Wildlife Accommodation Requirement Scenarios

- 1. Does the roadway cross mapped rare species habitat?
 - a. If yes, are traffic volumes greater than or equal to 4,000 vehicles per day and this specific subject to high mortality when crossing the road?
 - i. If yes, consider accommodation.
 - b. If no, does the roadway cross known areas of high wildlife mortality?
 - i. If yes, is wildlife primarily large, ubiquitous species such as deer?
 - 1. If yes, consider measures to exclude wildlife from roadways possibly coupled with passage structures.
 - 2. If no, is the lane on either side of the road currently natural, minimally developed, classified as protected open space, within a BioMap element, or in a Priority Area identified by MassDOT Environmental?
 - a. If yes, consider accommodation.
 - b. If no, no further action.
 - ii. If no, does roadway cross areas of statewide or regional importance for landscape connectivity?
 - 1. If yes, consider accommodation.
 - 2. If no, does roadway cross any fish-bearing streams?
 - a. If yes, are new or existing culverts potential fish passage barriers?
 - i. If yes, consider culvert design to accommodate fish passage.
 - ii. If no, no further action.
 - b. If no, no further action.
