Jacqueline M. Robarge dba P.J.'s Convenience Store (the "Licensee") holds an all alcohol license issued pursuant to Massachusetts General Laws c.138, §15. The Alcoholic Beverages Control Commission (the "Commission") held a hearing on Tuesday, September 13, 2011, regarding an alleged violation of M.G.L. c. 138, §34. Prior to the commencement of the hearing, the licensee stipulated to the violation alleged in Investigator Rose Bailey's Compliance Check Field Report.

**FACTS**


1. On, June 22, 2011 at approximately 6:29 p.m., Commission Investigators investigated the business operation Jacqueline M. Robarge dba P.J.'s Convenience Store.
2. An underage operative, working with the investigators, purchased a Bud Light can for two dollars and sixty-five cents (\$2.65). The underage operative was not asked for identification.
3. Administrative review of the file indicates that this is the first violation for this licensee in twelve (12) years of existence.

CONCLUSION


Based on the evidence, the Commission finds the licensee violated Massachusetts General Laws c. 138, §34. Therefore, the Commission issues a **WARNING**.
