuss and formalize strategies to address and reduce barriers of entry to public state and municipal contract procurement opportunities. The SDO also actively participated in the in-person and remote presentations as well as exhibiting at BECMA's Mass Black Expo.
- Holyoke Soldiers' Home Access, Inclusion and Diversity Committee. The SDO Executive
 Director serves on this committee which meets on a monthly basis and is responsible for
 actively promoting and reporting on the inclusion of MBE, WBE and VBE/SDVOBE-owned
 businesses in the construction of the Holyoke Veteran's Home.
- Federal Funds Equity and Accountability Review Panel. The SDO Executive Director serves on this panel which was statutorily-established and tasked with tracking how American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) funds are spent in Massachusetts, particularly in communities that were disproportionately impacted by COVID-19.
- Browning the Green Space. The SDO was a standing committee member and met monthly with Browning the Green Space organization in an effort to coordinate outreach efforts to black and brown business owners in the construction trades in the green construction industry.
- Amplify Latinx. The SDO actively participated in the Amplify Latinx 5th Annual PowerUp 5.0
 Business Summit. In addition, SDO continued to provide certification and procurement technical
 assistance resource support.
- MOD Disability Summit. The SDO exhibited at the Massachusetts Office on Disability's disability summit.
- SCORE. In FY2022, the SDO continued to develop its ongoing strategic relationship with the Service Corps of Retired Executives (SCORE), which is a non-profit and affiliate organization of the Small Business Administration (SBA) with members who provide free consultation services and advice to entrepreneurs. SDO and SCORE developed a pilot program with the intent of introducing SCORE mentors to newly-certified WBEs and MBEs for mentoring and providing technical assistance consultation.
- Collaboration with Certification Partners. Throughout FY2022, the SDO continued to work with our cross-certification partners while simultaneously enabling and supporting diverse and small businesses to apply for SDO certification through our streamlined process. The SDO has thus maintained vital relationships with the City of Boston, the Center for Women and Enterprise, the Greater New England Minority Supplier Diversity Council, Disability:IN, the National LGBT Chamber of Commerce, and the U.S. Department of Veterans' Affairs.
- The City of Boston. The SDO has continued its partnership with the City of Boston by working with the city to incorporate SDO-certified businesses into their search engine. This enhanced

- partnership better enables City of Boston purchasing and procurement staff to locate diverse businesses that may be interested in competing for City work.
- Cannabis Control Commission. The SDO continued to work closely with the Cannabis Control Commission to enable full participation in the marijuana industry by people from communities that have previously been disproportionately harmed by marijuana prohibition and enforcement, and to positively impact those communities. In support of these efforts, the SDO provides supplier diversity certification services to cannabis companies and collaborates with the Commission to educate diverse cannabis companies about certification.
- Massachusetts Clean Energy Council (CEC). In FY2022, the SDO was asked to participate as an advisor in developing the diversity, equity, and inclusion criteria for a CEC offshore wind procurement. A separate group of SDO employees, independently, worked to assist potential bidders in identifying potential supplier diversity partners in preparation for the bid.

Innovation

• The Supplier Diversity Hub. The future of fairness and equity in state contracting will also become simpler due to new technology being rolled out by the SDO. The SDO's Supplier Diversity Hub ("the Hub") was procured, built and tested in FY2022 and is designed to connect diverse and small businesses to prime contractors and Commonwealth agencies and cities and towns. The Hub's first feature made available to state agencies was a set of spending dashboards that allows each agency to track their SDP and SBPP performance virtually in real time, including direct spending and, for the first time, indirect spending as reported by Commonwealth prime contractors. Additional features include a Business Opportunity Exchange and Prime Contractor Spend Reporting. All businesses creating Hub accounts undergo a certification self-assessment that identifies SDO programs that the business may be eligible for. The Hub launched in stages starting in early FY2023.




Example of Supplier Diversity Hub Agency Diverse and Small Business Spending Dashboard

• Supplier Diversity Heat Map. Additionally, the SDO in partnership with ANF IT, designed, tested, and plans to launch a "supplier diversity heat map" of Massachusetts diverse and small businesses. The map will help Commonwealth departments, cities and towns and prime vendors find diverse and small businesses by business name, certification category, zip code, city/town, or county. The map enables buyers to engage not only diverse and small businesses but local ones as well.

