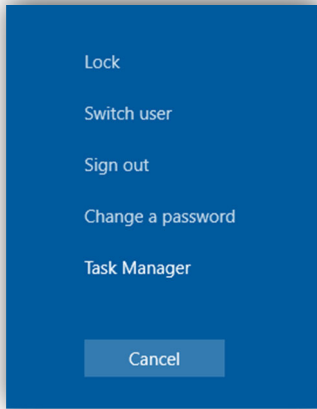
Teleworking:
Updating Windows Password

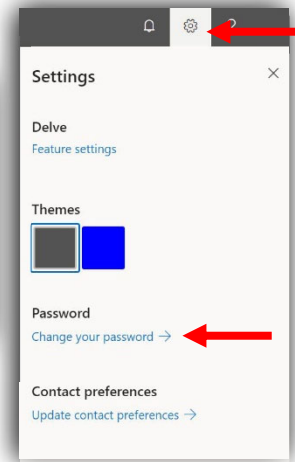
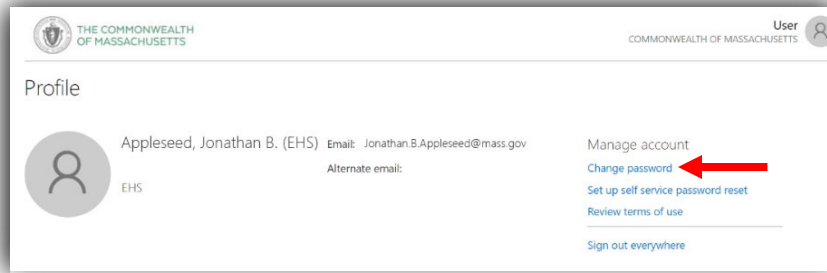
Changing Upcoming Expiring Passwords:

Change Password: Notification without VPN

Step 1:	Without being logged onto VPN, an expiration notification is displayed.
Step 2:	<p>Press the keys: CTRL-ALT-DEL</p> <p>Click Change a Password</p> <p>Users will be redirected to the O365 portal webpage.</p> 



Step 3: In the **User Profile** or **settings**, click **Change Password**.



Step 4: Complete the **change password** form.

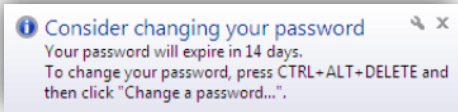

Click the green **submit** button.

Step 5: Immediately update passwords on any other devices using state applications and services.

Neglecting this step may lock users out of their Windows account as related state apps and state services on other devices push requests to verify the expired password.



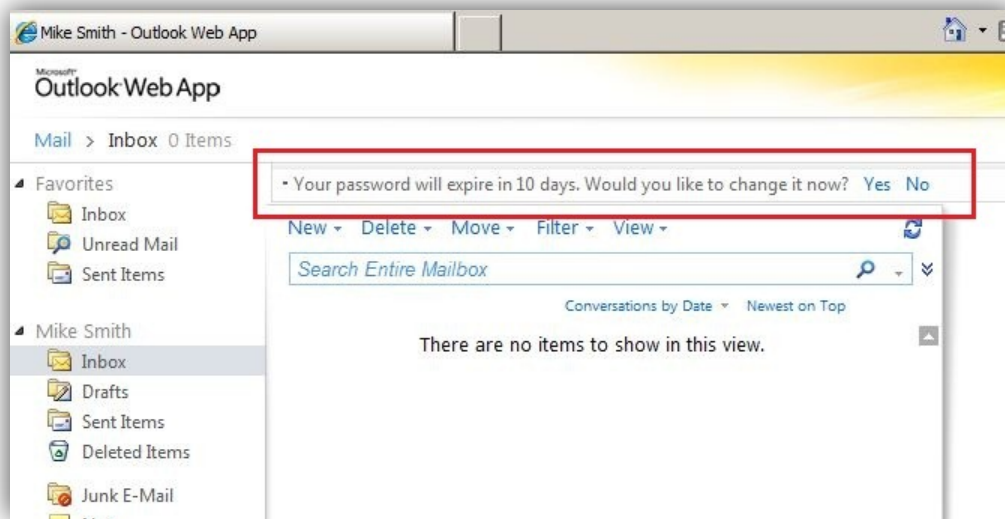
Change Password: VPN Notification

Step 1: After logging onto Outlook Web Access (OWA), an expiration notification is displayed.



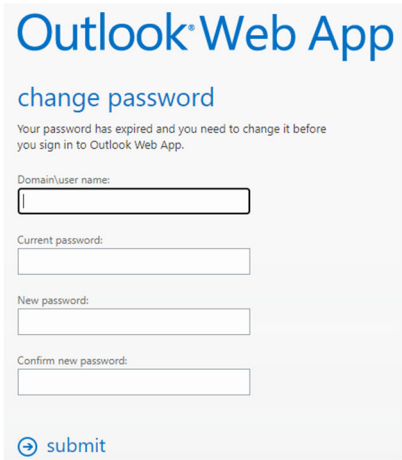


Step 2: Complete the **change password** form.

Step 2:	<p>Complete the change password form.</p> <p>Click the orange Submit button.</p> 
Step 3:	<p>Immediately update passwords on any other devices using state applications and services.</p> <p>Neglecting this step may lock users out of their Windows account as related state apps and state services on other devices push requests to verify the expired password.</p>
