**DECISION**

**Savtom, Inc. dba Village On The Green Restaurant & Pizzeria**  
**113 Main Street**  
**Sheffield, MA 01257**

**Heard: September 13, 2011**

Savtom, Inc. dba Village On The Green Restaurant & Pizzeria (the "Licensee") holds an all alcohol license issued pursuant to Massachusetts General Laws c.138, §12. The Alcoholic Beverages Control Commission (the "Commission") held a hearing on Tuesday, September 13, 2011, regarding an alleged violation of M.G.L. c. 138, §34. Prior to the commencement of the hearing, the licensee stipulated to the violation alleged in Investigator Rose Bailey's Compliance Check Field Report.

3. Compliance Check Guidelines;

**FACTS**

1. On, June 22, 2011 at approximately 6:13 p.m., Commission Investigators investigated the business operation of Savtom, Inc. dba Village On The Green Restaurant & Pizzeria.
2. An underage operative, working with the investigators, purchased a Bud Light for three dollars and forty-five cents (\$3.45). The underage operative was not asked for identification.

CONCLUSION

Based on the evidence, the Commission finds the licensee violated Massachusetts General Laws c. 138, §34. Therefore, the Commission **suspends the license for three (3) days of which three (3) days will be held in abeyance for a period of two (2) years provided no further violations of Chapter 138 or Commission regulations occur.**
