IN THE NAME OF THE COMMONWEALTH IF MASSACHUSETTS you are hereby required to levy and collect, according to law, of thee several persons to whom the taxes listed above have been reassessed, the amount of the reassessed taxes herein committed to you, of each one the amount in his case specified, with interest as provided by law, the amount, estate, and the person in the case of each reassessed tax being the just amount to which, the estate upon which, and the person to whom, the particular tax ought at first to have been assessed in the year specified; and you are to pay over said taxes and interest, to _____ Treasurer of _____ or to his successor in office, at the times and in the manner provided by law; and you are to complete and make up an account of the whole sum hereby committed to you on or before December thirty-first of the current year; and if any person to whom a tax listed above has been reassessed shall refuse or neglect to pay such reassessed tax, you ae to proceed as required in like cases in the collection of other taxes; and in the levy and collection and the paying over of said reassessed taxes you are to have and to exercise all the powers and be subject to all the duties prescribed by law for the collection and paying over of other taxes.
