Background: February 17, 2009 the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act (ARRA) of

was stand into law. The Trade and Globalization Adjustment Assistance 009, part of the ARRA, amended several elements of the TAA program.

One of the changes provides for an increase to the amount of Relocation

Allowances a TAA eligible individual may receive. This issuance provides notice of the revised amount and also provides procedural guidance with respect to

applying for TAA Job Search Allowances (ATTACHMENT A).

The issuance also includes new versions of the Request for Relocation Allowances application form (ATTACHMENT B) and the Employment Verification Form For Relocation Allowances (ATTACHMENT C).

For any individual determined to be TAA eligible under a petition filed on or **Policy:** 

after May 18, 2009, the maximum amount of Job Search Allowances he/she may

receive is increased to 100% of the total allowable cost for Transportation, Lodging and Meals up to an amount not to exceed \$1,500 while conducting an approved job search beyond the individual's normal commuting area.

For any eligible individual covered under a petition filed *before* May 18, 2009, the Job Search Allowance maximum amount for Transportation, Lodging and Meals remains 90% of the total allowable costs up to a maximum of \$1,250.

The total amount of Job Search Allowances paid to an individual under a certification may not exceed the maximum amount (depending on the date of the filing date of the petition under which the individual is covered), regardless of the number of job searches completed by the individual.
