



Message from the Trial Court Chief Justice and Court Administrator

Fiscal Year 2025 marked the third full year of regular Trial Court operations since the pandemic, and we are pleased to report continued progress in reducing the backlog of pending cases and increasing the number of resolved cases.

Case filings continued to increase, while the clearance rate remained strong at 97.7%. The number of cases resolved increased by more than 40,000, and the percentage of cases pending beyond time standards dropped to 39.3%, a four percentage point improvement over FY 2024. This strong performance reflects the sustained efforts of Trial Court departments and the legal community in restoring and maintaining pre-pandemic levels of efficiency.

As we move forward in FY 2026, our focus remains on improving the timeliness of case resolution across all departments and reducing the number of aged cases. These metrics are essential to showing the public that justice is delivered with both dignity and efficiency.

Executive Summary

Timely resolution of cases is central to the Trial Court's mission of delivering justice with both dignity and efficiency. Case flow metrics play a vital role in this effort, equipping court leaders with the data needed to improve operations and services and promote transparency and accountability throughout the court system.

This report presents a year-over-year comparison of the Trial Court's key case flow metrics.

- Case flow metrics for FY 2025 show an increase in the number of disposed cases and a decrease in the pending caseload, which peaked in FY 2021 as a result of the pandemic.
- Case filings and disposed cases subject to metrics reporting increased by more than 40,000, respectively. Metric case filings reached 783,138, and disposed metrics cases reached 764,861, for FY 2025.
- The clearance rate reached 97.7%, consistent with the previous fiscal year, indicating that courts are resolving cases at pace with the number of cases received. This metric reflects the ratio of outgoing to incoming cases.
- There were more than 562,000 cases subject to time standards resolved in FY 2025. Of those cases, 416,978 (74.1%) were disposed of within time standards. The number of disposed time standard cases increased by 6.6%, demonstrating the Trial Court's ability to reach more cases for initial resolution than the previous year.
- The number of pending cases subject to time standards decreased by 30,000 cases (10.1%) from the previous year to 271,423 cases. The number of cases pending beyond time standards was 106,753, representing a 4 percent decrease (43.3% to 39.3%) in the pending beyond rate from the last fiscal year.
- Over 1.8 million events were scheduled in FY 2025, of which 1.3 million events (71.2%) were held. This is an increase of 0.4 percentage points from the previous fiscal year, indicating the Trial Court's efforts to increase capacity for holding more events. Events may not be held for various reasons, including requests by litigants or agreements to resolution.





About Case Flow Metrics

In 2006, court leaders, staff, and judges implemented case flow metrics to manage court operations. These metrics, adapted from the National Center for State Courts' performance measures, are a set of performance measures used to manage the timely resolution of cases. Time standards are benchmarks for assessing timely case management. Time standards are established through the standing orders of each court department.

Following are the Trial Court's terms for key case flow metrics:

Metric Case Filings

This refers to case filings that are subject to metric analysis. Its purpose is to assess the volume and type of cases filed.

Clearance Rate

A measure of resolved cases compared to the number of newly-filed cases. Its purpose is to determine if the court is disposing of cases at the same rate as the number of cases filed.

Time to Disposition

The rate of cases disposed or resolved within established time standards. Its purpose is to assess the length of time it takes a court to process cases.


Age of Pending Cases

A measure of active, pending cases that are beyond the disposition date set by the time standards. Its purpose is to assess whether there are delays in case resolution.

Event Date Certainty

A measure of court events with recorded outcomes compared to the total of court events scheduled. An event may not be held by request of a litigant or attorney or by agreement to an informal resolution. Its purpose is to assess the court's capacity to hold case events.

^{**}Annual percent change measures the year-over-year change in case volume, whereas annual rate change measures the year-over-year difference in rate percentage points.










Time to Disposition














