## Sewage Notification Assistance Grant Program 2022-2023 Opportunity

### 1. GRANT OPPORTUNITY SUMMARY:

- A. **Proposals Sought:** The Massachusetts Department of Environmental Protection (MassDEP or the Department) seeks proposals from Massachusetts regional or municipal wastewater utilities or systems that meet the definition of “Permittee” and are subject to 314 CMR 16.00, for innovative projects that will assist them in meeting the requirements of MassDEP’s recently promulgated Sewage Notification Regulations at 314 CMR 16.00 (the “Regulations”). The purpose of this grant program is to assist Permittees with expanding their efforts to meet the Sewage Notification regulatory requirements, which were promulgated to Promote Public Awareness of Sewage Pollution. Only projects that meet specific requirements of the Regulation will be considered for funding. Interested entities should refer to the regulations here:

The funding for this Grant Program is available only for the Commonwealth of Massachusetts State Fiscal Year 2023 (July 1, 2022-June 30, 2023).

- B. **Overview and Goals:** in January 2022, MassDEP promulgated regulations that are entitled “Notification Requirements to Promote Public Awareness of Sewage Pollution” (314 CMR 16.00). The Regulation requires any entity meeting the definition of “Permittee” to promptly notify the public if one of the following events occurs:
- Combined sewer overflow (CSO);
  - Partially treated Wastewater discharge;
  - Blended wastewater discharge;
  - Any Sanitary Sewer Overflow (SSO) that discharges through a wastewater outfall, either directly or indirectly, to a surface water of the Commonwealth;
  - Any SSO that flows into a surface water of the Commonwealth and is the result of the sanitary sewer system surcharging under high flow conditions when peak flows cannot be conveyed to a wastewater treatment plant due to capacity constraints; and

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- Any SSO that flows into a surface water of the Commonwealth and is the result of a failure of a wastewater pump station or associated force main designed to convey peak flows of one million gallons per day or greater (see 314 CMR 16.03(1)).

As required by 314 CMR 16.06(1), by May 1, 2022, the 19 Massachusetts wastewater utilities permitted with combined sewer overflows (“CSOs”) were required to submit preliminary CSO Public Notification Plans to MassDEP; and Final CSO Public Notification Plans are due by January 12, 2023 (314 CMR 16.06(2)). Section 314 CMR 16.06(3) requires the other 198 permittees without a combined sewer system to submit SSO Public Notification Plans to MassDEP by July 6, 2022. In addition, by July 6, 2022, all permittees with reportable events under 314 CMR 16.00 are required to issue public advisory notifications, enter discharges data into MassDEP’s data system and fulfill other requirements of 314 CMR 16.00 (314 CMR 16.01).

Through this grant program, MassDEP seeks to facilitate the Permittees’ compliance with their responsibilities under 314 CMR 16.00 by offering funding for Eligible Projects to Eligible Entities as further defined below.

- C. **Environmental Justice:** MassDEP is committed to advancing equity, diversity, and environmental justice (EJ)<sup>1</sup> through its public investments. The agency seeks to prioritize the direction of these resources to benefit EJ communities and to address environmental inequities. To that end, MassDEP grant and funding programs include criteria and evaluation parameters that emphasize equity, diversity and environmental justice, consistent with each program’s statutory authority and source of funding. Preference will be given to projects that provide direct benefit to environmental justice populations. - D. **Eligible Entities:** Eligible applicants are regional or municipal wastewater utilities that meet the regulatory definition of “Permittee” and are subject to 314 CMR 16.00.
- E. **Eligible Projects:** Eligible Projects will result in non-operational expenditures, capital investments, planning projects, or installation of equipment that will help Sewage Notification permittees to meet one or more requirement(s) of 314 CMR 16.00. Eligible Projects must also provide a shared benefit to Permittee and its environmental justice populations (if present in the Permittee’s jurisdiction).

Examples of Eligible Projects include, but are not limited to:

- Signage at public access points or at CSO outfalls;
- Services to design and/or implement a public notification system for subscribers to receive emails/text message notifications of CSO activation which will be hosted and supported/operated by the municipal or regional utility beyond the grant funding cycle;

- Consultant services for design or improvement of a website that will be hosted and supported/operated by the municipal or regional utility beyond the grant funding cycle;
- Purchase/installation of meters or costs for renting meters<sup>2</sup>;
- Purchase/installation of other equipment including a one-time software or sensor installation used to detect/determine discharges and/or measuring volume (i.e., computer models);
- Services of metering companies (i.e., processing metering data);
- Consultant services for developing final CSO notification plans;
- Consultant services for modeling or of CSO events; or
- Translation services.

Examples of projects that are not eligible for funding include, but are not limited to:

- Salary for existing or new municipal or contracted employees involved in work related to 314 CMR 16.00;
- Funding for the Operation and maintenance of sewer systems; or
- Funding for the Operation of assets associated with metering or detecting discharges.

NOTE TO APPLICANTS regarding Eligible Projects: Both projects that were initiated on or after July 1, 2022, and proposed projects that have not yet been initiated by the Permittee are eligible for this grant program, and funding will support work activities for any phase(s) of a project, from initial project planning through project implementation, if the work funded by this program is conducted during the contract period and is completed by June 30, 2023. All Applicants must provide a feasible timeline for completion of the project prior to this deadline. For projects that have been previously initiated on or after July 1, 2022, the Applicant must provide documentation in the Grant Application to support reimbursement of previously incurred costs (in addition to any additional project costs for work to be completed by June 30, 2023).

