Project Description & Goal



The **SNAP Path to Work** Provider Reimbursement project is a collaboration between the Department of Transitional Assistance (DTA) and the University of Massachusetts Medical School (UMass) to expand the scope of employment and training providers that can help SNAP clients gain skills, training, or experience to improve their employment opportunities.

Our Goal is to expand SNAP recipient access to employment and training services in the Commonwealth and enable Community Partners providing approved SNAP employment and training services to access federal funds* to continue and supplement existing activities.

* Current reimbursement rate is up to 50% of allowable employment and training expenditures.

Why Participate?

- Low income households, including Able-Bodied Adults Without Dependents (ABAWDs) with time-limited requirements, will benefit from the employment and training services you provide.
- These services may qualify for federal funds.

What Services Qualify?

- Job search
- Job search training
- Education (HiSET, ESL)
- Skills training
- Job Retention Services

Other Qualifications

Service activities must be funded through allowable sources. These include:

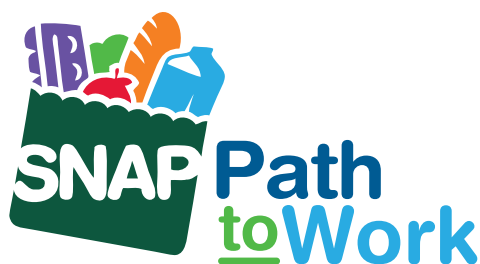
- Private grants
- Individual donations
