



## MassDOT Community Transit Grant Program State Fiscal Year (SFY) 2024 Awards

The FY24 state budget allotted MassDOT \$4 million to expand the Community Transit Grant Program to fund projects expanding mobility for older adults, people with disabilities, and low-income individuals. Just under half of that funding was awarded in November 2023. MassDOT is pleased to award the remaining \$2,137,405 to qualifying projects that applied through the Regional Transit Innovation Grant process.