Certification Directory and Application System Upgrades. In FY2022, the SDO completed additional
enhancements to its online application system. These updates enabled users of the SDO's Online
Directory of Certified Businesses to execute more sophisticated searches, improved processing of
certification applications from diverse cannabis businesses, and made internal certification and renewal
workflows more efficient.

- Making Diverse and Small Contractors Visible in COMMBUYS. In FY2022, the SDO continued to
 collaborate with ANF IT and OSD Data and Analytics to specify, fund, and deploy several enhancements
 to COMMBUYS, the Commonwealth's eProcurement marketplace. The goal of the enhancements was
 to make small and diverse business information visible to buyers at critical points in requesting quotes,
 evaluating quotes, or placing orders. SDO-funded COMMBUYS enhancements released in FY2022:
 - Simplify searching for small and diverse businesses;
 - Identify COMMBUYS-verified Massachusetts small businesses to buyers who may need this information to implement the SBPP business preference in quote evaluation; and
 - Prominently display the small business status and certification type for relevant contractors on multi-vendor contracts when buyers are choosing vendors for soliciting quotes or placing an order.

SDP Spending Compliance Verification

In FY2022, the SDO continued to expand its SDP Spending Compliance Verification program. The goal of the effort was to assess the accuracy of SDP reports submitted by Statewide Contractors by requesting SDO-certified vendors to confirm that they received the payments as stated on the spending reports. The SDO sent out 419 sets of reports to certified diverse vendors to confirm payments received. 190 diverse businesses responded, verifying a total of 269 reports. The response rate for reported spend verification was 64%, which is consistent with FY2021's verification rate. The amount of spending that was verified totaled over \$197 million, a 62% increase over FY2021. Based on the responses received, the SDO found the following:

- Accurate and understated reports: Spending in 229 sets of reports (85% of the reports, representing 81% of the expenditures reported) were confirmed to be accurate or higher than reported. Of that number, 40 sets (15% of the responses, representing 7% of the reported expenditures) were understated, and the Statewide Contractor, in fact, spent more than reported.
- Overstated reports: Spending in 40 sets of reports (15% of the reports and 18% of the expenditures reported) were found to be overstated by the Statewide Contractors. In each of those cases, the SDO notified the OSD Sourcing Unit and the prime contractor of the discrepancy and requested that any corrections, updates, or revisions be provided to both the SDO and OSD. Data used for this Annual Report spending section was updated to reflect the accurate (and not overstated) spending amounts for the contractors in question.

Training

In FY2022, the SDO established and filled a new position for a Training and Policy Coordinator whose responsibilities include developing and delivering training programs focusing on SDO policy, programs and systems. This allowed the SDO to establish a robust training program for small and diverse businesses, prime bidders and contractors, executive department purchasers, and other public buyers.

• New Training Sessions: In the latter part of the fiscal year, three new courses were introduced to the vendor and buyer community. The first, "Unlocking Opportunities: How to Make Your State Certification Work for You," assists certified vendors to learn more about using their state certification to identify opportunities in public procurement and develop business-to-business relationships with other vendors. The second, "Using Existing Contracts to Achieve Supplier Diversity Benchmarks," helps buyers understand SDP benchmarks and identifies tools available in finding diverse and small business vendors. In support of the Hub rollout, the third course, "Supplier Diversity Hub: Getting Started," was created for executive agencies to show how to navigate the new system.

The SDO also collaborated with DCAMM and held a DCAMM Certification Overview class for SDO state-certified construction businesses interested in pursuing DCAMM certification. In addition, internal classes were conducted for SDO staff on a variety of topics including procurement processes and policies, SDO programs, and certification.

• **Pre-certification Webinars:** In addition, the SDO continued to offer pre-certification webinars, led by a team of SDO staff and a trainer, and which are designed for businesses interested in applying for state certification. These webinars introduce SDO certification, discuss certification criteria, processes, and forms, and explain the marketing benefits of certification. Attendance at the pre-certification webinar is a requirement for all in-state businesses that wish to become certified. In FY2022, the SDO held 13 pre-certification webinars, five more than the prior year. These webinars were attended by 1,572 representatives of diverse businesses interested in certification, 22% more than in FY2021.

