# A message from the SPOC about FirstNet

On behalf of the Massachusetts Public Safety Broadband Office (PSBO), thank you for your ongoing interest and support of the work we are collectively doing to support FirstNet in its plan to implement the National Public Safety Broadband Network (NPSBN). I wanted to take a moment to provide you with a brief update on some of the major activities that have occurred over the past few months.

## FirstNet Update (in 150 words or less)

Here is what you need to know about the status of FirstNet:

- FirstNet is currently evaluating responses to its <u>request for proposal</u> to build the public safety wireless data network. FirstNet plans to select a vendor by November.
- The Massachusetts <u>State Plan</u>, which details the specifics of how the network will be built here in the Commonwealth, is planned to be provided to the PSBO in early 2017. Large portions of the plan will available to all interested stakeholders via a FirstNet online portal.
- Each governor will have 90 days to review its final state plan and determine whether to accept the plan provided by FirstNet or conduct its own deployment of a radio access network. This decision is expected by the summer or fall of next year.
- FirstNet has approved a \$6.5 billion budget for network buildout starting in 2017.

## Massachusetts and FirstNet Host Regional Planning Meeting on Quality of Service, Priority, and Preemption Needs

In June, FirstNet and the EOPSS PSBO held a northeast <u>regional planning meeting</u> at MEMA in Framingham to discuss how the National Public Safety Broadband Network will meet the "mission critical" requirements of public safety. A key planned differentiator of the NPSBN will be what FirstNet refers to as <u>Quality of Service</u>, <u>Priority</u>, <u>and Preemption</u> (or QPP for short). QPP aims to assure that public safety users always have the wireless data resources they need, when they need it. The outcomes of how QPP will be implemented in the NPSBN will be documented in the state plans expected early next year.
