



MassDOT Regional Transit Innovation Grant (RTIG) State Fiscal Year (SFY) 2024 Awards

The FY24 state budget allotted MassDOT \$15 million in discretionary operating and capital funding to award to transit providers for projects that aim to enhance and expand existing transit service; implement new and innovative transit services; expand service hours or weekend service; improve rural connectivity; improve connectivity across regional transit service areas; transit electrification; or other initiatives. MassDOT received 60 applications for a total request of over \$47 million and is pleased to award \$15 million to 18 projects through RTIG.

In addition to these 18 awards, MassDOT is pleased to fund an additional 11 RTIG applications that qualify through FY24 state funding to expand the Community Transit Grant Program.