- Pre-Bid Conferences, Contractor Onboarding, and Contract Kick-off Events: The SDO teamed with OSD, the Commonwealth's central procurement agency, to educate buyers and vendors on the Commonwealth's procurement process and the critical role of SDO certification and programs. In FY2022, the SDO participated in 12 pre-bid conferences, 12 prime vendor onboarding sessions, and 13 contact kick-off events for buyers related to OSD's Statewide Contracts. The SDO also presented in three Strategics Sourcing certificate program courses.
- Monthly Secretariat and Agency Supplier Diversity Officer Forums: The SDO Training and Policy Coordinator and other SDO staff conducted monthly information sharing, training and collaboration forums about SDO programs, policies, systems and results with the Secretariat and Agency Supplier Diversity Officers.

Narrative Reports by Quasi-Public/Non-Executive Organizations

In FY2022, the SDO, in collaboration with the Governor's Office of Access, Opportunity, and Community Affairs, continued to coordinate supplier diversity activities among more than two dozen quasi-public and non-executive organizations across the state. In addition to meetings, resources, and best practices, participants in this effort were offered an opportunity to report the results of their supplier diversity programs through this Annual Report.

This chapter contains information from 14 quasi-public or non-executive organizations that submitted such narrative reports, including three organizations also participating in the quantitative sections of this report (the Massachusetts Convention Center Authority, Massachusetts Gaming Commission, and MassHousing).²⁸

Cannabis Control Commission

The Cannabis Control Commission ("Commission"), established in 2017, implements and administers the laws enabling access to medical and adult-use marijuana. The Commission regulates an industry that is characterized by small and larger participants, including minorities, women, and veterans. The Commission encourages full participation by people from communities that were disproportionately harmed by marijuana prohibition.

The Commission requests information from vendors about their internal diversity, equity, and inclusion training as part of procurement, and awards points for MBE, WBE, and other designations.

Since 2019, the Commission has worked with the SDO to educate cannabis businesses on how to obtain SDO certifications. Marijuana Establishment applicants that complete SDO training and sign attestations about their ownership receive expedited processes for licensing applications. Additionally, Marijuana Establishment licensees that are ultimately certified by the SDO and meet the Commission's small business eligibility requirements receive fee waivers associated with their licenses and future applications for other types of operations.

Commonwealth Corporation

Commonwealth Corporation, CommCorp for short, is a quasi-public agency established in 1996 through the merger of two Massachusetts non-profit organizations: the Industrial Service Program and the Bay State Skills Corporation. CommCorp delivers innovative and collaborative career development solutions that help employees and businesses succeed and is dedicated to creating a globally competitive workforce that fosters the success and well-being of all individuals.

At the heart of CommCorp's diversity, equity, and inclusion strategy is their commitment to organizational change so that they can continue to best serve individuals and communities. These changes and opportunities

for growth include integrating SDO certifications into the Workforce Training Fund Express Program Directory and actively identifying and pursuing opportunities to support and build partnerships with organizations currently engaged in promoting racial and economic justice within the communities served.

CommCorp works to provide economic opportunities to historically and systemically marginalized communities through our grant services and technical assistance programs—preparing them to administer funds and expand their capacity. However, this goal requires the collaborative effort of personnel, partners, and the community at large. They use the Supplier Diversity Office's directory to look for relationships that allow them to leverage their unique assets across disciplines and sectors to build power for marginalized communities, seeking out partnerships and vendors that focus on the intersection of DEI issues with other pressing social problems such as health disparities, education disparities, and criminal justice reform.

The journey to supporting, expanding, and investing in an equitable workforce is not always linear. Therefore, Commonwealth Corporation's goal is two-fold: to learn from the mistakes they are aware of, and to foster an environment that encourages partners, stakeholders, and employees to hold them accountable. The Massachusetts Convention Center Authority (MCCA)

The MCCA adopted the Administration's methodology and procedures for measuring diverse business spending, beginning with its FY2017 reporting. While it has not tracked additional categories for diverse business types in the past, the MCCA now is asking vendors to report their certification status among a broader set of business categories (e.g., veteran-owned, LGBT-owned). In FY2018, the MCCA was proud to receive a Supplier Diversity Award for its efforts in promoting economic opportunity for small and diverse businesses in the Commonwealth in the prior fiscal year.

