THE DIVISION OF MARINE FISHERIES ENACTS FINAL REGULATIONS FOR ASMFC MANAGED SPECIES: BLACK SEA BASS, SCUP, SUMMER FLOUNDER, COASTAL SHARKS AND WEAKFISH

MarineFisheries has finalized 2010 commercial and recreational regulations, compliant with ASMFC fishery management plants for scup, black sea bass, summer flounder, coastal sharks and weakfish. The following changes are effective for 2010:

Recreational Summer Flounder¹: The recreational summer flounder season was liberalized from 44 to 108 days. The season began on May 22, 2010 and will close September 6, 2010. Minimum size and bag limit remains unchanged at $18 \frac{1}{2}$ ° and 5 fish per angler.

Recreational Black Sea Bass²: ASMFC liberalized the previously proposed 2010 recreational black sea bass season in May. The open season for recreational black sea bass is now May 22 through October 11 and November 1 through December 31. It shall be unlawful for recreational fishers to catch and retain black sea bass from October 12 through October 31 and January 1 through May 21.

Recreational Scup³: The for-hire bonus season will be 35 consecutive days, running from May 15, 2010 to June 18, 2010. The bag limit for the bonus season is 40 fish. Rules governing minimum sizes remain unchanged: anglers aboard for-hire vessels are subject to an 11" scup minimum size while anglers aboard private vessels and from shore are subject to a 10.5" minimum size. The bag limits are for all anglers (except those participating in the for-hire bonus season) is 10 fish per angler (unchanged), and private vessels with six five or more persons aboard are limited to 50 scup. The for-hire scup season will be closed from September 27 through May 14.

Commercial Scup⁴: The commercial scup quota set-aside for the weir fishery was increased from 177,000 to 225,000 pounds commensurate with the increase in the overall 2010 Massachusetts summer period commercial quota.

Recreational and Commercial Weakfish: The recreational weakfish bag-limit has been reduced from 6-fish to 1-fish per angler. A commercial weakfish trip limit has been enacted to constrain

the daily commercial catch to 100 lbs. per vessel. These changes are pursuant to adjustments made by ASMFC to the weakfish fishery management plan.

Coastal Sharks⁵: All dealers who purchase coastal sharks from commercial fishermen are required to be authorized and permitted as federal shark dealers.
