NOTICE OF SUSPENSION

August 23, 2017

STADIUM LIQUOR MART INC. 10 MAIN ST. TEWKSBURY, MA 01876 LICENSE#: 1270-00023 VIOLATION DATE: 05/25/2017

HEARING DATE: 08/22/2017

After a hearing on August 22, 2017, the Commission finds Stadium Liquor Mart Inc. violated 204 CMR 2.05 (2) – Permitting an illegality on the licensed premises, to wit: M.G.L. c. 138, §34 – Sale or delivery of an alcoholic beverage to a person under twenty-one (21) years of age.

The Commission suspends the license for three (3) days of which two (2) days will be served and one (1) day will be held in abeyance for a period of two (2) years provided no further violations of Chapter 138 or Commission Regulations occur.

The suspension shall commence on Wednesday, October 11, 2017 and terminate on Thursday, October 12, 2017. The license will be delivered to the Local Licensing Board or its designee on Wednesday, October 11, 2017 at 9:00 A.M. It will be returned to the licensee on Friday, October 13, 2017.


You are advised that pursuant to the provisions of M.G.L. c.138 §23, you may petition the Commission to accept an offer in compromise in lieu of suspension within twenty (20) calendar days following such notice of such suspension. If accepted, you may pay a fine using the enclosed form which must be signed by the Licensee and a Massachusetts Licensed Accountant.

You are advised that you have the right to appeal this decision under M.G.L. c. 30A to Superior Court within thirty (30) days upon receipt of this notice.

STADIUM LIQUOR MART INC. 10 MAIN ST. TEWKSBURY, MA 01876 LICENSE#: 1270-00023

VIOLATION DATE: 05/25/2017 HEARING DATE: 08/22/2017

Stadium Liquor Mart Inc. (the "Licensee") holds an alcohol license issued pursuant to M.G.L. c. 138, § 15. The Alcoholic Beverages Control Commission (the "Commission") held a hearing on Tuesday, August 22, 2017, regarding an alleged violation of 204 CMR 2.05 (2) – Permitting an illegality on the licensed premises, to wit: M.G.L. c. 138, §34 – Sale or delivery of an alcoholic beverage to a person under twenty-one (21) years of age. Prior to the commencement of the hearing, the Licensee stipulated to the violation alleged in Investigator Bailey's Report.

The following documents are in evidence:

- 1. Investigator Bailey's Compliance Check Field Report; and
- 2. Licensee's Stipulation of Facts.

There is one (1) audio recording of this hearing.

The Commission took Administrative Notice of the Licensee's record.

FACTS

- 1. On Thursday, May 25, 2017, at approximately 7:31 p.m., Investigators Bailey and Doyle ("Investigators") investigated the business operation of Stadium Liquor Mart Inc.
- 2. An underage operative, working with Investigators, purchased from the Licensee an alcoholic beverage, a 25-ounce can of Bud Light beer for three dollars (\$3.00). The underage operative was not asked for identification.

CONCLUSION

Based on the evidence the Commission finds the Licensee violated 204 CMR 2.05 (2) - Permitting an illegality on the licensed premises, to wit: M.G.L. c. 138, §34 – Sale or delivery of an alcoholic beverage to a person under twenty-one (21) years of age. Therefore, the Commission suspends the license for three (3) days of which two (2) days will be served and one (1) day will be held in abeyance for a period of two (2) years provided no further violations of Chapter 138 or Commission Regulations occur.