Through its centralized Purchasing and Procurement team, the MCCA is looking to continually build upon this achievement to increase opportunities for diverse suppliers. In the fall of 2022, the MCCA welcomed back to the Boston Convention & Exhibition Center (BCEC) the Mass Black Expo 2022 event and looks forward to hosting the event again in 2023.

The COVID-19 pandemic had a dramatic impact on the finances of the MCCA, which continue to recover from historically low levels of business activity. In lieu of the loss of business for large portions of fiscal years 2020 and 2021, many of the MCCA's annual operating expenses were cut dramatically. This impact continued into fiscal year 2022. However, the MCCA is optimistic that, with the re-opening of its facilities to large events in late spring of 2021, it will see a steady recovery in its operating and financial performance to hopefully being normalized by fiscal year 2024.

The MCCA advertises major procurements on its website and through local and regional news outlets. Typically, firms responding to such procurements are required to identify how and in what amount they are including diverse businesses within their proposals. Please visit the MCCA Business Opportunities page for information on current and upcoming Requests for Proposals, Requests for Qualifications, and Invitations for Bids.

Massachusetts Development Finance Agency (MassDevelopment)

Massachusetts Development Finance Agency's (MassDevelopment) Board of Directors (Board) voted at its June 8, 2017, Board of Directors Meeting to adopt a Diverse Business Participation Program (Program) for MassDevelopment's direct contracting. This Program encourages parties seeking contracts with MassDevelopment to use good faith efforts to include MBEs, WBEs, VBEs, and SDVOBEs. MassDevelopment refers to these four categories as Diverse Business Enterprises (DBE).²⁹

MassDevelopment's Program encourages DBE participation and measures such participation for yearly reports to the Board. MassDevelopment staff encourages DBE participation by providing all Requests for Proposal, Requests for Qualifications, and Invitations of Bids to the SDO, the Greater New England Minority Supplier Development Council, and the Center for Women & Enterprise for dissemination.

In FY2018, MassDevelopment worked to roll out the Program and track its "baseline" for future years and annual reporting to the Board which resulted from collaboration between the finance, legal/procurement, and information technology divisions.

MassDevelopment used the FY2018 methodology to determine its FY2022 reporting. MassDevelopment's total consolidated dollar spend on all vendors for FY2022 (the denominator of the percentage calculation) was \$23,824,738. MassDevelopment then identified (through cross-checking with the SDO database and through subsequent coding) all vendors eligible for inclusion in the Program. The total SDO certified, DBE vendor spend (the numerator) was determined to be \$948,880. Accordingly, 4% of MassDevelopment's total direct contracting was procured through DBE vendors in FY2022. However, if factoring in non-certified DBE vendors and subcontractors in the amount of \$548,299, the number jumps to \$1,497,179 or 6.3% participation by DBE vendors.

It should further be noted that 47.9% of our vendor payments, or \$11,412,137, is to businesses with DBE subcontractors. Unfortunately, our current system cannot extract the subcontractor portion so that number is not reportable at this time. Lastly, non-certified DBE vendors are routinely encouraged to seek or update their SDO certifications.

Massachusetts Gaming Commission (MGC)

The Massachusetts Gaming Commission (MGC) has elected to follow 801 CMR 21.00, which governs the acquisition of all commodities and services by executive agencies including following SDO and OSD's guidelines regarding diversity spending. MGC posts bid opportunities on COMMBUYS and on MGC's website, in addition to engaging a company to enlarge the pool of diverse vendors to many of our RFRs.

The MGC continues to make small and diverse businesses a priority in our procurements resulting in \$2.87M spending with small business, \$283K with women owned businesses, \$301K with minority owned businesses, and \$41K with Veteran owned businesses. The MGC fully participates in the SDP and SBPP and their results are included in the quantitative sections of this report.

