### **COVID-19 Fisheries Relief** CARES Act and the Consolidated Appropriations Act of 2021

### **Round 1 CARES (2020)**

- \$300 Million to Support U.S. Fishermen & Seafood Industry negatively impacted by COVID-19 (minimum 35% economic loss compared to prior 5-year average)
- NOAA Fisheries used multi-year revenue estimate averages of "fishery participants" to determine state allocations.
- Massachusetts distributed approximately \$27.8 Million to four sectors based on revenue proportions modified to better reflect state needs (increased aquaculture & Seafood Processing %).

### **Round 1 CARES Funding Allocation** by Sector

Sector	Amount Paid	Percent
Seafood Processors	\$13,779,788	49.60%
Commercial Fishermen	\$11,835,178	42.60%
Aquaculturists	\$1,153,588	4.15%
For-Hire Vessels	\$999,996	3.60%

### **Round 2 CARES (2021)**

- \$255 Million for U.S. fishermen & seafood industry (same eligibility threshold).
- Massachusetts to receive roughly \$23 Million.
- Sector allocations to be determined.



# MA Round 1 CARES Act Program Recap Seafood Processor Sector (\$ 13,779,788)

### **General Eligibility Criteria**

- Must have held a 2020 Wholesale Dealer permit as of June 30, 2020, and must have held a 2019 Wholesale Dealer permit.
- Must have suffered 35% revenue loss during March 10–June 30, 2020 compared to the prior 5-year average due to the effects of COVID-19.
- For active years between 2015 and 2019, must have made average annual wholesale seafood sales of at least \$100,000.
- Must have received at least 70% of total wholesale business revenue from wholesale seafood sales. Only seafood
  wholesale and processing activities counted toward the eligibility criteria.
- Must have been 18 years of age or older at time of application.
- Must have been in good standing with the State and Federal Government.
- Must have been a Massachusetts resident.
- Assistance from this and other federal relief must not make the applicant "more than whole" (i.e., have a 2020 annual revenue greater than their prior 5-year average revenue).

# MA Round 1 CARES Act Program Recap Seafood Processor Sector (\$ 13,779,788)

- Applications sent: 348 (all holders of 2020 MA Wholesale Dealer permit as of June 30)
  - 161 eligible by initial determination
  - 187 ineligible by initial determination
- Total returned applications: 139
  - 111 accepted their initial determination, 106 of which were eligible.
  - 13 appealed their initial determination.
    - Appeals accepted by DMF: 9
    - Appeals denied by DMF: 4
  - Applications that did not meet the 35% revenue loss threshold: 9
  - Other ineligible applications: 9
- o Total eligible applications: 113

## Massachusetts' Supplemental CARES Act Fisheries Relief (Round 2)

#### Massachusetts has been allocated \$23 Million for supplemental relief

#### **STILL REQUIRED by NOAA Fisheries**

- Must have suffered 35% revenue loss due to COVID in 2020, as compared to average revenue from 2015 to 2019.
- Cannot be "made more than whole" 2020 revenue plus any COVID-related relief (PPP or EIDL grants, supplemental COVID-19 unemployment relief of \$600/week, or other COVID-19 fisheries relief including USDA) cannot be greater than your traditional annual revenue.
- Must be 18 years of age or older at time of application.
- Must be in good standing with the State and Federal Government.

## Massachusetts' Supplemental CARES Act Fisheries Relief (Round 2)

#### Massachusetts has been allocated \$23 Million for supplemental relief

#### **CONSIDERATIONS**

- Time period for 35% loss calculation must be compared to 2020
  - Round 1 used March 10–June 30, 2020.
- Minimum eligibility criteria
  - Round 1 required at average annual seafood sales of at least \$100,000 between 2015 and 2019.
  - Round 1 required that businesses receive at least 70% of total wholesale revenue from wholesale seafood sales.
- What scale of payments would be too large and make most businesses "more than whole"?

## MA Round 2 CARES Act Relief

**Made "more than whole"**: 2020 traditional Seafood Processing revenue plus any COVID-related relief (PPP or EIDL grants, supplemental COVID-19 unemployment relief (i.e., \$600/week), or other COVID-19 fisheries relief) cannot be greater than your traditional annual Seafood Processing revenue.

### **How to Calculate**

Traditional Annual Seafood Processing Revenue AVERAGE 2015-2019 = AVG

Seafood Processing REVENUE as reported on 2020 Tax Return = R

Round 1 CARES Act Relief Payment = C

supplemental COVID-19 UNEMPLOYMENT relief i.e., \$600/week \* # of weeks = U

Sum of COVID related GRANTS (PPP or EIDL) = G

OTHER COVID-19 fisheries relief = Ot

MAXIMUM Round 2 CARES Act Relief Payment = MAX

### <u>Formula</u>

$$AVG - (R+C+U+G+Ot) = MAX$$

- •Establish "shares" for each sector tier as in Round 1.
- •Pay each eligible applicant their determined tier or the MAX value if "made more than whole".
- •Distribute set aside to each sector based on need.
