Judge clears Vineyard Wind 1 to restart offshore work

Vineyard Wind 1 picked up a legal tailwind on Jan. 27 after a federal judge stayed a Trump administration stop-work order that halted the nearly finished project just more than a month ago.

Judge Brian E. Murphy of the U.S. District Court for the District of Massachusetts granted the company a preliminary injunction, blocking a Dec. 22 suspension order the U.S. Department of the Interior's Bureau of Ocean Energy Management issued to five major East Coast offshore wind projects.

The ruling allows Vineyard Wind 1, a joint venture of Avangrid Renewables and Copenhagen Infrastructure Partners, to restart full construction activities in its lease area south of Martha's Vineyard and southwest of Nantucket while the broader legal challenge moves through the court system. The project brings power ashore at Covell Beach in Barnstable, connecting to the New England power grid by way of a substation in Hyannis.

Vineyard Wind 1 filed a lawsuit and a request for an injunction on Jan. 15 after BOEM ordered construction paused for at least 90 days while the agency reviewed it and the other four projects against a classified national security assessment the Department of War submitted in November. The order also affected Revolution Wind, Empire Wind, Sunrise Wind and Coastal Virginia Offshore Wind-Commercial.

It was the fourth decision favoring the offshore wind developers — Revolution Wind, Empire Wind and Coastal Virginia all received injunctions from the U.S. District Court for the District of Columbia earlier in the month. Sunrise Wind, a subsidiary of Ørsted, has an injunction hearing scheduled on Feb. 2.

When will Vineyard Wind 1 construction start again?

In a statement following the ruling, Vineyard Wind 1 spokesperson Craig Gilvarg noted the company "will continue to work with the administration to understand the matters raised in the order."

In the meantime, the company "will focus on working in coordination with its contractors, the federal government, and other relevant stakeholders and authorities to safely restart activities, as it continues to deliver a critical source of new power to the New England region."

According to court filings, the \$4.5 billion project is 95% finished, with 61 of 62 turbines installed and 44 turbines already commissioned to produce 572 megawatts of the project's 800-megawatt capacity. The company is looking to finish the project, which has been under construction since 2022, by March 31.

The company told the court that remaining offshore work primarily includes installing the final turbine, installing sets of three blades on 10 turbines as part of a BOEM-approved blade replacement program, and bringing the remaining 18 turbines online. Vineyard Wind 1 stated it has removed all blades made at GE Vernova's Gaspé, Canada facility — the same plant that produced the blade that failed in July 2024 and scattered debris into regional waters.

The company emphasized that the purpose-built vessel, Sea Installer, needed to complete the work, is only available through the end of March before contractual obligations send it elsewhere.

What did the construction pause cost Vineyard Wind 1?

Vineyard Wind 1 also reported that the suspension cost the company about \$2 million per day, amounting to around \$70 million over the 36 days the project stood idle.

Gov. Maura Healey called the finding "an important development for Massachusetts ratepayers and workers."

"Vineyard Wind is already providing power and has created thousands of jobs. We need this project to continue to increase energy supply, improve reliability and lower costs," she said in a Jan. 28 email. "President Trump never should have tried to take it off the table. We are committed to moving forward with Vineyard Wind and taking an all-of-the-above approach to energy."

U.S. Sen. Edward Markey and Sen. Elizabeth Warren, both Democrats from Massachusetts, described the court decision as part of a broader pattern of decisions rejecting the administration's efforts to halt offshore wind development.

"Vineyard Wind 1 is currently delivering affordable and reliable power into our grid and has the permits, financing, and approval to deliver even more," the lawmakers said in a joint statement.

"Trump's vendetta against American-made energy and union jobs makes our nation weaker, our costs higher, and our families less certain about how they're going to make ends meet. We need all the affordable, reliable, and clean electricity we can get," they said.

Markey and Warren also cited a Dec. 23, 2025, letter they sent to Interior Secretary Doug Burgum and Defense Secretary Pete Hegseth seeking access to the classified national security reports the administration relied on when ordering the pause on the offshore wind construction.

Court: No sufficient proof of an imminent national security risk

The courts found the government did not provide sufficient proof of imminent national security risks — legal filings show that, while the federal government can shut down offshore projects for national security reasons, it can only do so temporarily and when there is a change in NORAD's readiness status.

Save Greater Dowses Beach, a Barnstable-based citizens group with wide-ranging concerns about the project, criticized the ruling.

"The decision was disappointing but not unexpected," said group chairwoman Susanne Conley. "I'm not

sure why federal judges now think they are responsible for deciding matters of national security, but we are confident the administration will prevail in the end."

"Hopefully, these environmentally destructive, outrageously expensive, and unreliable ocean wind farm projects will soon be stopped and completely dismantled," she added.

AN ORDINANCE
AMENDING CHAPTER 9 COMPREHENSIVE ZONING - RELATIVE TO ACCESSORY DWELLING UNITS

Be it ordained by the City Council of the City of New Bedford as follows: -
SECTION 1. Chapter 9 of the New Bedford Code of Ordinances, Comprehensive Zoning, Section 1200 (DEFINITIONS), is hereby amended by striking the definitions of "Accessory Dwelling Unit," "Multi-Household - Attached Dwelling," and "Two-Household - Attached Dwelling" and inserting in place thereof the following:

Accessory Dwelling Unit: a self-contained housing unit, inclusive of sleeping, cooking and sanitary facilities, on the same lot as a principal dwelling, subject to otherwise applicable dimensional and parking requirements.

