NOTICE OF SUSPENSION

After a hearing on February 25, 2025, the Commission finds Triple F Pub Inc. d/b/a The Pub violated 204 CMR 2.05 (2) Permitting an illegality on the licensed premises, to wit: Ch. 138, § 34C – Possession of an alcoholic beverage by a person under 21 years of age (9 Counts).

The Commission suspends the license for a period of ten (10) days of which four (4) days will be served and six (6) days will be held in abeyance for a period of two (2) years provided no further violations of Chapter 138 or Commission Regulations are found by this Commission.


By decision dated March 28, 2024, the Commission previously ordered a fifteen (15)-day suspension with five (5) days to be served and ten (10) days to be held in abeyance for a period of two (2) years provided no further violations of Chapter 138 or Commission regulations were found by the Commission. Based on the violation found above, the Commission hereby orders that 10-day suspension to be served. The Licensee will serve a total of fourteen (14) days.

The suspension shall commence on Monday, January 26, 2026, and terminate on Sunday, February 8, 2026. The license will be delivered to the Local Licensing Board or its designee on Monday, January 26, 2026, at 9:00 A.M. It will be returned to the licensee on February 9, 2026..

You are advised that pursuant to the provisions of M.G.L. c.138 § 23, you may petition the Commission to accept an offer in compromise in lieu of suspension within twenty (20) calendar days following such notice of such suspension. If accepted, you may pay a fine using the enclosed form which must be signed by the Licensee and a Massachusetts Licensed Accountant.

You are advised that you have the right to appeal this decision under M.G.L. c. 30A to Superior Court within thirty (30) days upon receipt of this notice.

**TRIPLE F PUB INC. D/B/A THE PUB

Triple F Pub Inc. d/b/a The Pub (“Licensee” or “The Pub”) holds an alcohol license issued pursuant to M.G.L. c. 138, § 12. The Alcoholic Beverages Control Commission (“ABCC” or “Commission”) held a hearing on Tuesday, February 25, 2025, regarding alleged violations of 204 CMR 2.05 (2) Permitting an illegality on the licensed premises, to wit: Ch. 138, § 34C – Possession of an alcoholic beverage by a person under 21 years of age (9 Counts). Prior to the commencement of the hearing, the Licensee stipulated to the facts alleged in Investigator Terasconi’s report.

The following documents are in evidence:

1. Violation Report of Investigator N. Terasconi;
2. ABCC Form 43 License, Transfer of License Approval, 9/22/2008;
3. ABCC Decision, 3/28/2024
4. Photographs of Identifications;
5. Licensee’s Stipulation of Facts.

There is one (1) audio recording of this hearing.

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. On Tuesday September 17, 2024, at approximately 10:50 p.m., Investigators Binienda, David, Kenny, Smiddy, Temple and Terasconi (“Investigators”), inspected the business operation of Triple F Pub Inc. d/b/a The Pub (“Licensee” or “The Pub”).
2. Investigators David and Terasconi entered the licensed premises in an undercover capacity and observed multiple youthful appearing individuals in possession of what appeared to be alcoholic beverages. They notified Investigators Binienda, Kenny, Smiddy, and Temple of their observations and those Investigators then entered the licensed premises.
3. Investigators identified themselves to the following patrons and requested proof of legal age to possess alcoholic beverages.

4. Underage #1, actual date of birth 6/04/2005 (age 19), was in possession of a Bud Light beer. She presented to Investigators a fraudulent Maine driver's license bearing her name but a different birth date.
5. Underage #2, actual date of birth 3/17/2006 (age 18), was in possession of a Bud Light beer. She presented to Investigators a fraudulent Connecticut driver's license bearing another person's name and birth date.
6. Underage #3, actual date of birth 11/07/2005 (age 18), was in possession of a Bud Light beer. She presented to Investigators a fraudulent California driver's license bearing her name but a different birth date.
7. Underage #4, actual date of birth 1/24/2006 (age 18), was in possession of an Angry Orchard Hard Cider. She presented to Investigators a fraudulent Pennsylvania driver's license bearing her name but a different birth date.
8. Underage #5, actual date of birth 9/28/2005 (age 18), was in possession of a rum and Coke[®] mixed drink. He presented to Investigators a fraudulent New Jersey driver's license bearing his name but a different birth date.
9. Underage #6, actual date of birth 11/28/2005 (age 18), was in possession of a rum and Coke[®] mixed drink. He presented to Investigators a fraudulent Pennsylvania driver's license bearing his name but a different birth date.
10. Underage #7, actual date of birth 12/13/2005 (age 18), was in possession of a rum and Coke[®] mixed drink. He presented to Investigators a fraudulent Pennsylvania driver's license bearing his name but a different birth date.
11. Underage #8, actual date of birth 8/05/2005 (age 19), was in possession of a Jack Daniel's whiskey and Coke[®] mixed drink. He presented to Investigators a fraudulent Massachusetts driver's license bearing his name but a different birth date.
12. Underage #9, actual date of birth 3/09/2005 (age 19), was in possession of a Bud Light beer. He presented to Investigators an imposter California driver's license belonging to his brother.
13. Investigator Binienda and Temple spoke with Dave Radochia, Licensee, and Joe Zoccola, Manager, advised them of their findings and that a report would be filed with the Chief Investigator for further review.
14. Francis Healy, Licensee, appeared at the Commission hearing.
15. The Licensee has held a license under M.G.L. c. 138, § 12 since 2008 with one prior violation.

CONCLUSION

Based on the evidence, the Commission finds the Licensee violated 204 CMR 2.05 (2) Permitting an illegality on the licensed premises, to wit: Ch. 138, § 34C – Possession of an alcoholic beverage by a person under 21 years of age (9 Counts).

Therefore, the Commission suspends the license for a period of ten (10) days of which four (4) days will be served and six (6) days will be held in abeyance for a period of two (2) years provided no further violations of Chapter 138 or Commission Regulations are found by this Commission.

By decision dated March 28, 2024, the Commission previously ordered a fifteen (15)-day suspension with five (5) days to be served and ten (10) days to be held in abeyance for a period of two (2) years provided no further violations of Chapter 138 or Commission regulations were found by the Commission.
