## PROJECT PROGRAM AND DESIGN GOALS SWCP ACTION PLAN

#### Create a visionary yet actionable plan for the future of the SWCP as well as the roadmap to implement it

Develop high-level cost estimates and timelines for suggested improvements

#### **Prioritize repairs and enhancements**

- Repair pavement, planters; add trees, water fountains, picnic tables, benches, and bike racks
- Inform community-led efforts to make connections on underutilized MBTA-owned land

#### Ensure uses and facilities reflect community desires

 Add/redesign/reallocate amenities such as playgrounds, athletic courts, fields, community gardens, dog parks, and other park spaces

#### Make the park cohesive

 Propose signage, furniture, surface treatments, and public art that makes parts of the corridor feel distinct, but unified

#### Highlight the history of the park and local culture

Document and develop plan for interpreting these resources



## PROJECT PROGRAM AND DESIGN GOALS SWCP ACTION PLAN

#### Improve mobility and create a safe, welcoming, and accessible path system

Redesign and connect paths, while proposing safety improvements (e.g. street crossings\*)

#### Develop a collaborative and proactive approach to maintenance, stewardship, and programming

- Develop new operations and maintenance plan
- Formalize partnerships between DCR and local organizations
- Suggest new community-based programming like concerts, events, and kiosks etc.

#### Adapt to climate change

Recommend plantings that combat increased heat, support habitat, and are designed for a changing climate.

#### **Center equity and justice**

Prioritize spaces that have been underinvested in first



## WHAT THE PLAN CAN'T DO SWCP ACTION PLAN SWCP AC

#### **Build things in 2024**

• The plan will recommend big changes -- those will take some time to design, fund, and build. But, we can prioritize which ones to do first

#### Overcome limitations of a park built on transit

- Even where possible, building over the tracks would be very expensive
- Add a lot of trees -- train tracks and the tunnel cap make it difficult to plant trees, more soil is needed + tree
  canopy can't hang over tracks

#### Add large-scale amenities such as pools or regulation-size playing fields

 The Southwest Corridor Park is long and narrow. It does not have the dimensions to accommodate these elements.

#### **Themes We've Heard at These Events**

Better lighting at night for safety

More space for dogs

Safer street crossings for walkers + bikers

Better walkways + distinction between bike and walk paths

We love history of activism!

More bathrooms





#### What's working

#### Park is well-loved and well-used

- Strong local, volunteer organizations caring for the park
- Trash is picked up
- Integrated into the fabric of the city as a recreation and transportation system
- Has a celebrated history of community activism





#### **Key challenges**

#### **Maintenance**

- DCR staffing reduced by more than half since creation of park while population density has increased
- Aging infrastructure and trees/shrubs

#### **Safety**

- Conflicts between people on foot, bikes, e-bikes/scooters along corridor and at intersections
- Poor visibility and inadequate lighting in portions of the park
- Lack of addresses for 911

#### **Usability**

- Tripping hazards, uneven surfaces, and steep grades
- Some park amenities not being use as intended
- Sign clutter
- Corridor feels disconnected and is very narrow in some areas
