Program Updates

Staffing – Seasonal vs. FTE

- ▶ Resulted in gain of 15 additional weeks of productivity for RMP Program as compared to 2022, including:
 - ▶ 5 additional weeks/employee/year due to no breaks in employment.
 - ▶ 2 weeks formerly spent recruiting, interviewing, etc.
 - ▶ 3 weeks of Regional Planner time due to new GIS support.
- ▶ Unquantifiable benefits – elimination of employee turnover, functioning as a team, ownership of process and plans by all involved.

Pending RMPs

- ▶ South Coast (9 RMPs) – Stewardship Council review.
- ▶ Blackstone Complex (6 RMPs) – Release to public after update of Interpretive Information.
- ▶ Central Highlands District (31 RMPs) – To be released for internal review in stages over the next three months. Anticipated public release Spring 2024.



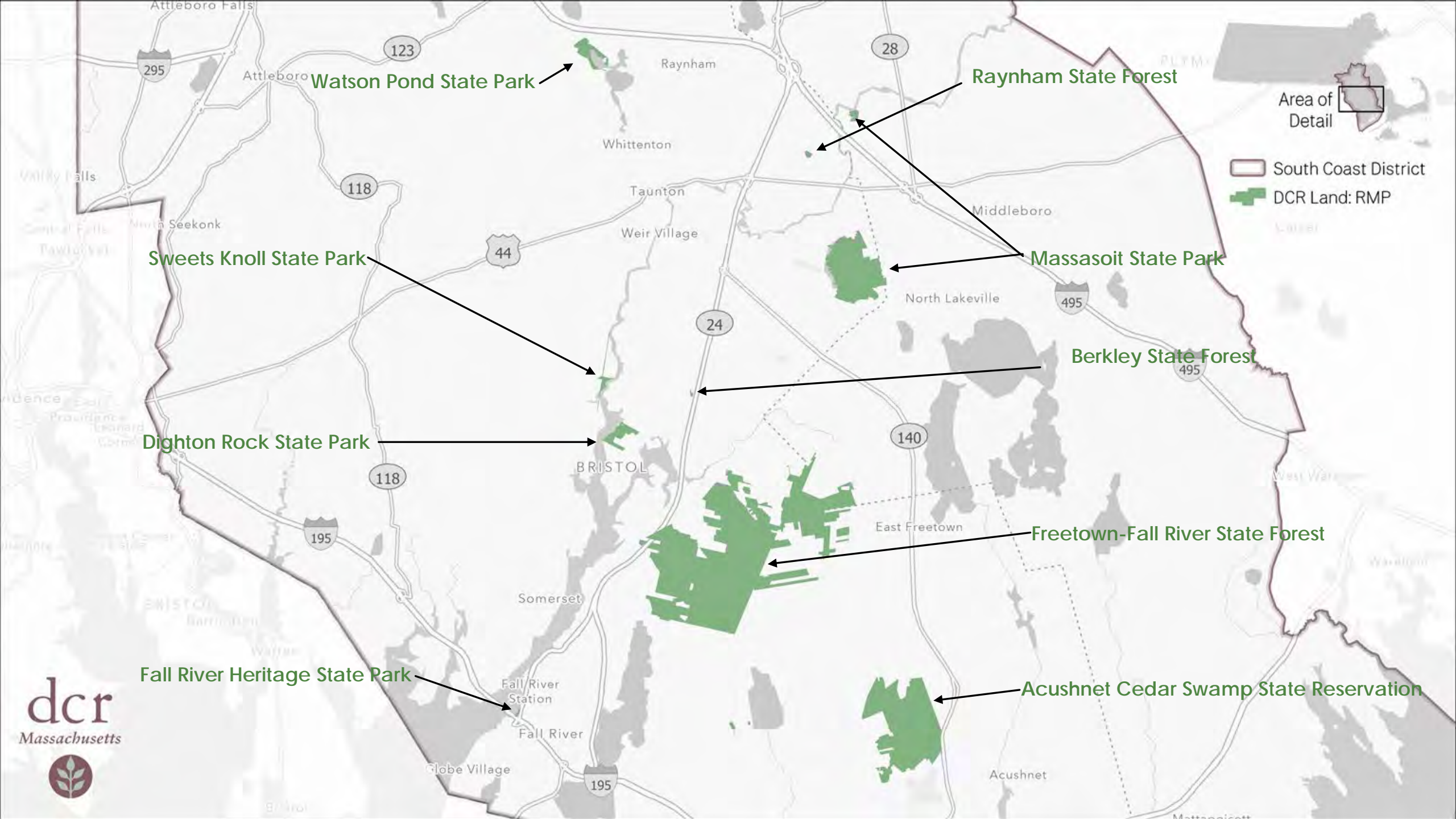
Pending RMPs (continued)

- ▶ Belle Isle Marsh Reservation (1 RMP) – Public process to begin early 2024.
- ▶ Lakes District (31 RMPs) – Site visits wrapped up this week; public process and writing begins early 2024.
- ▶ Islands District (9 RMPs) – Preliminary work begins 2024.





Presentation of South Coast RMPs



Watson Pond State Park

Offers recreation opportunities (e.g., swimming, fishing, boating, picnicking) on the tree-lined shore of a beautiful pond.

Raynham State Forest

A suburban state forest that protects common natural resources and offers opportunities to engage in passive recreation.

Sweets Knoll State Park

The Park protects significant natural and cultural resources associated with the Taunton, while providing public access to the river for passive recreation.

Massasoit State Park

An outdoor recreation destination that offers year-round day use and seasonal camping.

Dighton Rock State Park

Strongly associated with its namesake feature, a glacial erratic that bears petroglyphs. These petroglyphs, the Taunton River, and Native People's use of the area are all intertwined and are all part of the Park's identity.

Berkley State Forest

A suburban state forest that protects common natural resources and offers opportunities to engage in passive recreation.

Freetown-Fall River State Forest

A year-round recreation destination that combines distinct cultural and recreational resources with unique resource protection strategies.

Fall River Heritage State Park

An important part of the Fall River Community, telling the story of Fall River's industrial history, providing access to its waterfront, and serving as a venue for civic and cultural events.

Acushnet Cedar Swamp State Reservation

An exceptionally large Coastal Atlantic White Cedar Swamp...with excellent structure and species diversity.

Public Input

- ▶ Attendance – 28 members of the public
- ▶ Oral comments – 10 individuals
- ▶ Written comments – 10 individuals
- ▶ Comments submitted for only the following properties:
 - ▶ Acushnet Cedar Swamp State Reservation
 - ▶ Freetown-Fall River State Forest
 - ▶ Fall River Heritage State Park
 - ▶ Sweets Knoll State Park



Frequent/Key Comments

- ▶ Clarification of historical distribution and history of Pocasset Tribe in region. Freetown-Fall River SF. (6)
- ▶ Trails are almost unusable due to OHV use. Freetown-Fall River SF. (3)
- ▶ Purchase land to expand Acushnet Cedar Swamp SR (2)
- ▶ “Daylight” falls of Quequechan River. Fall River HSP. (2)
- ▶ Facilities are not universally accessible, preventing programming from taking place in building. Sweets Knoll SP. (1)
