DECISION

FONG TAN LLC DBA LAVENDER 519A BOSTON POST ROAD SUDBURY, MA 01776 LICENSE#: 125000033 VIOLATION DATE: 06/15/2015 HEARD: 08/18/2015

Fong Tan LLC dba Lavender (the "Licensee") holds an alcohol license issued pursuant to M.G.L. c. 138, §12. The Alcoholic Beverages Control Commission (the "Commission") held a hearing on Tuesday, August 18, 2015, regarding an alleged violation of 204 CMR 2.05 (2) – Permitting an illegality on the licensed premises, to wit: c. 138, §34 – Sale or delivery of an alcoholic beverage to a person under twenty-one (21) years of age. Prior to the commencement of the hearing, the Licensee stipulated to the violation alleged in Investigator Doyle's Report.

The following documents are in evidence:

- 1. Investigator Doyle's Compliance Check Field Report dated June 15, 2015;
- 2. Licensee's Stipulation of Facts;
- 3. ABCC's 2015 Compliance Check Guidelines; and
- 4. Photograph of Underage Operative.

The Commission took Administrative Notice of the Licensee's record.

FACTS

- 1. On Monday, June 15, 2015, at approximately 6:42 p.m., Investigators Bailey and Doyle conducted an investigation of the business operation of Fong Tan LLC dba Lavender.
- 2. While on the licensed premises an underage operative working with investigators purchased from the Licensee an alcoholic beverage, a Budweiser Light beer, for four dollars and one cent (\$4.01). The underage operative was not asked for identification.

CONCLUSION

Based on the evidence, the Commission finds the Licensee violated 204 CMR 2.05 (2) – Permitting an illegality on the licensed premises, to wit: c. 138, §34 – Sale or delivery of an alcoholic beverage to a person under twenty-one (21) years of age. Therefore, the Commission suspends the license for three (3) days of which three (3) days will be held in abeyance for a period of two (2) years provided no further violations of Chapter 138 or Commission Regulations occur.
