

What we will do

MassDEP's Role in C&E



- Ensures that facilities:
 - > Report annually on their use of listed chemicals,
 - Pay an annual fee, and
 - Conduct Toxics Use Reduction planning every two years.
- Ensures that TUR planners are certifying plans that have been carried out in good faith through:
 - Facility inspections, including TUR plan reviews, and
 - Desk audits of selected facilities TUR plans.

Goals for Inspections and Audits



- Ensure that planning is being done according to the regulatory requirements
- Ensure that all required elements of the planning process have been completed
- Ensure that inspections and audits are conducted similarly for all facilities

The need for inspection and audit consistency was mentioned by planners when they participated in a set of TUR Plan Strengthening meetings convened by MassDEP.

C&E Discussion Topics #1: Requests for Information/Audit of Plans





MassDEP completed 12 desk audits of plans in 2019



Facilities were selected based on size, number of chemicals reported, MassDEP region where the facility was located, and TUR Planner experience



MassDEP will continue to conduct these desk audits annually



Discussions are ongoing as to the criteria for selecting plans to audit

C&E Discussion Topics #2: Good Faith Effort



- A lack of understanding of the regulations and the regulatory process involved in the planning effort (Good Faith Effort) may include:
 - Incompleteness of planning process and/or documentation of process planning
 - Lack of identifying options for reducing toxic use or options identified but not implemented
 - Lack of necessary documentation and good record keeping
 - Lack of management support
 - Lack of TUR team and related staff member involvement

C&E Discussion Topics #3: Quality Control for TUR Planners



TUR Planners that are not certified or recertified signing off on plans

TUR Planners have signed off on plans that are not complete or have significant deficiencies

C&E Discussion Topics #4: Regional Inspections/Screenings



- MassDEP Inspectors do TURA inspections during multi-media inspections
- Inspectors sometimes find that facilities should be reporting certain chemicals
- Inspectors review TUR Plans to verify that all TURA plan elements are present
- MassDEP enforcement is progressive. Notices of Non-Compliance (NON; no penalty) are the first level of enforcement and the enforcement progresses to Administrative Consent Orders with Penalties (ACOP) for further violations
- If Higher Level Enforcement is taken, MassDEP uses a data program to calculate the penalty. There are 13 factors that are evaluated. One of the factors is 'good faith effort.'
