The Parole Board does not maintain data for all persons admitted to DOC custody, except to the extent that they are returned to custody due to a parole violation. The 2020 figures for monthly returns due to parole violations are as follows:

## (4) If the number of persons released was significantly lower in April 2020 than in earlier months, what were the reason(s) for the reduction?

The number of persons released from DOC custody in April, 2020 was not significantly lower than in earlier months. To the contrary, April saw a significant decline in DOC facility occupancy. This reduction was due, in part, to a substantial increase in the number of individuals released to parole. The increase in releases to parole was prompted, in part, by the Parole Board's efforts to expedite the parole process in response to concerns regarding the COVID-19 pandemic, including those expressed in the Court's decisions in *Committee for Public Coursel Services v. Chief Justice of the Trial Court, et al.*, No. SJC-12926.
