

Farm and Farmers Market SNAP Retailer Sign-Up

Get your farm or farmers market authorized for <u>SNAP</u> at MDAR's <u>Agricultural Resource Fair</u> on February 18 in Northampton. At this drop-in information session, you can get your farm, farm stand or farmers market authorized for SNAP and receive your USDA FNS number. <u>MarketLink</u> staff will be on site to walk you through the process and assist with your application. Apply for MarketLink's subsidized SNAP processing equipment or just stop by and get your SNAP processing questions answered.

SNAP Retailer Sign-Up: Things to Bring

If you intend on getting an FNS number (SNAP retailer authorization), please bring copies of the following documents for all principal business owners to be included with your application:

- 1) Picture ID (driver's license or passport).
- 2) Social Security Card (or other official document with your name and SSN, i.e., top page of tax return).
- 3) Copy of voided check for bank account you will use to deposit funds.

For Non-Profit 501(c)(3) Only:

Farmers Markets operated/sponsored by a non-profit are the ONLY applicants that are not required to submit verification of a Social Security number for corporate officers/board members.

Documentation Required:

- a) Copy of the IRS Determination Letter stating the organization is a 501(c)(3). A (C)(4) and (C)(6) will not be accepted.
- b) Letter from the sponsoring agency stating that they are sponsoring the farmers market and who they have appointed as their legal representative to operate the farmers market.
- c) The application must be signed by a corporate officer or a board member.

For Government Owned/Operated Farmers Markets Only

- a) Copy of the City/Town IRS EIN/TIN Tax Exempt Letter.
- b) City/Town Official must sign the Application Certification Page.
- c) Photo ID for the city/town official signing.
- d) No personal information is required or needed.
