

- Regional connection between Fall River,
 Somerset, Dighton and Taunton
- Proposed 22-mile continuous network of onand off-road trails to intersect with the South Coast Bikeway
- Opportunities to access Taunton River, parks, and open spaces, in addition to community connections



Project Goals

- Create a shared-use accessible path
- Use ecologically sensitive design techniques to protect resource areas
- Improve local connectivity between Somerset Ave and Sandpiper Way
- Initiate design of parking/trailheads at Somerset Ave and Sandpiper
 Way
- Create access for kayaks and canoes




Project Schedule

- South Entrance/Parking Area at Somerset Avenue









































































Access & Equity

Increases opportunities for users of all ages, abilities and ethnicities to walk, bike or roll to essential destinations



Environment

Reduces single-occupancy car trips and prevents harmful pollutants released into the air

Lowers crash rates on nearby roadways and deters crime by creating lively, inhabited spaces
