Program Participation

If client is separated from a Trade Certified company, they must file form 1666 **Application to Participate** in the TAA program via MOSES first and foremost.

Important Deadlines

Trade Readjustment Allowances (TRA) eligibility – must have training approved or a Waiver from training approved **before** the **LATER** of the following **two deadline dates**:

The later of:

- The <u>8th</u> week after the certification date of the company <u>OR</u>
- The last day of the 16th week after the last physical day of work

Petition numbers that range 69,999 and below AND 80,000 to 80,999 (and elected 2002)

The later of:

- The <u>26th</u> week after the certification date of the company <u>OR</u>
- The last day of the <u>26th</u> week after the last physical day of work

Petition Numbers that range 70,000 to 79,999, 80,000 to 80,999 (and elected 2011) and 81,000 and above

TAA Program Benefits and Services

- Employment and Case Management Services: skill assessments and career counseling
- Training: remedial education, GED, vocational and post-secondary education
- Trade Readjustment Allowances (TRA): participants may receive additional weeks of income support if they are enrolled in full-time training
- Reemployment/Alternative Trade Adjustment Assistance
 (RTAA/ATAA): is a wage subsidy is available to workers 50 years of age or older
- o **Job Search and Relocation Allowance:** reimbursement for job search and job obtained outside the worker's local area