Multi-Household Attached Dwelling: A building with three (3) or more residential dwelling units or two (2) or more buildings on the same lot with more than one (1) residential dwelling unit in each building. Each dwelling unit is intended to be occupied by one (1) household.

Two-Household - Attached Dwelling: A residential building with horizontally or vertically attached or semi-attached dwelling units generally perpendicular to the front lot line. These buildings contain two (2) dwelling units and may be located on one (1) or two (2) lots. Each dwelling unit is intended to be occupied by one (1) household.

SECTION 2. Chapter 9, of the New Bedford Code of Ordinances, Comprehensive Zoning, is hereby amended by striking Section 2340 (Accessory Dwelling Units) in its entirety and inserting in place thereof the following:
 2340. Accessory Dwelling Units. Accessory dwelling units are allowed by right in any Zoning District where single-household residential dwellings are a permitted or an allowable use, and on any lot, regardless of Zoning District, with an existing single-household, two-household, or multi-house-

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hold use, subject to the following requirements:
 2341. Building Permit. The Inspector of Buildings may issue a building permit authorizing the creation of an accessory dwelling unit. The Inspector may waive one or more requirements of this Ordinance upon a determination that such requirement(s) would constitute an "unreasonable regulation" pursuant to 760 CMR 71.03(3).
 i. The building permit application shall include a floor plan of the proposed accessory dwelling unit. The floor plan shall be drawn to scale but need not be prepared by a licensed design professional, unless required by the State Building Code.
 ii. If the accessory dwelling unit is to be located in a detached accessory structure or in an addition to the existing primary dwelling structure, the building permit application shall also include a plot plan, prepared by a registered land surveyor, showing the locations of all existing and proposed structures, as well as any existing and proposed septic systems, utilities, and parking. A mortgage inspection survey, properly adapted by a surveyor, shall be sufficient to meet this requirement

2342. Standards for All Accessory Dwelling Units.

i. Not more than one accessory dwelling unit may be established on a lot. The lot must contain an existing single-household, two-household, or multi-household use as the principal use and structure.
 ii. The accessory dwelling unit shall not be larger in gross floor area than one half the gross floor area of the principal dwelling or 900 square feet, whichever is smaller. The Board of Appeals may grant a special permit for an accessory dwelling unit that is greater than 900 square feet and no more than 1,200 square feet.
 iii. The construction of any accessory dwelling unit must conform to the State Building Code and all other applicable statutes, Ordinances and regulations.
 iv. Except as hereinafter provided, one additional off-street parking space shall be required for an accessory dwelling unit. Said parking space shall be constructed of materials consistent with the existing driveway and shall have vehicular access to the driveway. The Board of Appeals may grant a special permit to waive this requirement if it determines that there is no suitable location on the lot for additional parking or such waiver is otherwise in the public interest. No additional parking shall be required for an accessory dwelling unit on a lot located within one half mile of a transit station, as defined in 760 CMR 71.02.
 v. To encourage the development of housing units for individuals with disabilities and persons with limited mobility, the Inspector of Buildings may allow reasonable deviation from the requirements of this Section where necessary to install features that facilitate access and mobility for such persons.
 vi. The Planning Board may adopt design guidelines for accessory dwelling units in detached structures and additions to principal structures. Adherence to the design guidelines shall not be required for by-right accessory dwelling units but may be required as a condition of approval of any special permit granted pursuant to this Section.

2343. Standards for Attached Accessory Dwelling Units.

i. The accessory dwelling unit shall maintain a separate entrance, either directly to the outside or through an interior entry hall or corridor shared with the principal dwelling.
 ii. Any stairways or access and egress alterations serving the accessory dwelling unit shall be enclosed, screened, or located to minimize visibility from public ways.

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screened, or located to minimize visibility from public ways.

2344. Standards for Detached Accessory Dwelling Units.

i. Detached accessory dwelling units must be located on the lot as follows:
 a. Behind the primary dwelling is within the rear yard. A detached accessory dwelling unit may be no closer than eighteen (18) inches from a side or rear lot line or any portion of a fence located along the side lot line; or
 b. Within a side yard, but at least five (5) feet behind the front façade of the principal dwelling and six (6) feet from the side lot line.
 ii. The height of the building in which the detached accessory dwelling unit is located may be no higher than the allowable height for a single-household residence.
 iii. An accessory dwelling unit may be constructed within an existing non-conforming accessory structure, provided the Inspector of Buildings determines that the nonconforming nature of said structure will not be increased. If the Inspector of Buildings determines that the nonconforming nature of such structure would be increased, the Board of Appeals may, by majority vote, approve the proposal after a public hearing if it determines that it will not be substantially more detrimental to the neighborhood.
2345. Prohibition of Short-Term Rental. No accessory dwelling unit may be used as a short-term rental, as defined in Section 1200 (DEFINITIONS). Accessory dwelling units, if rented, shall have a tenancy term of more than thirty-one (31) days.
SECTION 3. This Ordinance shall take effect in accordance with the provisions of Chapters 40A and 43 of the General Laws.