- F. **Application Deadline:** Applications are due electronically by 5:00 P.M. on Wednesday November 30, 2022.
- G. **Page Limit:** Grant Applications, including budget sheet, but excluding the cover sheet must not exceed fifteen single-sided (15) pages in length. Cover sheet is at the end of this document or available at <https://www.mass.gov/info-details/grants-financial-assistance-watersheds-water-quality#sewage-notification-assistance-grant-program>
- H. **Funding Availability:** The total funding currently available for projects through this Grant Program is up to \$600,000. Grant Awards may range from \$10,000 to \$600,000 per applicant, although the MassDEP review committee reserves the right, in its discretion, to grant smaller awards to proposals of exceptional merit. If there are remaining unspent capital funds available from other Department projects during the period between the announcement of this grant opportunity and the announcement of the grant awards, the Department will consider allocating supplemental funds to this grant

solicitation. If any supplemental funds become available, additional projects may be funded. Applicants must only propose project scopes with timelines that can be completed between July 1, 2022, and June 30, 2023. In its discretion, MassDEP reserves the right to increase or eliminate the total funding amount available for this Grant Program based upon funding availability and/or other factors.

- I. **Match and Other Funding Obligations:** Applicants are not required to provide matching funds. However, applicants are encouraged to identify other known sources of funding for a proposed project on the Application Form, from both secured and anticipated sources, which may make the Application more competitive during review and evaluation by MassDEP.
- J. **Bidders' Conference:** A Bidders' Conference using Teams will be held on Wednesday November 16, 2022, at 1 P.M. - K. **Total Anticipated Duration of Grant(s):** The contract duration for all Grant Awards will be through June 30, 2023.
- L. **Final Report:** Upon completion of the project and with submission of the final request for reimbursement, all applicants shall submit a one-page summary of their project tasks and links or copies to the produced resources.
- M. **Applicable Procurement Law:** Grants-- MGL c. 7A, § 7; St. 1986 c. 206, § 17; 815 CMR 2.00.

## 2. INSTRUCTIONS FOR APPLICATION SUBMISSION:

- A. **Evaluation Criteria (general):** Applicants must submit a completed application that includes all of the required supporting materials, agree to the program conditions, commit to completing the project by June 30, 2023, and meet the eligibility requirements, in order to be considered for a grant award. A MassDEP review committee will evaluate proposed projects based upon the criteria listed below. The review committee reserves the right to reject any or all proposals.

**Evaluation Criteria Components:** The review committee will evaluate and score the grant applications from Eligible Entities (as defined previously in this Grant Opportunity) based upon the following criteria:

### **Project Description (20 points)**

- How well does the Applicant describe the Proposed Project and the work to be covered by this funding?
- How well does the Applicant articulate how the Eligible Entity will be helped by the proposal?
- Does the project description include proposed project tasks and desired outcome(s) for the project?
- If some or all of the Proposed Project includes a request for reimbursement for costs already incurred to comply with the requirements of 314 CMR 16.00, has the Applicant included a description of the Project that is partially or fully completed, and attached all documentation supporting the request for reimbursement for these Project Costs?
- Are all proposed elements of the proposal eligible under the listed criteria for this grant program and do not include continued operational or maintenance costs?

### **Meet Regulatory Requirements (15 points)**

- Does the Applicant demonstrate how the Proposed Project intends to fulfill one or more specific requirements of 314 CMR 16.00?

### **Financial Need (5 points)**

- How well does the applicant demonstrate the Eligible Entity's need for financial assistance to implement the Proposed Project?

### **Project Budget and Timeline (10 points)**

- How well does the Applicant estimate and describe Project Costs?
- Does the Applicant demonstrate a realistic understanding of project costs by providing a budget with detailed and credible cost estimates?
- Does the Applicant identify and describe any match or other funding sources that will support the project?
- How well does the Applicant describe the timeline for the proposed work?

### **Qualifications of Organization and Project Manager (10 points)**

- How does the Applicant describe the qualifications of the Eligible Entity and its project manager to carry out the proposed project?

### **Project Benefit (25 points)**

- MassDEP will evaluate the proposed project's environmental benefits and economic benefits. Specifically, the Department will look at how the proposed project furthers the goal of notifying the public of sewage discharges; and how it reduces the Eligible Entity's financial burden imposed by implementing 314 CMR 16.00. Applications received for regional wastewater utilities or systems will be evaluated based on the requested cost per municipality, with lower costs per community being ranked higher.

### **Environmental Justice (15 points)**

- How does the proposal describe direct benefits to environmental justice populations?
- How are environmental justice populations involved in the Proposed Project?
- Which environmental justice communities or organizations are included in the proposed project?
- Does the proposed project promote collaboration and inclusive information sharing among multiple communities, including maximizing compliance benefits in environmental justice communities (information on which communities are classified as environmental justice communities can be found at <https://www.mass.gov/info-details/environmental-justice-communities-in-massachusetts>).

**B. Application Completion and Submission Instructions:** All grant applicants must include the attached application form in their application and submit the packet electronically as a Microsoft Word or Adobe PDF file by 5:00 p.m. on Wednesday November 30, 2022.