In addition to the Commission's direct purchasing, MGC monitors the casino licensees in meeting their own supplier/vendor diversity goals and compliance with required diversity plans (available on the MGC website). Each casino's progress toward reaching those goals is published on the MGC Reports and Publications Webpage.

Oversight for each licensee's spending involves quarterly diversity reporting, compliance audits and reviews, as well as working with community organizations to assist the casinos in sourcing diverse vendors. The most current information on supplier diversity status can be found in their quarterly reports posted to the website.

Massachusetts Growth Capital Corporation (MGCC)

MGCC empowers small businesses in Massachusetts through access to capital, managerial education, and resources, and promotes economic development in underserved and under-resourced communities in our gateway cities. With economic opportunities, these business owners – often women, minorities and veterans – can build assets, create employment, and strengthen their communities. MGCC has been providing these entrepreneurs with alternative funding solutions and free managerial assistance since 2010.

MGCC communicates with statewide partners and the SDO to expand its reach to diverse suppliers. MGCC offerings, as well as further inclusive opportunities and initiatives supported by MGCC, may be found on MGCC's website: EmpoweringSmallBusiness.org.

Massachusetts Housing Finance Agency (MassHousing)

The Massachusetts Housing Finance Agency (MassHousing) is now in its sixth decade of providing economic opportunities to Diverse Business Owners, not limited to Minority Businesses (MBEs) and Women Businesses (WBEs).

MassHousing's Diversity & Inclusion team works in partnership with property managers and construction contractors at MassHousing-financed rental housing communities. The goal is to connect these companies with capable diverse businesses. It is all part of MassHousing's long-standing commitment to leverage economic opportunities within the affordable and mixed income housing realm.

MassHousing's multifamily borrowers must also make good-faith efforts to hire MBEs and WBEs along with a reflective workforce. The Agency negotiates and manages Equal Opportunity Construction Contracts with general contractors to establish MBE/WBE contracting opportunities, and partners with property management companies to ensure that MBE/WBE vendor utilization goals are being met and Fair Housing Marketing Plans are implemented.

Recently compiled data from fiscal year 2022 (which ended June 30, 2022) shows that of the \$447 million in construction contracts awarded at 19 MassHousing-financed projects, \$102 million was awarded to MBEs, \$44

million to WBEs. In addition, of the 1.6 million workforce hours completed at those sites, 905,571 were performed by minority workers, and 60,737 by women.

During FY22, 377 MassHousing-financed rental developments located in six regions across the Commonwealth participated in the Equal Opportunity Property Management Program. Of their \$284 million in total expenditures, \$46 million went to MBEs and MWBEs, and \$31 million to WBEs and MWBEs.

MassHousing actively participates in trade fairs, conferences and workshops sponsored by public and non-profit organizations. Through <u>an interactive website</u>, the Agency provides outreach, technical assistance, information and created a new electronic feature which list potential work opportunities at housing developments throughout the Commonwealth.

Finally, in FY2022, MassHousing continues to set ambitious goals and expand opportunities for the participation of diverse businesses in all aspects of the Agency's operations.

Massport

The Massachusetts Port Authority ("Massport") is an independent public authority, is self-supporting, and is governed by a seven-member Board. Five members are appointed by the Governor of Massachusetts, and one is appointed by the Massachusetts Port Authority Community Advisory Committee to staggered terms of seven years each. The Secretary of Transportation and Chief Executive Officer of the Massachusetts Department of Transportation serves as an ex officio member of the Board.

A world-class organization moving people and goods, Massport connects Massachusetts and New England to the world – safely, securely, and efficiently, with a commitment to sustainability, our neighboring communities, and diversity, equity, and inclusion. Massport's facilities generate \$22 billion a year in total economic impact and support more than 107,000 direct jobs.

The pandemic negatively affected Logan Airport's passenger volume and Massport's financial position, requiring significant cuts to operating and capital expenses. While business activity across the Authority's three airports and port facilities continue to rebound, a full recovery is not expected until FY2024-FY2025.

