DECISION

STEVEN KASPAR DBA THE OLD BRICK STORE 440 MAIN STREET TOWNSEND, MASSACHUSETTS 01474 LICENSE#: 128600011 HEARING HELD: 11/15/2011

Steven Kaspar dba The Old Brick Store (the "Licensee") holds a Wine and Malt Beverages package store license issued pursuant to Massachusetts General Laws chapter 138, §15. The Alcoholic Beverages Control Commission ("the Commission") held a hearing on Tuesday, November 15, 2011, regarding an alleged violation of M.G.L. c. 138, §34: Sale of Alcoholic Beverages to Persons Under Twenty-One(21) years of age. Prior to the commencement of the hearing, the Licensee stipulated to the violation alleged in Investigator Paul Capurso's Compliance Check Field Report.

The following documents are in evidence as Exhibits:

- 1. Investigator Capurso's Compliance Check Field Report dated August 1, 2011; and
- 2. Licensee's Stipulation of Facts.

FACTS

- 1. On August 1, 2011, at approximately 7:34 p.m., Commission Investigators Capurso and Bailey conducted an investigation of the licensed premises operating as a package store, The Old Brick Store.
- 2. An underage operative, working with the Investigators, purchased an alcoholic beverage, a can of Budweiser beer, for two dollars and twenty-five cents (\$2.25). The underage operative was not asked to produce identification before being allowed to purchase the alcoholic beverage.
- The underage operative who purchased the alcoholic beverage was eighteen (18) years of age.

4. At the conclusion of the presentation of the evidence, Investigator Capurso conducted an administrative review of the file. He testified before the Commission that the licensee has owned the licensed premises for over thirty (30) years (since 1978). Investigator Capurso testified that the licensee has not committed any previous violations involving this license.

CONCLUSION

The Commission, after a hearing, finds that the Licensee, has committed a violation of M. G. L. c. 138, §34. The Commission hereby ISSUES A WARNING TO THE LICENSEE based on the fact that the licensee has held and operated this premises in excess of thirty (30) years with no previous violations.
