DECISION

JENNIFER BURGHOFF-CRATTY DBA THE PUMP HOUSE

Jennifer Burghoff-Cratty dba The Pump House (the "Licensee") holds an all alcohol license issued pursuant to M.G.L. c. 138, §12. The Alcoholic Beverages Control Commission (the "Commission") held a hearing on Tuesday, February 22, 2011, regarding an alleged violation of M.G.L. c.94, §186. Prior to the commencement of the hearing, the licensee stipulated to the violation alleged in Investigator Dennis Keefe's report.


1. Licensee's Stipulation of Facts; and

FACTS

1. On Wednesday, November 24, 2010 at approximately 3:00 p.m., Investigators Kujawski and Keefe entered the licensed premises to determine the manner in which business was conducted and to address an anonymous complaint filed with the Commission.
2. The investigators identified themselves to a female bartender and a male who identified himself as the manager on duty.
3. Investigator Keefe informed the manager of the anonymous complaint and explained they were there to conduct an inspection of the licensed premises.
4. While conducting the inspection of the bars, the investigators observed multiple bottles of alcoholic beverages containing foreign matter, specifically fruit flies and other foreign material.
5. Five (5) bottles were taken as evidence.
6. Investigator Keefe provided the manager with a list of the confiscated evidence.
7. Administrative review of the file indicates that this is the first violation for the licensee in five (5) years.

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


CONCLUSION


Based on the evidence, the Commission finds the licensee violated M.G.L. c. 94, §186 (5 Counts). Therefore, the Commission **suspends the license for five (5) days of which five (5) days will be held in abeyance for a period of two (2) years provided no further violations of Chapter 138 or Commission Regulations occur.**
