Jayesh Patel dba Bridgeview Convenience Store (the "Licensee") holds an alcohol license issued pursuant to M.G.L. c. 138, §15. The Alcoholic Beverages Control Commission (the "Commission") held a hearing on Tuesday, September 4, 2012, regarding an alleged violation of 204 CMR 2.05(2), to wit: c.138, §34. Prior to the commencement of the hearing, the licensee stipulated to the violation alleged in Investigator ^o Doyle's Compliance Check Field Report.

The following documents are in evidence:

- 1. Investigator Doyle's Compliance Check Field Report dated May 4, 2012; and
- 2. Licensee's Stipulation of Facts.

There is one (1) audio recording of this hearing.

FACTS

- 1. On Friday, May 4, 2012, at approximately 6:15 p.m., Investigators Doyle and Bailey conducted an investigation of the business operation of Jayesh Patel dba Bridgeview Convenience Store.
- 2. An underage operative working with investigators purchased an alcoholic beverage, a forty ounce (40 oz.) bottle Bud Lite beer for three dollars and forty-five cents (\$3.45). The underage operative was not asked for identification.

CONCLUSION

Based on the evidence, the Commission finds the licensee violated 204 CMR 2.05 (2), to wit: M.G.L. c. 138, §34. As the licensee has been in business for over ten (10) years and has had no previous violations, the Commission issues a WARNING.
