



Massachusetts Safe Routes to School Ambassador Program Tasks

Once a student submits the digital form, meets with their Safe Routes to School (SRTS) Outreach Coordinator, and the school representative agrees to oversee the student’s participation, they can begin working on the prerequisite activities for the High School Ambassador Program*.

**The Outreach Coordinator will confirm with the authorized school representative that the prerequisite activities were completed before moving on to the next phase.*

Once a student completes the prerequisites, they can use the list of potential activities below to decide what tasks to take on and complete. There must be at least **one pedestrian-related task, one bike-related task, and one “other” task**. To receive a certificate, students must dedicate at least **five hours** to the High School Ambassador Program** (excluding prerequisites). The tasks below are just a select few from which you can choose. You can also refer to the activities on the high school programming [flyer](#) for inspiration.

***The Outreach Coordinator may confirm with the authorized school representative that the correct tasks/minimum number of hours were completed before issuing a certificate.*