Despite recent challenges, Massport remains committed to expanding economic opportunities to businesses owned by people of color, women, and other diverse groups. Through the Authority's Supplier Diversity program, Massport seeks to expand business partnerships and increase participation of certified minority business enterprises (MBEs), women business enterprises (WBEs), and other diverse groups. During FY2022, 2% of Massport's spending for goods and non-professional services went to M/WBE firms. In addition, Massport awarded 12%, or \$2.1 million, of new and multi-year contracts for goods and non-professional services to M/WBEs. The awards included eight contracts to new M/WBE vendors totaling \$641,000.

Every year since elevating Diversity, Equity, & Inclusion (DE&I) as a main goal, Massport has worked to nurture and cultivate diversity by expanding our outreach efforts, educational and awareness programming, and community commitments. The following are highlights of FY2022 initiatives and outcomes:

Supplier Diversity

- Established internal benchmark for FY2023 M/WBE procurement awards.
- Implemented Authority-wide systems interface with diversity/compliance contract "B2G" software to monitor and track M/WBE participation.

- Trained employees on DE&I/Procurement Initiatives, including Selection Committee Project Manager's Training.
- Provided departments with a projection of upcoming solicitations to facilitate the planning of goods and non-professional services procurement and allow for extensive outreach to diverse vendors.
- Utilized Bid Express, an electronic bidding platform, to make it convenient for all diverse vendors to
 proactively engage with Massport and facilitated data collection regarding diverse vendor participation
 in Massport procurements.
- Made diversity an explicit selection criterion in the procurement for auditing services. As a result, Ernst
 Young Consulting (EY) partnered with DavisKelly, a local MBE and WBE accounting firm. The
 collaboration between the two firms on this project led them to seek future business ventures together,
 demonstrating that these types of partnerships expand economic opportunities.
- Expanded the investor broker pool by adding five new diverse investors designated as businesses owned
 by people of color and/or women. The approximate value of trades made by the new, diverse brokers
 was \$164 million.
- Increased participation of minority-owned investment bankers in the underwriter's pool by 33%.
- Continued targeted outreach to build relationships with diverse businesses and organizations and make them aware of upcoming bid opportunities.
- Hosted the 8th Annual Massport Business Diversity Summit in December 2021 and identified 11 new diverse vendors for future procurement opportunities.
- Collaborated with other organizations on "Doing Business with Massport" events.
- Commercial Real Estate and Aviation Leases.
- Incorporated diversity, equity, and inclusion as one of four equally selection criteria ("Massport Model") to a Request for Proposals (RFPs) for a Mixed Income Housing Project on Parcel D-4 in South Boston to incentivize high levels of minority and women-owned business participation in ownership, leadership, design, construction, equity investment, and operations.
- Incorporated DE&I as selection criteria for aviation development bids at Logan Airport and Hanscom Field.
- Associated Industries of Massachusetts ("AIM") awarded Massport and the Omni Hotel project team
 the Lewis Latimer Award for the creation and implementation of the Massport Model, an award AIM
 presents annually to a Massachusetts innovator, organization, or business leader who has broken
 barriers to innovate and create economic opportunity.

Workforce Diversity and Community Support

- Launched the Pathways Program internships at Bridgewater State University in the spring and expanded
 it by adding UMass Boston in September 2022 to assist Massport in building a diverse pipeline. Two
 Aviation Management students from Bridgewater State University were awarded scholarships and paid
 internships and will continue to work with Massport a few days per month throughout the academic
 year. Upon graduation they will receive offers of employment.
- Awarded monthly grants to local organizations that serve diverse communities to fund youth educational programs; athletics and recreational programming; social services; the arts and cultural events. Set a goal to award 50% of yearly grant funds to organizations and programs that predominantly serve people of color.

- Awarded \$250,000 in grants to 52 local organizations. Exceeded the goal by awarding 69% of total grants
 (\$173,000) to 33 organizations that predominantly serve people of color. Out of those 33 organizations,
 23 are organizations with diverse leadership.
- Supported organizations in neighboring communities by providing funds for summer youth employment through the Community Summer Jobs Program.
- Set goal for one-third of summer jobs funded to be opportunities for students of color.
- Provided \$600K of summer jobs funding to 28 organizations from neighboring communities.
- Thirty-six percent of students hired through the program were people-of color, exceeding our DE&I goal of 33%.
- Awarded \$3,000 Diversity STEM Scholarships to two high school graduates.
- Since 2007, Massport has awarded \$76,000 in Diversity STEM scholarships to support 46 students of
 color pursuing STEM or transportation careers who attend school in the city of Boston or neighboring
 communities or who reside there.

