

## RE: Site: Project Medford Surgery Center LLC / Melrose Wakefield Healthcare

Dear Sir/Madam,

I am a long time resident of Medford. I live on Holmes road with my property abutting Lawrence Memorial Hospital, the proposed site for the new Ambulatory center; I will be sharing the same fence.

I am writing this letter to object the decision of Lawrence memorial hospital to allow the new construction of the Ambulatory center on its premises. I understand that health care is changing and there is a need for centers specializing in day surgeries and out patient care, but I believe there are better locations to situate the building than the one selected by Melrose Wakefield/Hallmark Health and its current partners.

I also understand we have a Ambulatory center in Winchester, MA and Waltham, Ma which are 5 miles and 12 miles away from the new proposed location for the ambulatory center. We Medford residents feel there is no pressing need for a new Ambulatory center in our residential neighborhood.

The suggested location for the Ambulatory center is in the middle of an established residential area. This will thrust a huge burden on the residents of the neighborhood in the forms of :

- More cuts in services provided to Medford residents by Lawrence memorial Hospital
- Medford residents will have to go elsewhere for their emergency medical needs
- Massive increase in traffic flow. (fatal accidents have already occurred)
- Tremendous increases in noise and light pollution for the abutters  $% \left( 1\right) =\left( 1\right) \left( 1\right$
- Hazardous waste disposal in neighboring properties
- Ground water pollution
- Minimal space for patient/employee parking spots for the proposed new Ambulatory center will result in illegal parking in our private side streets and we fear eventually more buildings/garages will be built in LMH campus.
- An increase in crime and petty theft
- Very little benefit to the residents of Medford who are impacted the most by the proposed building
- The irreplaceable loss of a peaceful neighborhood, with a vibrant community made up of all walks of life and age groups.

As I mentioned earlier, the Health care industry is changing with never ending increases in premiums and costs. It will be cost efficient for Melrose Wakefield/Hallmark to move the proposed Ambulatory center to the now closed Malden Hospital location or the under utilized Stoneham medical complexes nearby. It will be a win win situation for all!

I humbly urge you to deny the Melrose Wakefield/Hallmark Health's petition for the new Ambulatory center. My Medford neighbors join me in my voice of protest against the new building in the LMH campus