Massachusetts School Building Authority (MSBA)

The Massachusetts School Building Authority (the "MSBA") is a quasi-independent state authority that provides partial reimbursement grant funding for school construction projects across the Commonwealth. The MSBA has a long-standing partnership with the Massachusetts Supplier Diversity Office (SDO), which enhances the MSBA's commitment to developing and strengthening Minority and Woman-Owned Business Enterprises ("M/WBEs") and expanding equal opportunity in the primary and secondary industries affected by MSBA procurements for goods and services.

The MSBA works with the SDO to notify certified M/WBEs of upcoming MSBA procurements. Also, the MSBA strongly considers a respondent's intent to further the development of M/WBEs or the existence of a relationship which furthers these goals when evaluating responses to procurements. The MSBA publishes RFRs for open procurements on the MSBA's website and on COMMBUYS where the MSBA welcomes M/WBEs to submit responses to these procurements.

Districts in the MSBA's grant program are independently responsible for following all state laws and state agency requirements that are outside of the MSBA's jurisdiction, including the participation goals for M/WBEs on MSBA-funded school construction projects. The MSBA encourages districts to employ M/WBEs on school construction projects through language incorporated in MSBA template contracts and procurement documents which detail the requirements for M/WBEs on school construction projects pursuant to M.G.L. Ch. 7C, section 6. Also, the MSBA requires Owner's Project Managers ("OPMs") to monitor goals for hiring M/WBE's in the design and construction phases of a project in the OPM Monthly Reports that are submitted to the MSBA.

The MSBA looks forward to continuing to partner with the SDO in order to enhance the MSBA's initiatives for promoting the hiring of M/WBEs on MSBA procurements and MSBA-funded school construction projects.

Massachusetts State College Building Authority (MSCBA)

The Massachusetts State College Building Authority (MSCBA or Authority) is responsible for financing, designing, constructing, and overseeing the management of residence halls and student activity facilities for the nine state universities and 15 community colleges. The Authority is committed to fostering, cultivating, and preserving a culture of diversity, equity, and inclusion. The Authority partners with the Commonwealth's Supplier Diversity Office, other state entities, and industry associations to strengthen the diverse workforce within the Commonwealth.

In addition to adopting the Commonwealth's diversity goals for hiring design and construction firms, the MSCBA continues to reach out to the subcontractor community by engaging Minority Business Enterprises, Woman-Owned Business Enterprises, and Veteran-Owned Business Enterprises in a web-based trade contractor prequalification process where they are awarded additional credit toward becoming prequalified to bid on MSCBA projects. Notification of current opportunities are posted in the Central Register and at MSCBA Solicitations.

Along with the MBE/WBE goals, the Authority has also adopted workforce participation goals to ensure opportunities for minority and women individuals to participate in our construction projects. Monthly review of the workforce data on each project results in an open dialogue, creates demand, and results in real job opportunities. The Authority tracks this data on all projects to the established goals to measure growth and identify areas in need of improvement. Further, the Authority promotes diversity throughout other internally hired vendors and in other types of procurement, and regularly engages minority-owned and women-owned firms for consulting and project support roles, as well as in financing activities. The MSCBA's annual report and additional information, including current projects and annual reports, may be viewed online at www.mscba.org.

Massachusetts Water Resources Authority (MWRA)

The Massachusetts Water Resources Authority's MBE/WBE/DBE Program ensures the equitable participation of Minority/Women/Disadvantaged Business Enterprises in the award of all contracts including contracts for construction, goods/non-professional services and professional services.

A quarterly report is generated on spending for MBE/WBE/DBEs, which includes construction, goods/non-professional services and professional services contracts. These expenditures are presented to the MWRA's Board of Directors in the quarterly Orange Notebook Report on Key Indicators of MWRA Performance. The table below shows the MWRA's FY2022 Report.

Office of the Inspector General

As part of its Massachusetts Certified Public Purchasing Official (MCPPO) program, the Inspector General's Office developed trainings focusing on diversity and inclusion in procurement. Specifically:

- The Office of the Inspector General (OIG) partners with the Supplier Diversity Office (SDO) to provide training entitled **Diversity and Inclusion in Procurement**. The OIG and the Supplier Diversity Office present information about how Chapter 30B can be used to promote a diverse vendor pool. For example, how to develop a request for proposals (RFP) with evaluation criteria that provides "highly advantageous" status to SDO-certified vendors; or how to use the price quotation process to seek quotes from SDO-certified vendors on statewide and cooperative contracts. The training also reviews resources available to vendors and municipalities to assist in promoting diversity and inclusion in public contracting. For example, the SDO Certified Business Directory which provides multiple search functions to search for certified diverse vendors.
- In addition, the OIG held a one-day class on **Diversity and Inclusion in Procurement**, which included presentations from the Massachusetts Bay Transportation Authority, City of Boston, SDO, Division of Capital Asset Management and Maintenance (DCAMM) Affirmative Marketing Program, and the Attorney General's Office (AGO), with 55 in attendance. The OIG also presented a 90-minute training to the board and staff of the Black Economic Council of MA.
- The OIG also partners with DCAMM and the AGO to present class segments related to diversity. These agencies review the requirements of Massachusetts' Affirmative Marketing Program and Workforce Participation Goals respectively, in the Design and Construction Contracting core class and School Project Designer and Owner's Project Manager Certification classes. These presentations discuss the legal requirements for vendor diversity goals in construction contracts. Approx. 400 students per semester attend these presentations. DCAMM and AGO have been providing these presentations for several years.

University of Massachusetts (UMass)

The UMass Unified Procurement Services Team (UPST) of the University of Massachusetts system continues to collaborate with local communities and campus stakeholders to drive the system's supplier diversity agenda. To ensure that the system makes data-driven decisions with regards to supplier diversity, UMass partnered with TealBook, a supplier data enrichment company, to ensure that real time data on diverse suppliers is leveraged.

In addition, UMass continues to build off of the momentum initiated over the last few years including active participation in industry networking events, and strengthening partnerships with local diversity-focused organizations, like the Western Mass Anchor Collaborative and the Greater New England Minority Supplier Development Council (GNEMSDC) while continuing to support the Boston Chamber of Commerce Pacesetters Initiative, which prioritizes the expansion of opportunities for local, ethnic, and minority-owned companies.

Goods and Services: UMass System Office

With the revamp of the UMass Procurement Policy to ensure that supplier diversity is a major consideration in all competitive procurement initiatives, UMass has focused on updating processes and tools/templates used in the purchase of goods and services to be able to drive policy actualization.

As mentioned in the FY2021 annual report, UMass has started tracking diverse subcontractor/tier 2 supplier spend through the TealBook tool. This helps UMass monitor and track compliance of prime suppliers in meeting diversity goals agreed upon during the contracting process.

University of Massachusetts Building Authority (UMBA)

The University of Massachusetts Building Authority (UMBA) continues to develop and implement best practices to improve our diversity and inclusion work and increase participation of Minority Business Enterprises (MBE) and Women Business Enterprises (WBE) in areas of project management, material and equipment vendor purchases, professional services, and commissioning contracts on UMass Capital Building projects.

Our MBE and WBE participation goals for business utilization are as follows: Design Contracts 21.6% (MBE 6.6%/WBE 15.0%) and Construction Contracts 13.0% (MBE 4.2%/WBE 8.8%). UMBA's strong collaborations with

the building trades, vocation/technical schools, pre-apprenticeship programs, and community organizations has helped us attract and recruit more MBE and WBE firms to bid on our construction projects.

UMBA will continue to work with and support our general contractors, construction managers, owner project managers, subcontractors, and architectural firms to exercise maximum efforts to help improve and increase MBE and WBE participation on our construction projects. We continue to meet regularly with the Design, Construction, and Compliance Working Groups that we have established on UMass Campuses to review monthly compliance results, provide resources, and support MBE/WBE initiatives.

In FY2022, UMBA paid out \$28,817,485 to MBE and WBE firms working on capital projects, approximately 12.44% of UMBA's capital spending.
